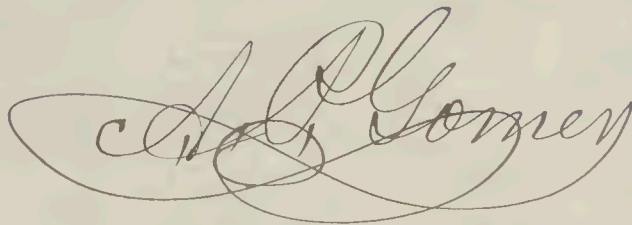

Holland & Co., and although notified, he has as yet never attempted in any way to press his claim or offer any explanation as to how it came into his possession. It will be seen that M. H. Holland Jr. did appear before your Commissioner and attempt to set up the fact that he had assigned the said note to the said Stallings for value. The assignment, however, if made at all, was not made until October 7th. 1898.

2. Another Note similar to the one above described, only differing in amount was also offered and likewise rejected.

3. A due bill to J. L. Fulgham for \$12. bearing date as of July 17th. 1882.

4. Item of \$40.00 paid to A. W. Ballard for maintenance of horses, as this amount was included in an item of \$192, which was allowed in the account of the transactions of M. O. Holland, Executrix in this Report.

5. An account for \$18.30 paid to J. E. Holland by M. O. Holland and charged in her account against the estate when it appears as if it ~~is~~ is her individual debt.

III.

An account of the real estate of which the said M. H. Holland, Senior, deceased, died seised and possessed, together with its fee-simple and annual values.

1. Two small tracts of land in Isle of Wight County, Virginia lying adjacent to each other and containing respectively 53 and thirty acres and could be designated as one tract, being in Windsor District of said county, and adjoins the lands of formerly belonging to Elisha Bridger, E. time of the conversations related by Mr. E. E. Holland , a member of the firm of M. H. Holland Son & Co., and that the communications related were made by client to counsel and therefore privileged , M. H. Holland Jr. latly trading under the name and style of M. H. Holland & Co. , assigned or delivered to said F. E. Stallings the two notes filed with this exception.

Counsel for the Executrix objects to the introduction of the two notes filed with the Commissioner as evidence of debt owing by the estate on the ground that there is an apparent alteration on the face of the notes which have not been explained and which she is advised are worthless until such explanation is made. Counsel also says that he was employed by M. H. Holland Sr. alone that his fees in connection with the matter were paid by M. H. Holland and that he had no connection with the matter except as the Attorney for M. H. Holland Sr.

Counsel for F. E. Stallings Without waiver of exceptions crossexamined the witness.

Q. 1 Were not your services rendered on the occasion alluded to for the benefit and on behalf of the firm of M. H. Holland Son & Co? A. As I understood it, I represented in this matter M. H. Holland Sr. alone; he is the only party who employed me , I charged him the entire fee which he paid.

Q.2. Was there any conflict of interest or dispute between M. H. Holland Sr. and his son, M. H. Holland Jr. in regard to the matters of the firm of M. H. Holland Son & Co? A. MxW. I was informed that some debts due by M. H. Holland Son & Co. had been presented to M. H. Holland Sr. for payment, I was employed in part to ascertain the indebtedness of M. H. Holland Son & Co for which M. H. Holland Sr. was responsible and bring

about in some way a dissolution of the partnership. A notice of dissolution, as I now recall it was prepared and I believe published in a Norfolk paper. As I understood it M. H. Holland Sr. wanted all the information he could get about the condition of the firm and also desired to have a dissolution of it

Q. 3 I herewith file a letter marked Exhibit "C" and four sheets marked D E F G, being a statement due to the firm of M H.

Holland Son & Co. This letter and these statements were sent to me by M. H. Holland Jr. at the time I was representing M H. Holland Sr.

So much of the above answer as refers to information received by Mr. E. E. Holland, the witness, from other people, is excepted to.

q. #. It appears ^{from the papers filed with your} ~~from the papers filed with your~~ last answer that M. H. Holland Jr. was cordially aiding and assisting you in your professional services Did he have any knowledge from any source that you were representing any interest adverse to him or any party whose interest in the matter was adverse to that of his own? A. I can only answer by saying that I am satisfied that M. H. Holland Jr. knew that I was representing his father, M. H. Holland Sr.

q. 4. Was your fee paid in currency or by check or draft? A. My recollection is that my fee for this work was paid out of the proceeds of a note discounted by M. H. Holland Sr. at the Farmers Bank of Nansemond and that the balance of the proceeds of that note were used to pay the Bank of Commerce to which I have above referred.

q. 5 Then M. H. Holland ^{son} & Co. owed M. H. Holland Sr. that part of the note which went to pay the Bank of Commerce did they not?

A. I know that M. H. Holland Sr. made his own note to the Farmers

Bank and that out of part of the proceeds thereof I aid the Bank of Commerce the note held by it ~~xxxxxxx~~ of M. H. Holland Son & Co., if this makes the note paid by me as afore-said a debt of M. H. Holland Son & Co. to M. H. Holland Sr. then I presume the firm owed it to him.

q Is it not a fact that M. H. Holland Jr. freely and willingly aided you in every way he could in this legal service in connection with M. H. Holland Son & Co.? A. I made several trips to Norfolk and wrote M. H. Holland Jr. several letters and the letter filed in these papers showing what the concern owed and the papers showing what was owing to the firm is substantially the information furnished me by M. H. Holland Jr. so far as I now recall I have never examined the books of the firm of M. H. Holland Son & Co.

q Was any other attorney retained to assist you or to represent M. H. Holland Jr. in these matters? A. There was none so far as I know. certainly I never met any attorney in connection with it.

q. Did not M. H. Holland Jr. seek your counsel and advice in this matter? He did not, except possibly when something was said about the dissolution notice I offered to prepare it and my recollection is that after its preparation it was handed to M. H. Holland Jr. and he had it published in one of the Norfolk papers.

q Have you any more letters or written statements other than bonds or notes, bearing upon this matter, if so will you please file them or abstracts from such writings in case there should be objections on your part to the filing of the whole of any such statement? A So far as I now recall the only one I have at present is the paper I now hand you marked exhibit H. The Executrix may have some papers which may hereafter be introduced.

A. B. Williams, being duly sworn, deposes and says:

Direct examination: by W. S. Holland.

- Q. Please state your name, age and residence, occupation now and in 1895 and 1896 and also state whether you are connected by blood or marriage, with any of the parties to this suit.
- A. A.B.Williams, 43, Norfolk/ Va., I am in the fish business wholesale and retail; I was book-keeper and shipping-clerk in 1895 and was with M. H. Holland Son & Co., and in 1896 I was with J. R. Wynne & Co. of Norfolk.
- Q. Who succeeded or followed M. H. Holland Son & Co. in business at the same place?
- A. J. R. Wynne & Co.
- Q. The witness is now shown the original notes in controversy and asked to examine them, especially with reference to dates and to say if he knows whether the dates of the notes and the date of the credit on one of the notes, has been changed or altered, and to state if he can, whether or not said dates have ever been changed, and if so, state the circumstances under which any such change was made.
- A. Sometime in the Fall of 1896, I don't recollect the date, Mr. M. H. Holland Sr. and Mr. M. H. Holland Jr. both came in my office and were speaking about some papers, and Mr. M. H. Holland Sr. called my attention to the change in the two notes so that Mr. M. H. Holland Jr. could use them; I think these are the notes but I am not positive about it.

--Question and answer last herein are excepted to by Attorneys for executrix of M. H. Holland Sr., for the reason that same purports to give evidence of facts stated by the decedent, and is therefore, illegal testimony--

- Q. Will you please state whether or not on that occasion anything was said by Mr. M. H. Holland Jr. or M. H. Holland Sr. in their conversation with each other and yourself, about changing the dates so as to make the notes within date, and if so, please state what was said?

--Question and any answer that may be given thereto are excepted to by Counsel for Executrix upon the grounds just above stated--

- A. To the best of my recollection, what I have already stated is about all I have to say or recollect.

- Q. In a former answer you said, that in a conversation between M. H. Holland Sr. and his son M. H. Holland Jr., something was said about changing the two notes so that M. H. Holland Jr. could use them; now please state in what respect or in what particular were they to be changed so that he could use them?

- A. Mr. M. H. Holland Sr. called my attention to the changing of the two notes so that Mr. M. H. Holland Jr. could use them; change as to dates.

--Excepted to as before--

- Q. During the time that you were keeping books for M. H. Holland Son & Co., did you frequently see these same notes, and you may tell if you please where you saw them.

- A. O, yes, in the drawer of the safe.

- Q. Is it not a fact that M. H. Holland Sr. and M. H. Holland Jr. on the occasion that you have spoken of, agreed and consented that the dates be changed?

--Excepted to because same is clearly leading--

Question withdrawn.

- Q. Will you state why your attention was called to this fact and whether or not you were called on as a witness?

--Excepted to by Counsel for Executrix because the latter part of same is leading--

- A. I was called on as a witness but I cannot say why.

- Q. Please state whether or not you understood that this alteration of dates was agreed to and consented to by M. H. Holland Jr. and M. H. Holland Sr?

--I except^{to} the question and any answer that may be given thereto; excepted to because same is leading and because it purports to give facts stated or agreed to by party now dead--

- A. That was my understanding.

Q. Please state whether M. H. Holland Sr., or M. H. Holland Jr. made any objection at all to the alteration of dates about which you have spoken, and if any such objection was made, please tell what it was and who made it.

A. Not to my knowledge.

Cross examination:

The Counsel for Executrix, without waiving any objection to the questions and answers on examination in chief, asked the following questions:

Q. When was the last time you saw these notes in question before today?

A. In the Fall of 1896.

Q. Did the transaction at the time as you have related in your examination in chief, make any decided impression upon your mind?

A. None.

Q. Do you remember the dates of the notes shown you that day?

A. No sir, I do not remember.

Q. Do you remember the amounts of the notes?

A. No sir.

Q. Do you remember to whom they were payable?

A. I can not say positively that I do.

Q. Were the changes that you have mentioned in these notes, made in your presence or were they merely discussed in your presence?

A. They were merely discussed.

Q. Then as I understand it they were simply talked in your presence about making the change in some notes, the dates, amounts and to whom payable you do not know at this time.

A. They called my attention to it and asked me to come over to the desk. I do not remember the dates, amounts or to whom payable.

Q. At the time of this conversation that you have referred to had the notes already been changed or were they changed afterwards?

A. I think the notes were changed then, he called me over there and called my attention to the notes.

Q. Are you positive as to whether they had already been changed or not?

A. I am pretty positive.

Q. Did they say at that time, anything about making new notes instead of changing the old ones?

A. They may or not, I do not remember.

Q. Do you know whether or not the notes that were then changed were ever used as the basis of credit or negotiated?

A. I do not.

Q. Who had the notes at this time?

A. M. H. Holland Jr. was at the desk.

Q. I understand you to say that you do not know whether the notes which had been shown you were the notes had there that day or not, as you have not seen them since 1896. Is this correct?

A. --Question excepted to because it does not repeat what the witness said on that subject, but purports so to repeat what the witness did really say is as follows: "I think these are the notes but won't be positive about it."

A. I am not positive, I think they are the same..

A. --Counsel for Executrix here enters protest against any objections to questions propounded, where the only objection raised is as to quotation or the substance of one from the witness, as he is presumed to be able to know whether he has stated certain things or not without any quotation from his former testimony by Counsel.

--Counsel for Claimant replies by saying, that when an Attorney, on cross-examination, states that he understood a witness to say what the witness has not said, then the Counsel for Claimant think it their legal right and bounded duty to correct it, and Counsel for claimant know of no better way of correcting a misquotation than by quoting the exact statement word for word and letter for letter.

Q. Will you please state what makes you think the notes which have been shown you today were the notes you saw three or four years ago?

A. They look to be the same notes, have a similar likeness.

Q. When you say they look to be the same notes, do you mean that by a casual glance at them they have the same general appearance or do you mean that when you look at them closely you remember their dates, amounts and to whom payable, and thereby know them to be the same notes?

- A. I mean that by a casual glance at them they look like the same notes.
- Q. Do you know who was the maker of these notes?
- A. Why I know it now of course and I knew it before I saw them today; the maker was M. H. Holland Sr.
- Q. Do you know anything about the change of the date of the credit on the back of one of these notes and when the same was done?
- A. I don't recollect especially about there being credit on it as I did not charge my memory especially with the matter.

--Questions by Commissioner--

- Q. Do you remember the original date of either of the notes in question?
- A. No sir.
- Q. Do you know who changed the dates on the notes in question Mr. M. H. Holland Sr. or Mr. J. H. Holland Jr.?
- A. No sir, I do not.
- Q. Do you know whether or not that either or both of the notes in question, were more than five years old at the time the dates were changed?
- A. No sir, I do not.
- Q. Do you know the original date of the credit on the back of the larger of these notes?
- A. No sir.
- Q. Do you know the amount of either of the notes in question?
- A. No sir.

--Signature waived--

M.H.Hollano, being duly sworn, deposes and says:

Direct examination: by W.S.Hollano.

- Q. Mr. E. E. Holland, who has testified in this case, on behalf of the Executrix says, that in June 1896 he went to Norfolk several times for the purpose of looking into the affairs of M. H. Holland Son & Co., and that he understood that he was employed and paid by M. H. Holland Sr. a member of the firm of M. H. Holland Son & Co., of which you were also a member. Please state whether or not you considered Mr. E. E. Holland your Attorney, that is to say, Attorney for the firm of M. H. Holland Son & Co., composed of yourself and your father, and whether or not you treated him and communicated with him as such.
- A. I will state that Mr. E. E. Holland is right about making several trips to Norfolk looking after the business of M. H. Holland Son & Co. I looked upon him after his first trip, Attorney for M. H. Holland Son & Co., answered all questions he asked me concerning the business, aided him in any way possible as to the nature of the business, also sent him statement of amounts due M. H. Holland Son & Co. as I looked upon him after having several communications from him, as Attorney in chief for M. H. Holland Son & Co. Why I considered him Attorney was from he and my father coming together, and after consultation with them, I then looked upon him as Attorney for M. H. Holland Son & Co., employed by M. H. Holland Sr. and was afterwards paid by the said firm.
- Q. You say that you understood that Mr. E. E. Holland was paid by the firm? Mr. E. E. Holland says, that Mr. M. H. Holland Sr. made a note at the "Farmers Bank of Nansemond," and out of the proceeds of the note Mr. E. E. Holland's fee was paid or retained and the balance of the money paid on a note of \$300.00 at the "Bank of Commerce" Norfolk, Va.. Can you reconcile Mr. E. E. Holland's testimony with that of your own and if so please do so.
- A. Mr. E. E. Holland's statement as to note being made at the "Farmers Bank of Nansemond" to pay a note of \$300.00 due "Bank of Commerce Norfolk, Va. and his fee included as well as my memory serves me, is correct. In paying the said note M. H. Holland Sr. takes up the collateral note due to M. H. Holland Jr. for \$1300.00, he being maker of the note, which note they never returned to me, and out of said proceeds, they could well afford to pay the "Bank of Commerce the \$300.00 note and include any reasonable fee for M. H. Holland Son & Co's Attorney, fee rendered by the said E. E. Holland.

--So much of said answer as refers to said ~~answer~~ execution by M. H. Holland Sr. and the discount by whom notes in the "Farmers Bank of Nansemond" or elsewhere, is excepted to by Counsel for Executrix because M. H. Holland Sr. is dead and the evidence is thereby made illegal.

Q. You have just stated that they never returned to you the \$1300.00 note held by the "Bank of Commerce" as collateral and which was the note made by M. E. Holland Sr. and payable to you. Do you not now remember that the said note was returned to you one day last week while Mr. E. E. Holland was on the witness stand?

A. Will state that said \$1300.00 was returned to me on the 23rd. of August 1899.

Q. You have been present during the examination of Mr. A. E. Williams and heard him questioned as to the identity of the two notes which Mr. F. E. Stallings is now claiming. Will you please state whether or not if you know positively that these are the notes, the dates of which Mr. Williams says were changed.

--Question and any answer that may be given thereto are excepted to by Counsel for the Executrix, for the reason that same relates to contract had with M. E. Holland Sr. who is now dead, the witness being the other party to said contract, if any.

A. The two notes in controversy and which Mr. F. E. Stallings claims, are the same two notes that Mr. Williams said were changed by mutual consent between my father and myself, and he being present his attention was called to same.

Q. In June 1896, when Mr. E. E. Holland was rendering his services about which you and he have both spoken, were you and your father perfectly friendly, or was there any dispute or difference between you of a financial or personal nature?

A. In June 1896 my father and myself were perfectly friendly in all business matters so far as I know; as to personal matters I feel perfectly confident that we were friendly.

Q. Mr. E. E. Holland related a statement which he said was made by you, in which you claim that your father owed you some notes, he thought the notes or some of them at least, were barred by the Statute Limitations or were out of date. Please state your recollection about the matter.

A. My recollection as to Mr. E. E. Holland's statement, he is entirely mistaken, while the Bank held one of the notes the other two being locked up in a rented drawer or safe, it would have been almost impossible for me to have given the exact number of dollars and cents they amounted to; admitting that he is correct-

--Here the Attorney for F. E. Stallings, interrupted the witness by saying "You ought not to argue the question but state your recollection of the facts," whereupon the witness withdrew the statement "Admitting that he is correct"

Witness continues: though I will admit that I am liable to be mistaken as well as Mr. Holland.

Q. If Mr. E. E. Holland is correct and you are mistaken as to making the statement or ~~vice versa~~, is it not a fact that the notes were out of date at the time?

A. I will state that the notes as referred to by Mr. E. E. Holland are the same notes we have now in controversy which were at that time out of date and which by mutual consent between my father and myself have been changed so as to be in date.

--~~Except~~^{to} that part of the question and answer which refers to the bringing of the notes in date by mutual consent of father and son, is ~~excepted~~ to by Plaintiff's counsel because it is with reference to a matter of contract between M. H. Holland Sr. and yourself, one of whom is dead.

Cross examination:

--Without waiving any objections to the exceptions taken to the examination in chief of this witness, Plaintiff's proceeds to cross examine.

Q. How much did Mr. Stallings pay you for the two notes which he is now attempting to collect in these proceedings, and how did he pay you?

--Excepted to by Counsel for Claimant because irrelevant, but if the commissioner and Court should be of the opinion that it is an irrelevant question, the Executrix is hereby notified that this is new matter and that they will be bound by any answer that may be given as coming from their own witness and that if the Executrix wishes to introduce M. H. Holland Jr. as a witness on her behalf, we have no objection.

--Counsel ~~xxxxxx~~ for Executrix accepts all legal consequences growing out of any answer that may be asked.

A. The face value of the notes with interest, paid one part some unsettled business between my father and myself, and the other in notes and cash.

Q. How much in notes?

A. I do not recollect just the amount at present.

Q. Could you give me something about how much?

A. I could not, it has been about a year and there has been ~~right~~ much transactions between him and myself, and I could not recall it.

Q. How much did he pay you in cash?

A. I do not ~~recollect~~ that.

Q. Whose note did he give you?

A. His own note.

Q. Where is that note now?

A. I cannot tell you sir.

Q. What did you do with it?

A. I disposed of it.

Q. What did you do with the notes?

A. I cannot tell exactly where the note is.

Q. Do you not know to whom you gave this note or assigned it to?

A. Yes, I know who I assigned the note to.

Q. Who was it?

A. To my wife. (In other words, nothing.)

Q. How long since you assigned it to your wife?

A. Very near as soon as it was made sir.

Q. Do you know whether she has it now or not?

A. I think not sir.

Q. Do you know who has it?

A. I do not.

Q. Do you know to whom she assigned it?

A. I do not.

Q. What was the amount of unsettled business between you and Mr. Stallings?

A. I do not exactly recollect.

Q. Did you owe him or did he owe you?

A. I owed him some.

Q. Who composed the firm of M. H. Holland & Co.?

A. M. H. Holland Jr.

Q. The firm of M. H. Holland Son & Co., were not successful in business in Norfolk, were they?

A. No sir.

Q. Did not your father have to pay some considerable money on account of the failure in business there?

A. No failure in the business there.

Q. In the settling up of this business in Norfolk was not your

father called upon to pay out money in order to settle same up and to pay the debts of the firm?

A. No.

Q. Did the firm have ample assets to pay its own indebtedness?

A. No sir.

Q. Who paid the debts?

A. There was enough owing to the Senior member by the Junior member of the firm to pay said indebtedness.

Q. Then there were some differences in accounts between the Junior and Senior members were there?

A. Of course there was an account owing by the Senior member.

Q. What was Mr. E. E. Holland doing down there, was he not settling up the difference between the Junior and Senior members?

A. Mr. E. E. Holland was Attorney for M. H. Holland Son & Co to look over the business, see how the business stood and to act in any way his services should be required as Attorney for M. H. Holland Son & Co., to bring about a dissolution in the business of said firm.

Q. Did he not adjust the difference between you and your father?

A. No sir, there was no difference between my father and myself.

Q. Did you personally, ever employ him in the matter or engage him to go to Norfolk, or did you ever pay him personally any fee either out of your private pocket or out of the funds of the Company for such services.

A. While I did not personally employ him, I was aware of the fact that he was employed as Attorney for M. H. Holland Son & Co., after making his first trip to Norfolk to see me I then did everything I could to aid him in finding out and letting my father know exactly about the business of M. H. Holland Son & Co. stood, as he represented the same not only by showing him any books he wished to see but by fixing up and sending any statement he asked me to do.

Q. In the matter of the adjustment of the business differences between your father and yourself in which you have stated there were certain notes passed, was Mr. E. E. Holland also engaged in arranging this?

A.

I only looked upon him as Attorney for M. H. Holland Son & Co.

Q. Where have the two notes which are here in evidence today been kept since the dates herein were changed and who has been in possession of them?

- A. Well, they have been kept in a safe most of the time, and a Commissioner down here has had them part of the time, and they have been on the go part of the time, they were turned over to Mr. R. E. Stallings and he turned them over to the Commissioner and they have been on the go right much.
- Q. Did you ever file them away?
- A. Yes sir.

Re-direct examination: by Mr. S.E. Everett.

- Q. Mr. E. E. Holland in his statement before the Commissioner, stated that when he was in Norfolk in June 1896 in settling up the business of M. H. Holland Son & Co. that you stated to him, you held three notes aggregating an amount of \$2443.05 that you gave him the dates of these notes and admitted that they were out of date. Are these the notes that he had reference to if you did make such statement to him, if they are the same notes state whether they were out of date at the time and if these are the notes in evidence today, state whether they have been altered or not and explain as by whom and where they were altered and why.

--Question and any answer that may be given thereto are excepted to by Counsel for executrix because same is leading because it asks for evidence about a contract with parties, one of whom is dead and because it is examination relative to a matter already gone over in examination in chief.

It is agreed that this exception will apply to any other question or answer that may be propounded or given.

- A. I do not recollect stating to Mr. E. E. Holland the exact amount of these notes but must think that he gets the amount seeing them elsewhere; the two notes which are now held by the Commissioner, are the two notes in controversy, said notes were out of date at the time Mr. E. E. Holland claims to have had the conversation with me. They have since been changed by myself and father by mutual consent before Mr. A. B. Williams sometime in the Fall of 1896, at office on Roanoke Dock, on account of notes being out of date and dates were changed on account of my father preferring to do so instead on giving new notes, as there was near enough unsettled business between my father and myself to pay interest to said date as appears on the face of the notes.
- Q. Mr. A. B. Williams stated in his examination that sometime in the Fall of 1899, that you and your father in his office, the office of Wynne & Co, that M. H. Holland Sr. and E. E. Holland Jr. in settling up their business, they altered the dates of the two notes, and that he was called on as a witness to this alteration. Will you please state if these two notes which are filed before the Commissioner by R. E. Stallings, are the same notes that were altered that day and if so was it altered by the consent and at the wishes of you and your father?

- A. The two notes now held by the Commissioner are the same two notes that dates were changed in J. R. Wynne & Co's office and Mr. A. B. Williams' attention was called as witness to same. They were changed with the consent of M. H. Holland Sr. by M. H. Holland Jr. Said notes were changed in the Fall of 1896.
