To Hon<sup>ble</sup> Geo Blaw, Judge of the Circuit Court  
of Hausenond County:

Complaining, show  
unto Your Honor, Your Orators E. Camp & Abram  
E. Camp, merchants and partners doing busi-  
ness in the name of E. Camp & Son, the follow-  
ing Case:

1 That Solomon R. Butler & Isham Butler, late  
merchants and partners in trade under the name  
of S. R. Butler & Co are justly indebted to Your Or-  
ators in the sum of \$470 <sup>40</sup>/<sub>100</sub>, for goods, wares and  
merchandise, sold and delivered to the said S. R.  
Butler & Co, and no part of which sum has ever  
been paid. A statement of said account is her-  
ewith filed marked Exhibit No 1, which Your Orators  
pray may be taken as part of this bill.

2. That on the 22<sup>d</sup> day of September 1884, said  
Isham Butler, conveyed to Elisha Butler, his  
brother, the farm upon which he, the said Isham  
Butler resides, together with a large lot of Chattel  
property, a copy of said Deed, recorded in the  
Clerk's Office of Hausenond County Court on  
the 24<sup>th</sup> day of September 1884, being her-  
ewith filed, marked Exhibit No 2, which Your  
Orators ask to be read as part of this Bill. This  
Conveyance covers all the visible property of the  
said Isham Butler, and although he claims  
to have sold it, he yet continues in the pos-

session of the said property and enjoys the profits thereof, as he did before the Execution of the said Deed.

3<sup>d</sup> That the said Isham Butler, made a Bill of Sale, dated and recorded the 27<sup>th</sup> day of September 1884, conveying to his partner, the said Solomon R. Butler, all his interest in the assets of said Copartnership of every character and description, a copy thereof being herewith filed, marked Exhibit No 3, which you Orators ask to have read as a part of this Bill.

4<sup>th</sup> That on the same date, Sept 27<sup>th</sup> 1884, the said Solomon R. Butler conveyed all of the Copartnership assets to Mills H. Holland & Luskie, in order to save harmless, Mills H. Holland, from loss, by reason of his becoming security for Solomon R. Butler to the said Isham Butler for his indebtedness to the said Isham Butler upon a settlement of their Copartnership accounts. A copy of said Deed, admitted to record on the 30<sup>th</sup> day of September 1884, is herewith filed marked Exhibit No 4, and prayed to be read as a part of this Bill. That on a settlement of the Copartnership accounts, the said Solomon R. Butler undertook to settle the Copartnership debts and to pay to said Isham Butler \$1075<sup>00</sup>, exceeding to the said Isham Butler, four bonds, aggregating \$1075<sup>00</sup> with

Nills H. Holland as his security thereon. That he has paid one of said bonds, with money arising from the sale of the Copartnership assets, notwithstanding the fact that the former Copartnership is still largely indebted; and that the said Solomon R. Butler is daily converting the said partnership assets into money, while prosecuting the business in his own name, and using the money to liquidate his individual indebtedness to his former partner, instead of applying it to the liquidation of the Copartnership indebtedness, and is thus misapplying the property to which your Orators have a right to look for the payment of their debt.

5<sup>th</sup> That the said Solomon R. Butler, conveyed by deed dated January 20<sup>th</sup> 1885, and admitted to record Jan 21<sup>st</sup> 1885, to Solomon Bradshaw a tract of 20 acres of land more or less; a copy of said deed is filed as part of this Bill, marked Exhibit No 5.

6<sup>th</sup> Your Complainants are informed & believe & therefore allege that the said Bradshaw Butler has assigned to Elisha Butler, his Brother the bonds Executed to him by Solomon R. Butler his late partner, without any consideration, valid in law.

7<sup>th</sup> Your Orators charge that all the conveyances and assignments herein before referred to were made for insufficient or illegal considerations, or such as

are not valuable in law, and with intent to hinder, delay and defraud Your Orators of and from what they are lawfully entitled to, of which intent the Grantors and assignees severally had notice; That they were all voluntary, fraudulent and void as to Your Orators and all other Creditors of the Said S. R. Butler & Co.

But as Your Orators are without remedy in the premises, save in a Court of Chancery, where such matters are alone and properly cognizable and relievable, Your Orators pray that the Said Solomon R. Butler, Elisha Butler, late merchants and partners trading under the name of S. R. Butler & Co, and each of them individually, Mills H. Holland & Trustee, Mills H. Holland, Elisha Butler and Solomon Bradshaw may be made parties Defendant to this Bill and be required to answer the same, Your Orators waiving answers under Oath; That an Injunction may be awarded by Your Honor, prohibiting & restraining the Said Solomon R. Butler his agents or attorneys, and all other persons from selling or disposing of any of the stock of merchandise now in the store and ware house at Holland's corner in Hanseman's County Va, (recently occupied by S. R. Butler & Co, and now by S. R. Butler) and from collecting or disposing <sup>of</sup> any debts due to the Said firm or to the Said S. R. Butler as the Successor of the Said

find, in any way whatsoever\*. That a Receiver  
may be appointed to take charge of the said  
stock of merchandise, the books and accounts  
of the said Copartnership, notes and bonds due to the  
same, and also the accounts, notes and bonds due to  
the said S. R. Butler as the successor of S. R. Butler &c.,  
that such Receiver may sell the stock of merchan-  
dize and collect the said accounts, notes & bonds  
under the direction of this Court; and that the  
Real and personal Estate covered by the several  
conveyances herein before named, may be sold,  
if necessary to satisfy Your Orators; that the said  
conveyances may be set aside and annulled;  
that Your Orators debt may be paid in full out-  
of the proceeds thus arising, and that the fund  
may be distributed among the bona fide credi-  
tors of S. R. Butler &c to the exclusion of any de-  
mand of the said Isham Butler or his assignee,  
on a settlement of copartnership accounts; that  
all proper accounts may be taken by one of the  
Commissioners of this Court; and that such  
other further and general relief may be granted  
Your Orators as their case may require or to Equity  
may seem meet.

indebted to your petitioners in  
the sum of \$63,890, for goods, wares  
and merchandise bargained, sold  
and delivered to the said S. R.  
Butler & Co., for which your petitioners  
have never been paid. An itemized  
account is herewith filed, which your  
petitioners pray may be read as a  
part of this petition.

That a chancery suit has been  
recently instituted in this Court by
