That the deceased was very much in debt
but had a large estate consisting of negroes,
and other estate — That in April 1859,
your Complainant filed in this Court his
original bill against the said admin-
istrators for the object the settlement of their
administration accounts & the ascertainment
of the debts due by said deceased & their
payment — That in due time a decree may
made in the cause by this Court directing one
of its Commissioners to settle said
administration accounts, and to ascertain
all debts due by the deceased & to ascertain
and report the value & description of the real

estate of said Deceased — all of which
was done and the Report duly confirmed —
That at April Term 1860 a Decree was made
in the cause directing the payment of all
debts then ascertained & a further account
ordered which was duly made by a Com^r of
this Court & confirmed at October Term 1860 & at
the same time a further decree made for the
payment of the new debts then reported —

That by virtue of the said two decrees, the
said Administration proceeded to pay off
the larger part of said debts, and to enable
them to do so without selling the negroes,
they borrowed five thousand dollars from the
Suffolk Savings Bank & credited the same
to the estate, not then doubting but that the
heirs of the negroes would speedily repay
the same as, also all other debts against the
said Decedent or his Estate — That the
said admⁿ. made their reports, shewing
their payments under said Decree, & filing
proper vouchers therefor — That thereafter
the late war broke out & by its operation
all the negroes belonging to said estate have
been set free and now nothing remains to
pay the debts of said Decedent remaining
unpaid except the Real Estate of said
Deceased & a Balance of \$1261.⁷⁷
in the hands of David J. Godwin, one of the

said admors. and some small uncollected
bills for 1861 & 1862 a, Your Complainant un-
derstands — That the record and
proceedings in said suit shewed all these
things and was ready for further decree
when unfortunately on the night of the 7th
of this month (July 1866) the Clerk's office
of said County was destroyed by fire and
all its records lost & the record in this cause
among the number, and now your Com-
plainant files this Supplemental Bill
to revive said decree and to obtain final
settlement of all matters therein — And
your Complainant now calls on the said Hugh
H. Kelly and David J. Rodum admors. as
aforesaid to set forth and shew how many
of the debts decreed to be paid by the said
decree of April & Octo. Term, 1860 are
unpaid, and also what other demands
remain unpaid so far as they know, and
what real estate belongs to said deceased &
any other fact in their possession relative to
