The Deposition of Nathl. Riddick, taken before the Commisshoner, and by him, pursuant to the afore mentioned notice and adjournment, in the town of Suffolk, on Tuesday the 4th day of August, 1868, between the hours of 8. A.M. & 6 P.M. on the part of H. L. Tynes, to be read in his behalf in a certain suit in chancery now referred to a Commisshoner of the Circuit Court of Vausemond County for certain purposes by decree of said Court, and in which suit Arm. J. Vesey & al. are plaintiffs and Henry L. Tynes administrator of J. H. B. Vesey decd. is defendant.

Nathaniel Riddick being first duly sworn deposes and says as follows:

1st Question: What is your age and are you acquainted with the defendant in this suit, H. L. Tynes?

Answer: I am forty nine years old, and I have known Henry L. Tynes for many years.

2nd Question: Did you at any time during the late war make an investment of money or Confederate states treasury notes, for and on account of the defendant? if so, state all the circumstances attending said investment?

Answer. To make my reply as comprehensive as possible, it will be necessary to refer to a copy of my account with Henry L. Tynes. I did make ~~an~~ investments of Confederate States treasury notes

for Mr. H. L. Tynes, in June & July ~~and August~~ of
~~Conf~~ 1863, as set forth in the copy of said account
transcribed from my books, and is hereto appended
marked (A-)

I ~~was~~ a refugee in Petersburg during the year 1863
and I am quite confident I did not see Mr. Tynes
during his visit there ^{in June of that year}, and that his instructions to me
must have been received ^{either} through F. D. Holladay,
or by letter, ^{and if by letter it} ~~which~~ has been lost and cannot be referred
to. I cannot charge my memory with the particulars
further than suggested by the aforesaid account.
Mr. Daniel Dodson was at the time the funding agent
of the Confederate Government at Petersburg, and
also Cashier of the Exchange Bank, and though
the money paid to him at once passed into the Con-
federate States Treasury, he either had not the power,
or was not prepared to issue the Bonds, but sim-
ply a certificate setting forth that Mr. H. L. Tynes
was entitled to Confederate "Coupon Bonds" to the
amount of \$9,200. A general rule of the Con-
federate States Treasury was that Bonds should only
be issued for sums that were a multiple of \$100.

Without special instructions, I would not have invested
any particular sum in the name of other parties, and even
with such instructions not clearly understood should have
made the investment as I did, as the Bonds would be is-
sued in any particular name or names, on the surrender
of the Certificate.

Henry L. Tynes, the defendant, being duly sworn, deposes and answers as follows:

Question by Deft's Counsel:

State how the balances reported against you as Quasi Guardian of Lydia M. Vesey & Wm. J. Vesey, in account made up to April 15th 1862, were held, how collected and generally the Circumstances attending your action as such fiduciary.

Answer: The said balances against me as such ^{acting} Guardian were made up for ~~the same~~ ^{the same} received in bonds held by me for negro hires and other matters, taken in due course of my transactions, and were not due by me on account of my individual indebtedness. Previously to that time as any surplus had accumulated, I had loaned it to others, taking their

bonds therefor - among them one taken from Mrs. Elizabeth Godwin for the larger part thus due. After the beginning of the war, I received from debtors Confederate money, on account of these bonds, as well as on my own account, in order to meet their expenses, & having nothing but Confederate money paid it out accordingly. That in the year 1863, the principal debtor, Mrs. Elizabeth Godwin, sold her lot in Chuckatuck for Confederate funds or currency, and I received from her such funds in payment of her bond before mentioned, due to me as acting guardian of the plaintiffs and afterwards disbursed the money so received as set forth in account excepted to and filed with the Bill. For further explanation of my action as acting guardian of the plaintiffs I refer to my answer to the Plaintiffs' Bill in this Cause, and ask that the same be made a part of this deposition.

Commissioner's Office,
Suffolk, Va. Sept. 2nd 1848
To the Circuit Court of Stansemond County:

Pursuant to a decree of the Circuit Court of Stansemond County, rendered on the 20th day of April, 1848, in a suit in Chancery depending in the said Court between William J. Vesey and Lydia M. Vesey, Complainants; and Henry L. Tynes, Administrator of John H. B. Vesey, Decd. Defendant, the undersigned, one of the Commissioners of said Court, to whom was referred for settlement by said decree "an account of the dealings and transactions of the said H. L. Tynes as administrator of the said John H. B. Vesey Decd. and as quasi guardian of the said plaintiffs," reports to the Court, that on the 6th day of June, last, he issued notices against the several parties aforesaid, requiring them to ~~attend~~ the settlement of the said accounts, before him, at his said Office, on the 15th day of July, next thereafter, which notices were returned to your Commissioner duly acknowledged.

That the parties aforesaid appeared by Counsel before the Commissioner in obedience to the said notices, and ~~he~~ thereupon examined the vouchers, stated & settled the account, continuing & adjourning the same until now when completed. That by acct. marked (A.) - an account of the transactions of H. L. Tynes as administrator of John H. B. Vesey Decd. he finds on settlement up to the 15th day of April, 1849

that the said Administrator was indebted to the said Estate in the sum of \$515.61- And that on that day the same was distributed & credited to the accounts of the heirs at Law of said deceased: two of whom are the plaintiffs in this Cause.

That by Distributee Acct.(B) No. 1, he has stated the transactions of the said H.L. Dykes administrator as aforesaid acting as guardian for William J. Vesey. and that on the 15th day of April, 1867, a balance is found due the said Ward by the quasi guardian of \$702.77- And by Distributee Acct(B) No. 2. a balance is found due Lydia W. Vesey by the quasi Guardian, ~~of~~ on the same day, of \$668.00- That he finds from the evidence taken by the Commissioner, that said balances were invested in Confederate States Bonds in 1863 - or rather that the quasi guardian & administrator invested all the money then in hands belonging to the Estate of his Intestate, as well as the funds belonging to his wards in Confederate States Treasury Bonds, at the same time he invested a large amount of money of his own, in the same securities. Your Commissioner feels assured that though the fiduciary had no order of Court competent to direct such investment, yet from his situation, and the circumstances attending this investment, that such Court would have directed such investment upon application. That your Commissioner is convinced that the said investment was made in good faith

and that the Authorities justify the investment.
The General Assembly of Virginia, at its session of 1812 + 1813, authorized such investments when made by order of a Circuit Court, either at term, or by the Judge in vacation. This investment, ~~directly~~ ~~claim~~, was not made in compliance with any order of such Court. Yet, upon the General principle that what is lawful to be done, and what a Court would have authorized to have ~~done~~ done, if done without such authority will afterwards approve, this investment in question seems just & proper, and embraced within the equitable purview of that principle. If the exigency of the case had made it necessary for the acting guardian and administrator to have expended the whole of his wards' funds held by him, during such an unusual and unprecedented condition of things as existed during the time embraced by these accounts for Education and more particularly for the proper maintenance of the wards, such expenditure if found to be "judicious & proper" would have been allowed him by the Court having Cognisance of his accounts (Code Va. 1840, sec. 8 & 9 - page 588 -)

The doctrine of the English Equity requires that a fiduciary should invest the unemployed money in his hands in government Securities. If thus invested he is not answerable for any loss in the depreciation of Stock (2 Lomax Exrs. page 479) How far this rule would apply in Virginia, it seems to your Commission, would depend upon circumstances. The defendant

in this case, from the evidence, had no funds wherewith to provide for the maintenance of his wards, except certain bonds for money - being the surplus which had previously accrued - and which bonds were collected or paid in the currency of the State - Confederate Treasury notes, for the above purpose, and the remainder thus in the hands of the fiduciary was invested in Confederate States Bonds. He would have been chargeable with interest upon money in his hands, and it was his interest as well as his duty to invest it - and the money in his hands being currency, being invested in securities issuing from the same source that gives the currency value, it would be improper to hold him responsible for its depreciation.

(Granting & Granting - 2 Wash. Rep. page 248.)

In the case of trustees "where a trustee has acted in good faith in the exercise of a fair discretion, and in the same manner in which he probably would have acted if the subject had been his own property and not held in trust, he ought not to be held responsible for any losses accruing in the management of the trust funds" (Elliott v. Carter & al. - 9 Grant. page 557 & on.)

In the present case the defendant invested a much larger sum of his ^{than of his wards} own, in the same securities, ~~than he did~~.

Personal representatives are "liable only for due care and watchfulness, and reasonable skill and prudence, and the extent of such care and skill will be the same

as that of ordinary bailees for hire, that which prudent men exercise in the Conduct of their own affairs" (Redfield on Wills, Part II. Page 880.)

The English Courts invariably direct "any funds under its Control to be invested in the three per cents, and what it would order with a suit, it will equally sanction if done without suit." (Hill on Trustees, page 377-Marginal.)

The act of the Legislature of Virginia - 1842 & 63 - ratified & Confirmed by the Legislature of 1845 & 64 - expressly Designated such Securities as the defendant sought as proper for the investment of such funds as he held as fiduciary, and your Commissioner feels Confident, that any Court of Competent Jurisdiction within the State would have directed the investment of these funds as they were invested, and as he feels satisfied that said investment was made in good faith and in the exercise of a prudence which the Defendant exercised ^{the Conduct of} in his own affairs, he has felt ~~constrained~~ it to be right and proper that the Defendant should not be held liable to make good to the Complainants the loss ensuing upon the depreciation of the Securities in which these funds were invested

With respect to the prayer of the Complainants that Certain payments stated in Distributive Accts. Nov. 1862. some having been made in Confederate Currency, should be scaled to the value of Confederate currency when compared with some standard value (I suppose of

Your Commissioner has seen no reason, either in law, or the evidence, to justify an affirmative action. It is in evidence that the funds belonging to these wards, the Complainants, consisted of bonds given by debitor for money loaned to them by the Administrator, as an investment, or for him of negroes &c. that such bonds represented the different balances due the wards; that after the settlement of the a/c's of the Administrator up to Apl. 15th 1863, that all the money received, was in Confederate Currency, and as the demands of the wards required it, this sort of money was collected and paid out for board, clothes &c. and that the prices charged do not seem excessive when calculated to be paid in a greatly depreciated currency. In the charge for \$250 for a horse &c. made May 7th 1862, objected to by the Complainants, and allowed by Your Commissioner, he is guided in this decision by a personal knowledge of facts, and the value of Confederate States Currency, as they existed at that time - horses being scarce and the currency depreciated.

Your Commissioner further reports to the Court that after the completion of said accounts, he retained them in his office ten days for the examination of parties, during which time no exceptions were filed thereto, and the said accounts with the copy of decree and notices aforesaid, with the evidence relating thereto are herewith returned.

in controversy; if so, please state all you know?

Answer: I married one of the heirs of John H. B. Vesey, the
oldest girl. and shortly after marriage when leaving for the
army, Mr. H. L. Tynes handed me a paper, not in his hand-
writing however, which contained a statement purporting to

be the balances in the cases of the Vesey Children. In the
Case of my wife ^{Mary W.}, I saw a balance reported against her
to the best ~~guess~~ of my recollection of about \$467.65 -
and a balance in favor of Lem. J. Vesey of ^{about} \$4000. and
in favor of Lydia M. Vesey of ^{about} \$3000. This occurred in
July, 1861. I think I could recognise the paper shown me
at the time mentioned, if I could see it again, and my ~~own~~
recollection might be altered or confirmed, if I could see
and recognise it.

Do you know anything of the facts in the matter of
Controversy? if so, please state them!

Answer: I am now and have been for a number of years, one of the Commissioners of Staunton County Court, authorized to settle Fiduciary matters. That as such I made up an account of the transactions of Henry L. Tynes as administrator of John H. B. Vesey deceased and acting as guardian of Lydia M. Williams J. and Mary Ann Vesey, up to July 1st 1860, and on that day there was due to Lydia M. Vesey \$1293.37, and to William J. Vesey \$1464.67, and there was due by Mary Ann Vesey to said Tynes \$198.95.

That again I made up a subsequent settlement similar to the above, up to April 1st 1862, in which are included all credits and charges from July 1st 1860, — the last rest in the accounts — all negro hires and land rents for 1860 and 1861, and on the 1st of April 1862, there was due to said Lydia M. Vesey \$1757.12 and to said William J. Vesey \$2138.78, and due by said Mary Ann Vesey \$469.45. There was no account rendered by said Tynes from July 1st 1860, to April 1st 1862, and the account up to April 1st 1862, embraced all his transactions from July 1st 1860 to April 1st 1862. I have now before me the statements made by me and furnished said Tynes — with all the vouchers and I file them with this deposition (marked A. and B.)

I have read the deposition of Joseph C. Norworthy taken in this cause, and I am satisfied that he is mistaken as to seeing any balances reported in 1861, as no such account was made

up, and it will appear by statement of the
balances in accounts made up to April 1st 1862,
that he might easily have mistaken the figures - as
when the amounts due Lydia M. and William
J. Vesey are added up make \$3895.90, nearly
\$4000 - and after deducting \$469.45 due by
Mary Ann Vesey leaves \$3426.45 - balance due

Answer: In the summer of 1863, whilst I was
living as a refugee in Petersburg, Mr. H. L. Tynes,

came to that city, and placed in my hands a
bundle of Confederate States Treasury notes, the amount
being something over ten thousand dollars, and re-
quested me to give the same to Mr. Nathaniel Riddick
- that he had given him directions how to invest it, & a
~~part~~ portion of which, he stated, some \$800 belonged
to William Jackson, a free negro, and a part, to
the children, by which term I supposed he meant
the Vesey children, knowing he had been acting for
them. I do not know of my own knowledge that
Mr. Nathaniel Riddick made the investment in
Confederate bonds, but I have no doubt he did.

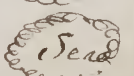
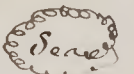

It sufficiently appears that the balance of \$2138.78 in the Admr's hands, was in bonds held by him as such & that the Debtors paid the same during the war in the currency then of the country and that the Admr. paid it out accordingly for the orphan, and invested what remained in Confederate States Bonds, so that there is nothing due by the Admr. However unfortunate this result may be, it is one that the Admr. could not avoid. Money was needed for the orphan & the only resource was from debts due, which when paid were paid in Confederate States Currency, which the Admr.

received as by the Laws governing him, he had a right to do, and as he supposed was his duty to do.

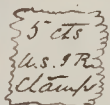

Wm. J. Vesey and Lydia M. Vesey.

This Respondent says, he feels mortified
to be called on to defend himself from
the charges made by the plaintiffs, under
the circumstances attending this case.

Your Respondent says, that several years
before the late war and whilst the said
Complainants were very small children,
he became the administrator of Geo. H. B. Vesey
Decceased, the father of said Complainants,
in Hanscom County Court, and proceeded
to administer the said Estate according to law,
to the best of his judgment and ability and
for the best interests of all concerned, and
he had flattered himself that he had suc-
ceeded in so acting as to commend his con-
duct to all parties interested -

That the said Decceased's estate con-
sisted of two parcels of land in Barrett's Neck
Hanscom County, and several negroes -

That the negroes were regularly hired out and

the Land, rented out from year to year and settlements regularly made out before a Commissioner of Stancourt County Court and duly recorded - That for several years, a distributive account has been kept with the distributees, and the last one, ^{that was recorded may} balanced up to the 15th of April 1862, and that a further account from 15th of April 1862 to 15th of April 1867, was made out by a Commissioner of this Court, but which has not yet been recorded, because of exception, filed thereto by said plaintiff, and a copy of which is filed with the Complainants' bill.

That on the 15th of April 1862, your Respondent was indebted to said W^m J. Vesey, \$2138.78, and to said Lydia M. Vesey, \$1757.12 - Your Respondent says, that this Balance, reported against him, was held by him in Bonds of parties for negro hires and other matters taken in due course of his fiduciary transactions, and that said Balance, was not due by him because of any indebtedness of his own to said plaintiff - That from time to time as he found a surplus, from the income of said Estate, he did, as the Law authorized him to do, lend it out to others, and in this way had lent a considerable sum to Elizabeth Godwin, whose Bond your

Respondent held - That the Case was
but a stop to nearly or quite all Income
from rents and negroes, so that there were
no means, scarcely, in your Respondent's hands,
to pay the current expenses of said Plaintiff -

That they needed money to live on and to pay
for their necessary expenses, and having no
Income scarcely from lands and negroes, your
Respondent had but one alternative & that was,
to collect money from those who thus owed him
to pay the said expenses - That he could
during the period ~~referred~~ to wit: from 18th
April 1862 to the end of the war, only collect
the currency of the Government which claimed
his allegiance, and that furnished the then
currency where he resided; and having in
good faith collected the money in Confederate
States Treasury notes, he paid it out ac-
cordingly; and therefore he claims to be allowed
the payments as charged, and denies that
the payments aforesaid should be scaled.

(see McLeae v. Peachy's adm. 3 Mun. 288) .

There was no advantage to your Respondent
in what he did; If he had actually owed the
said Balance, himself, the plaintiffs then
might with more propriety claim that
the payments made by him should be scaled,
but as he only collected of others who owed

the money, and then paid it out in the same currency he received, he claims that such payments should be a discharge. To the particular objections urged by said Wm J. Vesey, your Respondent says - That the charge for a horse on May 1st 1862 of \$250, was for a horse when the said Wm J. accounted to said Lem J. Veezy, the very same
sum that the house cost him, and which he
the said Lem J. Veezy received of the said
Government.

That the facts relative to the Balance
due Lydia M. Veezy are similar, so far
as collecting her funds were concerned, -

That she had to be supported and in order
to get money to do so, your Respondent
collected the money as above stated, and
paid it out accordingly, and therefore
denies that he is bound to make it equal
to "good money" or present currency -

That ~~one of the~~ ^{one of the} Debtors, to wit: Elizabeth
Groom, sold her house & lot for the ~~money~~ ^{Bonds}
of the Confederate States Government, and
paid your Respondent ^{in the same Bonds or stock} ~~money~~
along together with moneys made by your Res=
~~pondent for himself & the plaintiff, abates all~~

exact sum he would have in hand for
his said quasi ward, as no settlement
had then been made up during the war
after 1862, and hence he, ^{took Bonds as afore said & also} invested for them
whatever money he had, at the same time
that he invested his own money - That
he took as good care of his said quasi

wards' money as he did of his own - That he used every care to protect their Interests as he did for his own, ~~and~~ having in no instance speculated with the funds, he had as such fiduciary ~~and~~ having acted in perfectly good faith, and with the best judgment he could exercise, claiming that his account as made up should be Confirmed. The Trust which he held was of no particular profit to him - These children were his nephew & niece - his house had been their home whenever they thought proper to make it such, - he had treated them with all the kindness of a parent, and had no motive to injure them, and he confesses that he is astonished that under these circumstances they should seek to make your Respondent lose that which was lost because of the war, & thus virtually imposing a penalty on your Respondent because of the war.

Your Respondent is advised that no such rules as those contended for by the plaintiffs will be sanctioned by a Court of Equity, for if laid down with such strictness, they would serve to strike terror into mankind acting for the benefit of others and not their own" - That though the Investment of the Balances were not ordered by Court, yet they were such as a Court under the Law then existing would

have sanctioned, and made so when there was
no Court to apply to, because of the suspension
of the Courts during that period of the war

Your Respondent says that in all that
he has done, he has acted in good faith and
with no "malafides", and with a desire to
discharge his duties faithfully towards the
parties - He prays therefore to be hence
dismissed, without damages and so

--	----------------------------

This suit was brought in Feb. 1868 to surcharge and falsify the Administration Acct. of Henry L. Tyne of his intestate Mrs H. B. Vesey decd. and also his accounts as acting guardian of Mrs J. & Lydia M. Vesey children and heirs at law of Mrs H. B. Vesey decd.

The plaintiffs by their bill seek to correct the A. C. of 15th Apl. 1862, by which it appears that the amount of \$2138.78 was due on that day to Mrs J. Vesey; and the amount of \$1757.12 was due to Lydia M. Vesey.

They now however withdraw their objections to said accounts and claim said balances with interest, reduced by all proper expenditures for plaintiffs or either of them by their said acting Guardian, since that time to their majority.

The plaintiffs however except to the said guardian accounts filed Sept 1868, because of two items of charge against Mrs J. Vesey, the one of \$250. charged May 7th 1862, for a Horse, and the other for \$1620.50 charged in the years 1862, '63, '64 & '65 as per bill

for clothes, Horse &c, which payments they say, were made in Confederate States Treasury notes of depreciated value and should have been scaled down to their real value.

~~The exception to the account against Lydia M. Vesey~~

2nd. Because there is no evidence to show that the investment of \$702.77 made in Confederate Bonds in 1863, was made for or on account said ward or for his benefit and if so made it was done without authority of said.

3rd. The exception to the other account agt. Lydia M. Vesey is of the like nature, to wit; to the item of \$1281.65, charged for Board and cash for the years 1862, '63, '64 & '65, that the payments were made in Confederate States Treasury notes, greatly depreciated and should have been scaled down to their real value.

And 4th Because the investment of \$668.50 in Confederate States Bonds in 1863 was not made, so far as the evidence shows, on account of said ward or for her benefit, but on the individual account of the Dept. and for his benefit.

The account of Apl. '62 shows the balances due the Pltffs respectively of \$2138. and \$1757, made up of negro hires and land rents, ~~and~~ ^{were} charged

to the Defendant, and properly so charged I think. The bonds for the negro slaves and land rents became his property and he became indebted to his said wards for those amounts. This is well settled and well understood doctrine, and is so held in so many words in *McCall vs Peachy's admors* 3^d Mun. 288. It is then held that, "in all cases in which an Executor or administrator has debited himself with, or assumed the debts of others ^{due} to the Estate of his testator or intestate, the same ought to be considered as paid by them to him. These then must be regarded as funds in his hands due his said wards. What was his duty with regard to these funds? It was plainly to loan them out or invest them in an interest bearing fund or he would be chargeable with interest from the end of the year in which the balance arose.

10 L. c. of Ch. 127 page 589. This Guardian says he did so invest it, or the greater part of it, by a loan to Mrs Godwin, retaining a portion for the necessary expenses of his wards. If the bond was properly secured, I think he did right.

In 1863 Mrs. Godwin sold her lot and proposed to pay her indebtedness to the Dept. The Guardian is should he have received ^{it} or not. It is certain he had the right to receive it principal and interest, and if ~~not~~ the interest

was not punctually paid at the end of each year, he had the right to demand and receive compounded interest. 11 Sec. Ch. 127 of Code page 589.

The question, I repeat, is ought he to have received it? Now this depends upon the circumstances of the case; if it had become doubtful whether the bond was good or not; or if the necessities of the trust required it; or if in the prudent exercise of his duties and responsibilities he regarded it to the interest of his ward he ought to have received it. Now what these circumstances were we do not know, and the record does not disclose. The investment it must be remembered, was made by the Guardian upon his own discretion; it was not one made by his intestate and which he bound, when he took charge of the Estate, and could only charge at his peril. Did he then exercise his discretion in the collection of this bond, prudently and ought his act to be sustained. It is not pretended that any bad faith has been practiced by this Guardian, all is fair and well intended. If these plaintiffs insist that he did wrong it was incumbent on them to show, that the bond was good and safe, and that it was unnecessary for the purposes of the trust to collect it; for in the absence of such proof, it must be

imposed that the guardian acted in good faith and exercised his discretion prudently and discreetly.

What then should he have done with these bonds after he collected them. It was his plain duty, by the Statute law of the land, to apply it to the uses of the trust, the expenses of his ward, and invest the balance.

Now how should he invest it? We have not here as in England a recognised fund in which trust estates are to be invested. There the 3 p. ct. Stocks are those in which guardians and other fiduciaries are authorised to invest; and if they do so, they are shielded from liability for loss, otherwise they act at their own hazard. Not so here. The fiduciary has in good faith to make a good investment, according to his best judgment and sound discretion; ~~then~~ an investment good at the time according to his best judgment. This is all that can be required of him and is all, as I understand it, that is required of him.

The best test of the sincerity of his action is that he does with his trust funds as he does with his own. In this instance this guardian invested all his funds in Confederate States Bonds.

Did he act prudently or otherwise?
That is a question easily answered
now, but who so wise as to answer
it with certainty then? We were in the
midst of war, and this portion of
the Country, in which the Guardian
and his debtor lived, was
overrun by contending armies
devastating the whole country and
laying waste all around them.

What under such circumstances
is best to be done, to recover
our Estates, was the natural enquiry
on all hands. Different persons
would take different views, but the
future would only test the correctness
of any. This Guardian in his
sound discretion invested his funds
in Confederate Bonds. If the result
of the war had been different, these bonds
might have proven good and they sad-
ding, bad and worthless. When it
might have been said, he ought
to have collected the bonds and invested
as every body else did, in Confed-
erate Bonds. This would do; The du-
ties of Guardian are too important,
his office too necessary to the com-
munity, than to increase his liabil-
ities and encumber his duties. He stands
indeed in *Loco Parentis* and as such
a violation cannot be dispensed with
and should not be held to more than
a just and fair exercise of a sound
discretion. It is said however that
the Act of 1862-63 points out the mode

of investing in Confederate Bonds. That is true and if followed affords a bar to any suit against the fiduciary. But suppose that particular course cannot be pursued will a Court of Equity give no relief. If ~~the~~ ^a state of war for any other circumstance precludes the course pointed out in this statute, and still the funds are invested in Confederate Bonds, can a Court of Equity give no relief? We have just seen that where the statute is followed it is a bar to any recovery; but if it cannot be ^{followed}, is there no relief? The statute does not say so. See Act 1862-63 1st Sec. page 81, latter clause. Under the circumstances would a Court of Equity or Judge in vacation, under this act have ordered the investment? I think it would. There was no better security known to the party or the Court, in which to invest it; it was funds properly in Guardians hands, not needed for the trust, what was to be done with it? I must invest it in Bonds - some might have thought the security of all the States better than either - I don't think so myself, for ~~there~~ was an existing recognised government, the other not, but still others might have thought so, and which was right? The

result could only show. He was
justifiable then I think in making
the investment and a Court would
have ordered it; and if so it ought
to sustain it though not ordered see
Hill on trustees 377 & 383 but this act
of '62 & '63 expressly reserves the powers
now exercised by Courts of Equity
over the subject. See last clause of
1st sec.

I think then the investment
in Confederate Bonds, under the cir-
cumstances should be sustained.
The report of the very intelligent Compt.
in Chy. in this case is in accordance
with these views on this point, and
I think should be approved.

But there is also exception to
the report, as to the items of \$250. in
1862 for a horse, and for same
\$1600 in 1863 for horse & other things
in acct. asst. Wm. J. Vesey and ~~other~~
items for Board & in acct. asst.
Lydia M. Vesey. The item of \$250
is not unreasonable at that time in
good currency and at that time
Confederate currency was nearly
at par. I therefore overrule that
exception. The others I should sus-
tain were they now existing debts, but
they have been paid and discharged
and the last section of act of July 1867
provides that such payments shall not
be ordered. See Act July 1867 page 695.
I therefore overrule exceptions & confirm Compt.
report & decree can be drawn accordingly.

2. Because while the balance in the hands of the said administrator was in good money, the item of \$250, which appears to have been paid on the 7th day of May 1862, to Thomas D. Eames, for a horse, for your orator William J. Vesey, was paid in Confederate Treasury Notes, then at a depreciated rate, and the credit should be scaled down to its real value.

3. Because the item of \$1620⁵⁰ under the amount paid your orator William J. Vesey, in cash, for clothes &c, for '62, '63, '64, and '65, was paid in the same depreciated currency and should be scaled down to its real value.

4. Because the item of \$702⁷⁷ in the account of your orator William J. Vesey, under the head of amount invested in Confederate bonds,

was made on the sole and exclusive responsibility of said administrator and at his risk and hazard,

5. Because the balance due your oratrix Lydia M. May on the 15th Apr. 1862, amounting to \$1757¹²/₁₀₀ is insufficient and incorrect.

6. Because the item \$1281⁶⁵/₁₀₀ charged upon the account of your oratrix, Lydia M. May, for goods bought and cash in '62, '63 '64 & '65, was paid in depreciated Confederate Treasury notes and should be scaled down to its real value -

7. Because the item of \$668⁶⁸/₁₀₀ in the account of your oratrix Lydia M. May, was incurred in Confederate States Bonds on the sole responsibility of the said administrator and without any proper authority so to do.

Your orator and oratrix are advised that the mistakes and errors committed in the settlement of said accounts

may be corrected in a Court of
Equity. In tender considera-
tion of the premises and as-
as much as your orator and
oratrix are entitled remedy
in a Court of law, and
relievable only in a Court
of Equity where such mat-
ters are properly cognizable,
they pray that the said

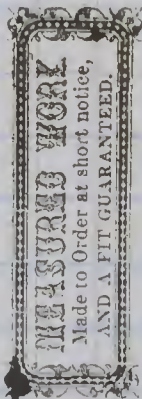

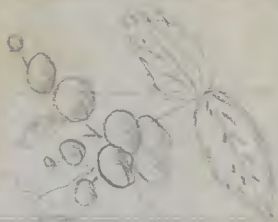
