Butler her next friend), Wm Saunders and Martha his wife, Bryant Saunders and Jane his wife, Sethus Riddick, David W. Duke, Mary Holland, Martha Beale, Uriah Vaughan and Elizabeth his wife, Matthew Vaughan and Ann his wife, Thomas J. Britt, and Susan his wife, Samuel Gatling and Parthenia his wife, Elias Britt and Permelia his wife, Richard N. Saunders and Mary L. his wife, John C. ~~Goodman~~ and Hemitia A. his wife, Parthenia Langston, Leffe Langston, David Langston, Geo. W. Langston, Frances Langston, Catharine Langston, Wm W. Darden & Ann his wife, Timothy E. Langston, Mr. B. Langston, Wm G. Goodman and Sarah E. his wife and Jas. E. Skinner -

Your Complainants respectfully shew unto the Court that at February rule last (1866) your Complainants filed their ^{original} Bill of Complaint in this Court, against Edward C. Riddick the administrator, de bonis non with the will annexed of James Goodman deceased, and the said Edward C. Riddick in his own right, and the said Edward C. Riddick and Eunice his wife, James N. Goodman and John C. Goodman, Wm J. Goodman, Wm B. Smith

and Sarah E. his wife, Almida P. Goodman, Catharine W. Goodman and Mary B. Goodman, and the said John C. Goodman as Executor of Barnes Goodman dec^d, Richard Austin, Barnes G. Daughtrey, Susan Daughtrey, The Unknown children (And heirs of Henry Britt dec^d, Dempsey L. Goodman, Benjamin Riddick, Letho Spirey, and Clementine E. his wife, Alice E. Skinner, William Langston, and Jacob E; Sarah J; Mary E. Dempsey, I; Mariah; Vada; (and Margaret Daughtrey, Elizabeth C. Langston, (and Frances Goodman, the last seven being Infants, Stating, that James Goodman died in Nansemond County on the day of September 1861 having first made & executed his Last will and Testament, which was duly proved & ordered to be recorded at September County Court of Nansemond County, on the 9th day of September 1861 (a duly certified copy whereof was filed with the said original Bill, & also is filed with this Bill as part thereof & is marked (V.)).

That the Testator, by his said will gave to his wife Priscilla certain property as therein named for life (and that since the Testator's death, the said Priscilla has also died - He lends to his sister Cherry Daughtrey certain real estate, but which real estate the Testator disposed of before he died - To Nancy Langston he lends negro Sam & a Bond he held against John Langston & at her death to her children - To Susan Daughtrey he gives

three negroes, Cadar, Martha & Sealy, and which negroes,
have been surrendered to her by the Executor of said
James Goodman dec^d - He lends to James B. Goodman
a certain plantation, but he died before the Testator & then
the Testator sold the same - He gives to his sister Betsey
Butt two hundred dollars in Bonds - He gives to
Hutchings & Lee Goodman one hundred dollars each - but
Both died before the Testator, and as the Law was at the
date of said will to wit. 4th day of June 1845, the Legacy
lapsed - He lends to Dempsey Goodman the Irish
Goodman & Bar tracts of Land during his wife, but the
Testator sold the said Land in his life time - He then
gives to various of his relations, small money legacies,
which have been or will be duly paid by his
Representative - He gives to his Brother Barnes Goodman's
son John Goodman his Cypress tract of Land, and to
his Brother Barnes Goodman's son James, the tract bought
of Miles, Suffin, all of which has been surrendered
to them - He gives to his Brother Barnes Goodman, his
water mill in Gates County, but sold the same before
his death - He also gives his Brother Barnes Goodman
a Lot in Suffolk, but sold the same before he died -
He gives to Benj^t. Riddick certain old negroes,
on certain conditions, which he refuses to accept -
He also gives to his sister Cherry Daughtry one negro
boy Noah, and to Barnes Goodman various
negroes, all of which he received after the
Death of said Testator as Legatee -
He gives to his sister Nancy Riddick five hundred

dollar, & to his sister Catharine Duke five hundred
dollar, but both of these sisters died before the
Testator and as the law was at the date of said
will, these Legacies lapsed — He then gave,
to his Brother Barney Goodman and to his
sisters Nancy Riddick (and Catharine
Duke all of his property of every kind "that is
not heretofore named" in this will to share and
share alike, after the death of his wife and after
paying his debts and the Legacies, and
appoints his Brother Barney Goodman his
Executor —

That the residuary Legacy to Nancy Riddick
(and Catharine Duke lapsed, as they both died
before the Testator — according to the Law as at the
date of said will, and that as to the same
the Testator died Intestate —

That the Testator, after the making of his said
will purchased various parcels of Land and
which by the will are undisposed of, and which
by the Law as it existed at the date of said will, does
not go into the Residuum, and that as to the same
he died Intestate — to wit: he purchased of James
W. Parker wife by deed dated 23^d Feb. 1846, two
hundred and four acres of Land more or less — of Ann
Griffin and others by deed dated the 23^d Dec. 1848
he purchased one hundred acres more or less; of
Thomas W. G. Allen he purchased sixty three and

one hundred and thirty acres, by deed dated the 12th of April 1849 (called the Brantom Land; of John Riddick he purchased one hundred and ninety acres & two rods by deed dated the 13th December 1858; of Richard Taylor Riddick, he purchased nine hundred to nine hundred and seventy five acres, more or less, by deed dated the 16th of December 1859; of Jeph R. Savage he purchased one hundred and seventy eight acres, more or less, by deed dated 6th July 1860, all of which Land, your Complainants prayed might be sold and the proceeds divided among the numerous heirs of said deceased, as it was wholly impracticable, to divide the same among so many -

That Barnes, Goodman the Executor named in said will duly qualified in Nassau and County Court, on the 9th day of September 1861, as will appear by the order of Court on said will filed herein - and that he proceeded to see the Chattel Estate & had proceeded to settle up the said Estate, when he was taken sick and died, & that since then, to wit, on the day of

Edward G. Riddick has duly qualified in Nassau and County Court, as ^{deputy} administrator, with the will annexed of said James Goodman dec^d, and as such has taken charge of the estate as unadministered by said Barnes, Goodman the said Executor.

That the said Barney Goodman died in the
County of Gates in the State of North Carolina
after making his Last will and Testament
and giving all Interest he might have in
the Estate of said James Goodman to his
Children, to wit: James Goodman, John C.
Goodman, Wm D. Goodman, Sarah E. wife of
Wm D. Smith, Almida P. Goodman, Catherine
W. Goodman & Mary B. Goodman - That a
duly authenticated Copy of said will had been
presented to Transylvania County Court aforesaid
at Oct^r term last and admitted to record as the
Law authorizes, and that the said John C.
Goodman, one of the Executors therein named duly
qualified as such - a Copy of which will and its
authentication & the order of Court were filed with
the original bill in this cause - and will again
be filed as part of the same. - That a settlement
of the transactions of said Barney Goodman as
Executor of said James Goodman dec^d has been
duly made up by a Commissioner of Transylvania
County Court recorded according to Law, a Copy
of which was filed with said original bill, & by
which it appeared that there was due by the
said Barney Goodman to his Testator's estate, the
sum of \$3372.58, with Interest from the
11th day of September 1865, which sum your
Complainants prayed now pay, may be deducted

from any sum the said Barnes Goodman may be entitled to from said Testator's estate, either as Legatee or distributee -

That the Testator left a wife named Priscilla now dead, and left no children, never having had any, and left as his heirs, at Law, his Brothers and sisters and their Descendants, a list of whom is as follows - and was set forth in said original Will - 1st Barnes Goodman, a brother who survived the Testator, and has since died leaving a wife as above set forth -

2^d A sister Edmy - who married David L. Mettler - he is dead, and she alive -

3^d A sister named Catharine, who married James Riddick and had three children & died - to wit (1st) Edward C. Riddick, now alive (2^d) Mariah who married Henry Skinner, both of whom are dead leaving children, to wit James E. Skinner, alive son, twenty one years, Clementine E. now the wife of Setho Sperry, & Alice A. Skinner, an Infant -

4th A sister Annie, who married first, Edward Cunningham & had no children by him & then married Nathl. Pierce & by him had one child named Eunice, now wife of said Edward C. Riddick (the said Annie & Nathl. Pierce being dead) -

5th A sister, named Margaret, who married James C. Vaughan, both of whom are dead, and

one child named Mary E, who married Samuel R. Harrell, she is now alive, but said Saml. R. Harrell is dead.

6th A sister named Charity, who married Mills, Daughtrey, both of whom are dead, leaving six children to wit: (1st) Margaret now wife of Hardy, H. C. Foxe; (2^d) Mary (who married Mr. Carr, who died & she then married Richard Austin; (3^d) Barne, S. Daughtrey; (4th) Martha now wife of Mr. Saunders, (5th) Jane now wife of Bryant Saunders, & 6th Susan who married Mills, H. Daughtrey, who is dead, the said Susan surviving.

7th A sister named Sarah, who married Cumberly Langston, both of whom are dead, leaving six children to wit: (1st) John D. Langston, who is now dead, (2^d) Minnelly E. Langston, (3^d) Margaret, (4th) Thomas B. Langston, (5th) Ann the wife of Mr. W. Darden (6th) Isaac E. Langston — That said John D. Langston left seven children, to wit: Joseph David, George W, Frances, Catharine, Parthena, over twenty one years old Saline and William, alive & under twenty one years of age — That said Margaret married Jas. H. Daughtrey, is dead leaving seven children all Infants, to wit: Jacob E; Sarah J; Mary E; Cumberly J; Mariah, Vada, & Margaret Daughtrey, That said Isaac E. Langston is dead & left two children, Sarah E. now wife of Mr. S. Grodman, and Elizabeth E. Grodman under twenty one years of age —

8th a sister, Ann Goodman, who married Edward Riddick, both of whom are dead, leaving three children - (1st) Letha Riddick, Margaret, & Mary Riddick - That Margaret married Irish Duke & both now dead leaving one child David W. Duke, now twenty one years old - That Mary married Jot Saunders, who died, she then married Solomon J. Holland she died, leaving her still alive.

9th a sister, Elizabeth Goodman, who married Etheldred Britte, both of whom are dead, leaving seven children - to wit: (1st) Elizabeth wife of Uriah Vaughan, (2^d) Martha, who married John Beal, who is dead, she yet alive, (3^d) Ann the wife of Matthew Vaughan, (4th) Lizzie, who married Jot died leaving one child, Susan, who married Thomas J. Brill, (5th) Parthena now wife of Saml. Galling, (6th) Henry Brill who married Martha Benton, both of whom are dead, leaving children, but whose names & residence are unknown to your Compliments -

And your Compliments further submitted

to the Court whether the said Barnes Goodman and Susan Daugherty and others who are Legacies under the Testator, James Goodman's will, and who have received their respective Legacies, can or should participate in the distribution in that part of said Testator's estate to which he died intestate, without bringing their said advancements & Legacies into Hotchpot.

That your Complainant Mary Austin, has been abandoned by her husband Rich^d Austin & that he has been unkind & cruel to her, and would squander whatever estate she might get as an heir of said James Goodman dec^d, and she prays the Court to direct the payment to her as her separate estate, free from any control of her said husband.

(And your Complainants further shew unto the Court, that in their said original bill they prayed that the accounts of Barney Goodman as Executor of James Goodman dec^d, might be duly settled and that any balance owing by him on said settlement might be paid out of any estate to which he might be entitled as a Legatee or heir of said Deceased - That the accounts of said Edward C. Riddick adm^r, de bonis non with the will annexed of said James Goodman dec^d, might be had - That the Land, aforeaid might be sold for division among the heirs aforeaid - That the Legacies to Anne

Ridolick & Catharine Duke, both moneyed & Residuary, might be declared Lapsed for the reason, stated - That Barnes, Goodman and Susan Daughtry and others, who as Legataries have ^{received} twice receive a portion of said Testator's estate may not be allowed further to participate in the distribution thereof unless they bring what they have received into Hotchkiss - That the portions due each heir may be duly ascertained, and that all further and proper relief might be granted:

And your Complainants also shew unto the Court that the Process in the cause was duly executed on all the Defendants, except Barnes, S. Daughtry, The Unknown Children and heirs, of Henry Brill dec'd, and Dempsey L. Goodman, who are non residents of Virginia and against whom an order of Publication had been duly executed - and that an answer of the Infant Defendants by P. B. Pruitt, their guardian ad litem was duly filed & replication thereto & a Conditional Decree against all the adverse Defendants, and the cause was regularly maturing when on the 7th day of February 1866, the Clerk's office of this Court and its records and the record in said cause were destroyed by fire, and that now in consequence thereof, this Supplemental Bill is filed - In Consideration whereof and as this Court has ample

jurisdiction to grant all proper relief - To the
End your Complainants pray That the said
Parties, who are Defendants in the said
Original Bill may be made Defendants
herein, and be required to answer the allegations
herein - That all the relief prayed for in the
said Original Bill may be granted to them,
(and that all further relief may be
granted consistent with Equity &c.

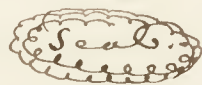

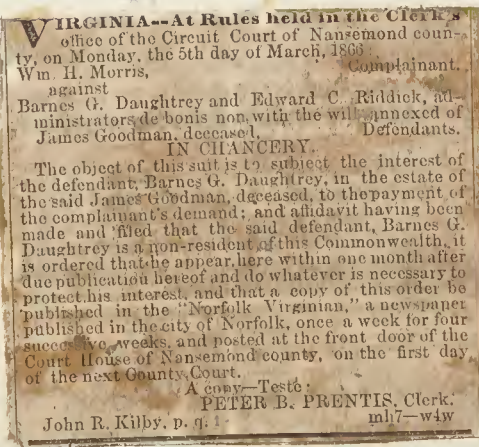

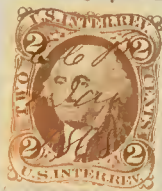
