THIS DEED, Made this 5th day of May, 1909, between William G. Goodman, of Nansemond County, Virginia, party of the first part, and Camp Manufacturing Company, hereinafter, for convenience called "Company", a corporation, of Isle of Wight County, Virginia, party of the second part.

WHEREAS: The said party of the first part, by a certain deed, bearing date the 29th day of March, 1902, and recorded in the Clerk's Office of Nansemond County, Virginia, in Deed Book #53, Page 228, conveyed to John L. Gay, certain timber, and rights, privileges, licenses and easements, reference to which deed is hereby made; and

WHEREAS: The said John L. Gay afterwards conveyed to the said Company the said timber, and all the rights, privileges, licenses and easements, acquired by him under and by virtue of the said deed of March 29th, 1902; and

WHEREAS: The said deed conveyed all the timber upon the said land of a certain size, and provided that the grantee should have five (5) years from the date of beginning to cut the said timber in which to remove the same from the land; and

WHEREAS: There was no limit fixed in said deed as to how long the said Company should be permitted to have buildings upon and operate railroads, etc. over the said land; and

WHEREAS: The said party of the first part desires to retain all of the oak timber upon the said tract of land, and has reached an agreement with the said Company whereby the time in which the said timber shall be cut and removed, and exercise the said rights, privileges, licenses and easements shall be more definitely fixed, and have reached a general agreement concerning said timber and rights, privileges, licenses and easements, which shall take the place of the said conveyance of March, 29th, 1902:

NOW, THEREFORE, THIS INDENTURE, WITNESSETH: That in consideration of the above premises, and in order to carry into effect the agreement, which has been reached by the said parties, and in further consideration of the sum of SIXTY DOLLARS (\$60.00) to him

in hand paid, at and before the signing, sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, and the further consideration of the sums to be hereafter paid to him, as is hereinafter provided, the said party of the first part hereby grants, bargains, sells and conveys unto the said party of the second part, its assigns or successors, in fee simple and with general warranty, all of the timber, except oak timber, upon that certain tract of land in Nansemond County, Virginia, upon which said party of the first part resides, known as the "Goodman Place", containing eight hundred and sixty (860) acres, more or less, and bounded by the lands of T.J. Langston, Ben Morgan and William Lawrence, it being the same tract of land mentioned and referred to in the said deed of March 29th, 1902, from said Goodman to John L. Gay.

The said party of the first part covenants that he is seized of the said timber in fee simple and has a right to convey the same, that the same is free from encumbrance, and that he will execute such other and further assurances of title as may be necessary. It is understood and agreed, however, that the said Company, its assigns or successors, shall not cut any of the said timber which shall be, at the time of cutting, less than ten (10) inches in diameter across the tree stump, from outside to outside bark, and that the said Company, its assigns or successors, after having once cut over the said tract of land shall not be allowed to cut over it again, and that all timber remaining on the tract under the size above specified, after the said Company shall have finished cutting over the tract, shall revert to the owner of the land.

It is further agreed, for the consideration above and hereinafter named, that the said Company shall have twelve (12) years after the date of this deed in which to cut and remove the said timber, and if they do not cut the same within said twelve (12) years, shall have an additional three (3) years in which to cut and remove the same, provided that during the said twelve (12) years they shall pay to the said party of the first part, or to the owner of the said land at the time said payments become due; the

sum of SIXTY DOLLARS (\$60.00) per year, until the said timber shall be cut and removed, or until the end of the said twelve (12) years if the timber be not cut and removed before that time, and if the timber remains on the land after the said twelve (12) years, it shall pay to the said owner of said land SEVENTY-FIVE DOLLARS (\$75.00) per year, until the timber shall have been cut and removed.

Said payments shall be made upon demand by the said party of the first part, or the owner of said land, at the beginning of each year, after the date of this deed. Provided, however, this provision as to payment is not to be considered or construed as a condition precedent to the exercise of any of the rights and privileges under this contract or said original deed, but only as a personal covenant to make such payments.

It is further agreed that when all of said timber is cut, the annual payments shall cease and the said Company, its assigns or successors, shall only be liable for such pro rata part of the year in which the cutting is completed as the timber remains on the land, the said proportionate part to be paid before all of the timber is removed.

It is further agreed, for the consideration above named, that the said Company, its assigns or successors, shall have the right to erect such buildings on said land as they may see fit, and to build, use and operate railroad, tramways or bogy roads across the lands of the said parties of the first part, for the purpose of removing said timber or any other which they now own, or may hereafter own, or anything else which they may now or may hereafter wish to carry over said railroads, tramways, etc., and they may use such material from said land along said roads, tramways, etc., as may be necessary or convenient to build and maintain the same, said rights and privileges to continue until the 5th day of May, 1924, whether said timber be cut or not; provided, however, that if after the said timber shall be cut and removed the said Company, its assigns or successors, shall continue to exercise the rights, privileges, licenses and easements conveyed to it in this

paragraph. they shall pay to the said owner of the said land TEN DOLLARS (\$10.00) per annum from the time they have finished cutting the said timber until they cease to exercise said rights and privileges, and so notify the owner of the said land.

And the said Company, its assigns or successors, shall have the right to remove the said buildings, etc., from the said land within one (1) year after ceasing to use, occupy and operate the same.

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into this 29th of March, 1902 between Jno L. Gay of the first part and Wm G. Goodman of the second part

Witnesseth: That for value received the said Gay agrees to saw for the said Goodman 10,000 feet of lumber, when the said Goodman delivers to the said Gay the logs for sawing the same from.

And the said Goodman agrees to deliver the logs for to manufacture said lumber, at his convenience and agree to take away the lumber as soon as convenient, after it is sawed by the said Gay.

It is hereby understood and agreed that this lumber is to be sawed or manufactured for the said Goodman for and in the consideration of lumber sold to the said Gay, but that the said Goodman shall be at no expense except to cut and haul the logs to the mill and take the lumber away when cut.

In the name of God, Amen.

I, William G. Goodman, being of sound mind and memory, but considering the uncertainty of my life, do hereby make, publish, pronounce and declare this to be my last will and testament, in manner and form following, to-wit:

At my death I desire that my executors hereinafter named, shall see that my body shall have decent and respectable burial in the family grounds and that all my funeral expenses shall be paid out of the first money that shall come into their hands.

I desire that a decent wire fence shall enclose our burial ground and hereby instruct my executors to have it done, and direct that it shall be paid for out of my chattel or personal estate.

Item 1st. I give & bequeath my piano to my daughter, Sarah E. Allsbrook, to her and her heirs forever.

Item 2d. I give and bequeath unto my son, William Isaac all of the farm whereon I live that lies on the South side of the Maney's Ferry Somerton Road, bounded by said road on the north, on east by Lee's Mill Road & Frank Duke, on South by Lee's Mill run, on the west by Sally Lawrence, reaching the road at an old pine stump, containing 150 acres, more or less, to himself during his life time and at his death to decend to his heirs in fee simple.

Item 3rd. I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary L. Eure, during her life time, and at her death to her children forever all of that tract of land I bought of Thomas H. & Mary Langstan, known as the "Odom Tract" containing 283 acres by survey, more or less, lying on Somerton Creek, bounded by the Creek, Sally Lawrence, Exum Jenkin's place and the home tract.

Item 4th. I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth B. Fanny during her life time, and at her death unto her children, should she leave any, all of that tract of land known as the Sumner tract adjoining lands of Camp Mfg. Co., Gray, Sally Lawrence & Somerton Creek, lying on North side of said creek, being a part of the Exum Jenkins tract and containing 177 acres, more or less. Should my daughter Elizabeth die without children, or should her children die without issue, then and in that event, the land shall revert to my heirs, otherwise to decend to her heirs forever.

Item 5th, I give and bequeath unto my son James T. Goodman, that part of the

House side of my home farm, bounded as follows: Beginning at a newly chopped cedar tree in Somerton road a corner on Sarah E. Allsbrook, thence along Somerton Road in a west course to a hickory tree, a corner on Mary Eure, thence along Moley Eure's line a north course to the Creek, thence up the creek to where "New Ground branch" empties into the creek, Sarah E. Allsbrook's corner, thence up said branch, various courses thereof to the said Road along said line to first station, containing about 150 acres, more or less, (1/2 acre or round grave yard excepted). This includes all the houses, barns, stables on the South side, of the road & 1/2 acre of land near & covered by them & all the houses on North side, within above boundaries.

Item 6th. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Sarah E. Allsbrook, all of the balance of the home tract of land, bounded to-wit: Beginning in Somerton Road east side of dwelling at a cedar tree, corner on J.T. Goodman, thence a north course to a poplar, thence to head of New Ground branch", down said branch to Somerton Creek, up Somerton Creek to Charley Cross' line, thence to Jesse Langston line, to Somerton Road, along said road a westerly course to first station, containing 150 acres, more or less.

Item 7th. I give and bequeath unto James T. Goodman my son, all the balance of my chattel & person property except enough to pay all of my honest debts.

I leave as executors to this my last will and testament my two sons, William I. Goodman and Jesse T. Goodman and charge that this will shall be executed in its true intent and meaning, and request that they must pay all my honest debts out of my chattel estate.

And on motion of James T. Goodman one of the executors named in the said last will and testament, (it appearing that William I. Goodman, the other executor named in the said last will and testament, has departed this life) who made oath according to law, and together with H.F. Duke and T.V. Arthur, his sureties (who justified on oath as to their sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of One Thousand Dollars, with condition according to law, certificate is granted him, the said James T. Goodman, for obtaining probate of said last will and testament in due form.

And it is ordered that said bond be recorded.

This cause came on this day to be again heard upon the papers formerly read and upon the report of Bradford Kilby, Commissioner in Chancery, filed herein on January 18, 1922, and the depositions filed therewith, and upon the exceptions of complainant to said report filed herein on January 23, 1922, and was argued by counsel,

UPON CONSIDERATION WHEREOF, The Court being of the opinion that the deed from William G. Goodman to Camp Manufacturing Company, dated May 5, 1909, and recorded in the office of the Clerk of Nansemond County, Virginia, in Deed Book 68, page 8, conveyed all of the timber, except oak timber, upon the entire tract of land known as the Goodman Place, containing eight hundred sixty (860) acres, more or less, and in said deed more particularly described, including that portion of said tract lying on the South side of what is known as the Somerton Road, and being that portion of the said tract of land known as the Goodman Place which was devised by the late William G. Goodman to his son, William Isaac Goodman, for his life, with the remainder to his heirs in fee simple, and that the report of the said Commissioner to the contrary was erroneous and that the exceptions filed to the said Commissioner's report on this ground should be sustained, doth sustain the same, and doth

ADJUDGE, ORDER AND DECREE, That the said deed from William G. Goodman to Camp Manufacturing Company, dated May 5, 1909, conveyed all of the timber, except oak timber, upon the entire tract of land known as

the Goodman Place, including the timber on that portion of the said tract of land lying to the South of the Somerton Road, as well as the remainder of the said tract, subject, however, to the terms and provisions of the said deed as to the time for removal of the said timber, and otherwise, and it further appearing to the Court that the proportion of the annual payments provided in the said above mentioned deed from William G. Goodman to the various devisees under the will of the late William G. Goodman fixed by the complainant herein upon the basis of the amount of timber standing on the parcels of said tract of land devised to the various devisees, was fairly and properly fixed, as follows:

For that parcel devised to William Isaac Goodman for life, with theremainder to his heirs, .0425 of said annual payments.

For that parcel devised to Mary L. Eure for life, with the remainder to her children, .4905 of said annual payments.

For that parcel devised to James T. Goodman, .288 of said annual payments.

For that parcel devised to Sarah E. Allsbrook, .179 of said annual payments.

And it further appearing to the Court that all of the said defendants, with the exception of the heirs of the late William Isaac Goodman, have been paid in full, the amounts to which they were respectively entitled based on the above pro ration of the total annual payments up to and including the final payment to be made on May 5, 1923, in accordance with the provisions of the above mentioned deed, and have acknowledge receipt thereof and satisfaction therewith, and it further appearing to the Court that the amounts due to the heirs of the said William Isaac Goodman based on the above pro ration of the annual payments provided for in said deed, have heretofore been paid to the said heirs of the said William Isaac Goodman for the four years up to May 5, 1914, and that vouchers have been issued and delivered to the said heirs of William Isaac Goodman for the balance due them under the terms of the said deed, being the amounts due annually from May 5, 1914, to and including May 5, 1923, the final payment provided for under said deed, and it further appearing to the Court that the heirs of the said William Isaac

Goodman are satisfied with the pro ration of the annual payments as made by the complainant, provided the deed from William G. Goodman is held to have conveyed the timber on that portion of the Goodman Place owned by them, and are further satisfied to accept the said vouchers in lieu of actual cash, and it further appearing to the Court that vouchers for the amounts due the said heirs of William Isaac Goodman on account of the annual payments provided in said deed, based on the proportion hereinabove set out, for eight years beginning with the amount due on May 5, 1914, to and including the amount due on May 5, 1921, uncollected, have been filed as evidence in this cause, and that vouchers for the amounts due on May 5, 1922, and May 5, 1923, are now held by the heirs of the said William Isaac Goodman, the Court doth

ADJUDGE, ORDER AND DECREE, That the pro rata amount of the said annual payments due to the respective parties hereto, as arrived at by the complainant and hereinabove set out, be and the same is hereby approved and confirmed, and that the Clerk of this Court be and he is hereby authorized and directed to turn over and deliver to the heirs of the said William Isaac Goodman, or to S. E. Everett, their attorney, the vouchers evidencing the annual payments due to them under the said deed, from May 5, 1914, to May 5, 1921, inclusive, which vouchers have heretofore been filed in evidence in this case;

And it further appearing to the Court that there is and has been no controversy or disagreement as to the matters involved in this cause between the complainant and the defendants, other than the heirs of the late William Isaac Goodman, and that the only controversy or dispute in this cause was between the complainant and the heirs of William Isaac Goodman, in which the complainant has substantially prevailed; the Court doth

ADJUDGE, ORDER AND DECREE, That complainant recover of the heirs of the late William Isaac Goodman its costs in this behalf expended, to be taxed by the Clerk of this Court.

And nothing further remaining to be done herein, it is ordered that this cause be removed from the docket.

TO THE HONORABLE JAMES L. McLEMORE, JUDGE OF SAID COURT:

Your complainant, Camp Manufacturing Company, humbly complaining, sheweth unto the Court the following case:

1st. That your complainant, Camp Manufacturing Company, is a corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of Virginia, with its principal office located in Isle of Wight County, near the town of Franklin, Virginia.

2nd. That the late William G. Goodman, during his life time, was the owner of a certain tract of land in Nansemond County, Virginia, upon which he resided, known as the Goodman Place, containing eight hundred sixty (860) acres, more or less, and bounded by the lands of T. L. Langston, Ben Morgan and William Lawrence.

3rd. That by deed dated the fifth day of May, 1909, and duly recorded in the Office of the Clerk of Nansemond County, Virginia, in Deed Book 68, page 8, the late William G. Goodman sold and conveyed to your complainant, in fee simple, and with general warranty, all of the timber, except oak timber,

upon that certain tract of land known as the Goodman Place, containing eight hundred sixty (860) acres, more or less, and hereinabove mentioned and described, and granted to your complainant, fifteen (15) years from the date of the said deed in which to cut and remove the timber thereby conveyed, and granted to your complainant certain rights, privileges and easements in, on and over the said land, for the purpose of cutting and removing the said timber. In the said deed your complainant agreed that it would not cut any timber which should be less than ten inches (10") in diameter across the tree at the time of cutting stump from outside to outside of the bark, and that until it cut and removed the said timber it would pay to the said William G. Goodman, or to the owner of the said land at the time said payments became due, certain annual payments in said deed specified, all of which will more fully and at large appear by reference to the said deed, a certified copy of which is filed herewith marked Exhibit "A" and prayed to be taken and read as a part of this bill.

4th. That on the day of 1909, the said William G. Goodman departed this life, leaving a will dated the first day of March, 1906, which, on the eleventh day of December, 1909, was duly probated and recorded in the Office of the Clerk of Nansemond County, Virginia in Will Book , page , a certified copy of which will is filed herewith marked Exhibit "B" and prayed to be taken and read as a part of this bill.

5th. That by the terms and provisions of the said will, in paragraphs marked Item 2d, Item 3rd, Item 5th and Item 6th, the above mentioned and described tract of land was divided into parcels, and one parcel thereof, by Item 2d, was devised to William Isaac Goodman, son of William G. Goodman, for his life, with remainder to his heirs in fee simple; that another parcel thereof by Item 3rd of said will was devised to Mary L. Eure, daughter of William G. Goodman, for life, with remainder to her children in fee simple; that another parcel thereof by Item 5th was devised to James T. Goodman, son of William G. Goodman, in fee simple; and that another parcel thereof by Item 6th was devised to Sarah E. Allsbrook, daughter of William G. Goodman in fee simple.

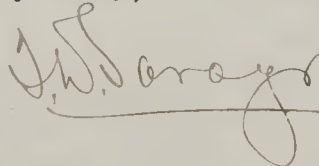

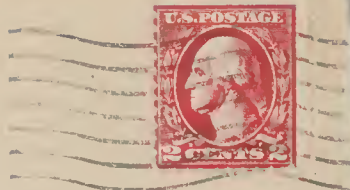

My dear Judge:

I received and have noted your favor of the 17th enclosing letter from Mr. Everett having reference to the costs in the above case.

I shall be very glad to defer to your good judgment and advise the Camp Manufacturing Company to pay the costs of this case. To be perfectly frank, as you know I usually am - probably to a fault, I would have waived the technical right to the recovery of these costs in preparing the decree but for the item of \$50.00 fee charged by the Commissioner. Altho I am personally fond of Bradford Kilby, his report in this case seemed to me to be so utterly unwarranted by the facts, and his failure to make a report on the specific questions referred to him so careless, that it went somewhat against the grain for me to pay the fee named by him. I was inclined to the view, as a practical matter, that the decree as drawn would result in our never getting back the amounts which we had deposited for the general costs which I had no idea of endeavoring to get back, and yet would relieve us from paying the Commissioner's fee. However, I am sure that Bradford did what he thought was right and should not be deprived of his fee because he did not do what I thought was right.

I do not understand from your letter whether the decree has been actually entered or not, but assume that it will be, if it has not already been, and am writing the Clerk for a statement of the costs.

Camp Manufacturing Company, a corporation, complainant in the above entitled cause, excepts to the report of Bradford Kilby, Commissioner, filed in the above entitled cause on January 18, 1922, alleging that the said report is erroneous and inadequate and should be corrected by this Honorable Court, among others, in the following particulars:

First: The said report is not responsive to the decree of this court entered herein on February 2, 1921, referring this cause to a Commissioner, in that it was directed in the said decree that the Commissioner report (a) "What amount of money is to be paid by the complainant, and to whom it shall be paid," and (b) "Ascertain the respective interests of the defendants in the said money." The said Commissioner makes no report on either of these inquiries which were the only inquiries specifically referred to the said Commissioner by said decree.

Second: That the said Commissioner erred in reporting that the land on the South side of what is called Somerton Road was not embraced in the description of and did not constitute a part of the Goodman Place containing eight hundred and sixty (860) acres, more or less, and that, therefore, the timber on such land on the South of Somerton Road was not conveyed to complainant by the deed of William G. Goodman, dated May 5, 1909, which said deed is referred to in the bill of complaint herein and certified copy thereof

filed with such bill of complaint.

Third: The Commissioner erred in not reporting that all of the timber on the entire Goodman Place of the kind and size specified in the above mentioned deed from William G. Goodman to Camp Manufacturing Company, dated May 5, 1909, was included in and conveyed by the said deed, whether such timber was situated on the North or South side of the Somerton Road.

Fourth: The Commissioner erred in reporting that Camp Manufacturing Company ever had any knowledge of or was affected by any agreement, if any, between John L. Gay and William G. Goodman, to the effect that any of the timber on this land was not included in the deed executed by Goodman to Gay therefor.

Fifth: The Commissioner erred in reporting that any agreement between the said William G. Goodman and John L. 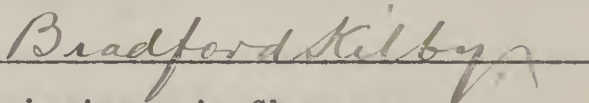

In pursuance of the decree of the Circuit Court for the County of Nansemond pronounced on the 2nd. day of February 1921, in the suit in chancery pending in said court between Camp Manufacturing Company Complainant, and Charles Surry Goodman and others, Defendants, the undersigned, Bradford Kilby, one of the Commissioners in Chancery for said Court, respectfully reports as follows:

That on the 18th. day of April 1921, your commissioner gave notice to the parties to the said suit that he would proceed at the office of S. E. Everett in the City of Suffolk, Virginia, between the hours of 10 A.M. and 5 P.M., on the 25th. day of April 1921, to make the several inquiries required by the said decree to be made by one of the Commissioners in Chancery of said Court.

That sufficient and legal service of the said notice was accepted by some of the said parties and served on others as will appear by the endorsements on said notice herewith returned.

That on the said 25th. day of April 1921, between the hours mentioned aforesaid and at the office of said S. E. Everett, your commissioner took the depositions of John L. Gay, J. Baker Holland, and and Mrs. J. H. Holland, touching said inquiries, which depositions are herewith returned as part of this report.

That the taking of depositions was adjourned from time to time, and the deposition of W.O.Bristow^{and P.D.Camp} and the further testimony of J.L. Gay and Mrs. J.H.Holland was taken at said regular adjournments.

That from the testimony of said witnesses and from information otherwise obtained, your commissioner respectfully reports as follows:

Your commissioner is of the opinion that neither William G. Goodman nor John L. Gay conveyed or intended to convey any timber to the Camp Manufacturing Company, which was or is located on the South side of the Somerton Road in Nansemond County, Virginia, and that therefore any extension money paid by said Camp Manufacturing Company under the terms of the timber deed dated May 5th. 1909 between it and William G. Goodman, to Mrs. J. H. Holland, formerly Mrs. W. I. Goodman, should be repaid to said Camp Manufacturing Company by said Mrs. J. H. Holland, together with interest from its receipt. And all extension money under said timber deed dated May 5th. 1909, which has been paid or offered to be paid to said Mrs. J. H. Holland by said Camp Manufacturing Company, should be paid to the other heirs of William G. Goodman, namely to Sarah E. Allsbrook or her heirs, James T. Goodman or his heirs, and to Mary L. Eure or her heirs, in the same proportions as they have been receiving annual payments of extension money from said Camp Manufacturing Company under said timber deed dated May 5th, 1909.

Although the deeds from W. G. Goodman and John L. Gay to the Camp Manufacturing Company recite that they convey timber on that certain tract of land in Nansemond County, Virginia, "known as the Goodman Place" containing 860 acres, more or less, and bounded by the lands of T. J. Langstun, Ben Morgan and William Lawrence, it is evident from the testimony of John L. Gay and J. Baker Holland that W. G.

Goodman intended to convey only the timber on the North side of the Somerton Road which divides the "Goodman Place". The conduct of Goodman corroborates this conclusion. On the same day that he sold the timber to Gay (March 29, 1902), he made an agreement with Gay that said Gay should cut 10,000 feet of lumber for him. The timber from which this lumber was to be sawed was cut on the South side of the Somerton Road, and was used by Goodman in building a residence on the South side of said Road, for his son, Isaac Goodman. It is plain that W. G. Goodman did not sell or convey this timber out of which the 10,000 feet of lumber was cut, to said Gay. W. G. Goodman afterwards sold the oak and cypress timber on the South side of Somerton Road to J. Baker Holland who cut and removed it. It is plain from this that W. G. Goodman was satisfied that he had conveyed no timber on the South side of Somerton Road to either Gay or the Camp Manufacturing Company. No protest was made by either Gay or the Camp Manufacturing Company about the selling, cutting and removing of any of this timber on the South side of Somerton Road.

John L. Gay testified that he took a Mr. Kellam, timber estimator and agent of the Camp Manufacturing Co. over all the timber on the ~~Goodman Place~~ Goodman Place, which lay on the North side of the Somerton Road, and showed him none on the South side of said Road, and offered to sell none on the South side of said Road. In other words, he sold to the Camp Manufacturing Company only what what he had bought from Goodman which was the timber on the North side of the Somerton Road. The testimony of John L. Gay and J. Baker Holland is not denied or contradicted in any manner, and if it is to be given credence, the conclusion is inevitable that a mistake was made in writing the deeds from Gay to Camp Manufacturing Company and from W. G. Goodman to John L. Gay ^{and from W. G. Goodman to Camp Manufacturing Co.} and this mistake should be remedied to correspond with the facts.

There is no other matter, especially stated, deemed pertinent

Mr. P. D. Camp, being duly sworn, deposes as follows:

Q. Mr. Camp, please state your name.

A. P. D. Camp.

Q. What position do you hold with the Camp Manufacturing Company.

A. President of the Company.

Q. What particular part of the business is looked after mainly by you.

A. Looking after buying of the timber, looking after the contracts and extensions and looking after the logging department in general.

Q. This is a controversy involving the tract of timber known as the "Goodman Tract" of timber. Do you remember having had any negotiations with Mr. John L. Gay, in connection with the sale of this timber.

A. Yes, Mr. Gay came to us and wanted to sell us the timber on this land, and after negotiating we agreed upon the price and the terms,

Q. Did you send to have this timber estimated before you bought it.

A. Yes, sir.

Q. Mr. Camp, I hand you a book, which purports to be the reports of estimators on various and sundry tracts of standing timber, purchased by the Camp Manufacturing Company, in which the estimates on the various tracts are made by the various estimators and signed by them. Is this book one of your original books of entry kept in your office.

A. Yes, sir.

Q. On page 23 of this book I find an estimate purporting to be John L. Gay "Tobe Goodman".

A. He was called Tobe Goodman.

Q. Will you look at that estimate and see whether that is signed by Mr. Kellam, your estimator.

A. This is the estimate on W. G. Goodman timber that was furnished us by Mr. Kellam, and which he entered in the book and was signed by him, and which we bought by.

By consent of Counsel the book which was entered. Being the original book and in constant use in the office of the Camp Manufacturing Company, an exact copy of the estimate referred to, is filed in lieu of filing the book, the copy being marked "P. D. C. #1."

Q. Mr. Camp, at the time you bought this tract of timber from Mr. Gay, did Mr. Gay, or anyone else, say anything to you about any part of the timber being excepted, or not conveyed to you.

A. He did not.

Q. Did Mr. Kellam, who made the estimate, say anything about any part of the timber being excepted.

A. No, sir, if they had, it would have been specified in the deed and from the deed you can see there was no reference whatever between Gay and ourselves, or between.....or Colonel Holland when he drew the deed. We always prefer taking a deed after a lawyer has passed on it and if there is any reservation we try to be very particular and see what is specified and what reservation is made in all of our tracts and if this had been called to my attention Colonel Holland would have been notified of the same and it would have been excepted in the contract.

Q. Did you ever hear anything about there being any claim, exception, to the timber on any part of this land.

A. Not until a few years ago.

Q. But only after the last contract you made with Mr. Goodman.

A. I cannot recall, but not until a few years ago.

Q. I hand you what purports to be some correspondence in connection with the purchase of this tract of timber, being some letters from Mr. John L. Gay to you, your replies thereto; some letters to Colonel E. E. Holland and his replies thereto; a letter to Mrs. W. I. Goodman, and a letter from Mr. S. E. Everett and your reply thereto, and ask if you will state whether they are originals and copies as they purport to be.

A. They are the letters and the copies.

Deans, one of counsel for the complainant, has made an examination of the records at the Clerk's Office of the Circuit Court of Nansemond County, Virginia, and that the records in that office show the following facts relative to the subject matter of this suit, which facts are to be used as evidence in this case, in so far as the said records are correct, and the facts are set out in exhibit filed herewith, marked "P. P. D. #1".

W . O. Bristow, being duly sworn, deposes as follows:

Q. Mr. Bristow, how old are you and where do you live.

A. 43, Franklin, Virginia.

Q. What is your business.

A. Real estate and insurance.

Q. Did you ever work for the Camp Manufacturing Company.

A. Yes, seventeen years.

Q. What capacity did you work in.

A. For about fifteen years I had charge of the land and timber department.

Q. The land and timber department meant that you had charge of the deeds and contracts.

A. Yes.

Q. When did you leave the Camp Manufacturing Co.

A. October 1st, 1915.

Q. Were you working with them during the year 1909.

A. Yes.

Q. Do you recall what is known as the Gay Timber Contract.

A. Yes.

Q. I hand you the original deed, dated the 5th day of May, 1909, executed by William G. Goodman,

as Grantor, to the Camp Manufacturing Company, and ask if you will look at it and see if you can recall having handled it.

A. This is not the original but a copy.

Q. Is it a certified copy.

A. Yes.

Q. Do you recall having handled this particular transaction.

A. Yes, I handled that transaction.

Q. This deed purports to convey to the Camp Manufacturing Company all of the timber, except oak timber, upon that certain tract of land in Nansemond County, known as the Goodman Place, containing 860 acres, more or less and bounded by the lands of Langston, Morgan and Lawrence. Do you recall whether or not the Camp Manufacturing Company had previously purchased the timber on this tract of land from J. L. Gay.

A. Yes.

Q. Will you state, please, the circumstances attending the execution of this last deed in 1909 according to the best of your ability.

A. Some time previous to the date of that deed, which I think was May 5th, 1909, Mr. Goodman came to the office of the Camp Manufacturing Company and stated that he wanted to fix his deed covering the timber he sold Gay so he could draw some interest on it just as he was drawing interest on the other piece of timber on the other side of the creek. He

called for Mr. P. D. Camp. He happened to be away at the time. When Mr. Camp returned.....

Q. Let me interrupt, if I may, was he referred to you because Mr. Camp was away.

A. Yes, when Mr. Camp was away I looked after that end of the business. When Mr. Camp returned I reported to him that Mr. Goodman had been to see him and wished to fix or change his contract so he could get interest on it. As the deed was written he was getting nothing out of it. Some few days afterwards Mr. Camp sent me to see Mr. Goodman, to see just what he wanted, and, as I recall now, he wanted to eliminate the oak timber from the deed, as he stated he had nothing for posts. I made an agreement with him to eliminate the oak and possibly some other kind of timber to make a flat for a certain number of years, by paying him \$60. per year and some few years thereafter by paying another certain amount after that. I don't know the exact amount, having not seen the deed for ten years, but I remember there was two times and two different sums. I went back and had the deed prepared by Mr. Parker, our Attorney, and went to Mr. Goodman's house, myself, with Mr. W. H. Jones, Justice of the Peace, and had the deed executed.

Q. During your conversation with Mr. Goodman when he first came to the office and then when you went back to see him to make your agreement with him, and when you went back to have the deed executed

was there anything said as to excepting any timber from any part of the land described in the deed.

A. No, sir.

Q. Did you understand you were buying all of the timber except the oak on all of the land known as the Goodman Place.

A. The same tract of land he sold to Mr. Gay.

Q. Have you ever heard of any agreement between Mr. Goodman and Mr. Gay that he did not buy all of the timber on that tract of land.

A. Never did.

Q. As far as your recollection carries you, you are the only person to talk with Mr. Goodman in the execution of this transaction in 1909.

A. I was the only one. I handled the entire transaction myself.

Q. You were with the Camp Manufacturing Company in charge of their land and timber contracts in 1904, were you not.

A. Yes.

Q. ~~Did~~ ^{Had} you ever heard that a part of the Goodman land was excepted when you bought from Gay prior to the execution of this deed.

A. I never heard of any exception until after Mr. Goodman died.

Q. As far as you know, had anybody in the office of the Camp Manufacturing Company ever heard of it.

A. The only time I ever heard of it was after he was dead. A check for \$60. was returned, possibly it was a different amount.

Until

Q. After 1909, so far as you know, did any representative of the Camp Manufacturing Company have any information or knowledge that the timber was excepted on any part of that land, except the oak timber.

A. No.

Mr. S. E. Everett, Counsel for the Defendant:

Q.
Was there any occasion for you to know this.

A. I should think so as I had charge of all that department.

Q. Who would have given you that information.

A. If there was any complaint, it would have come to our office.

Q. If there was no complaint you would not have heard it.

A. No, sir.

Q. When would they have made such complaint, if they were going to complain.

A. I should think it would have been made when the deed was signed.

Q. I should think so too, except it was buying the timber he sold Gay.

Mr. Toy D. Savage, Counsel for Complainant:

Q. If it had been understood by the Camp Manufacturing Company that the timber on any part of the land covered by the deed was excepted, would not your records show that.

A. Our record would have shown that.

Q. And they did not show any exception.

A. Not that I know of.

Mr. S. E. Everett, Counsel for the Defendants:

Q. Mr. Savage has stated that it is assumed the deed covers the entire tract of land, if that be true, if there had been no exception to the tract on the North side of the road, then you would have made no exception, would you.

A. I don't know that I understand the question.

Q. Mr. Savage has assumed the description of the Gay deed is accurate and that it covers the entire Goodman tract, but if there had been no exception to the tract on the North side of the road then you would have made no exception would you.

A. We would have eliminated any exception if we had known about it. We only bought what the Letcher Gay deed covered.

And further this deponent saith not.

Mrs. J. H. Holland, being duly sworn, deposes as follows:

Q. You are the same Mrs. J. H. Holland that testified before in this case, are you not.

A. Yes.

Q. Soon after Mr. William Goodman died, did you have any conversation with Mr. W. O. Bristow in reference to this matter.

A. In a few months and directly afterwards.

Q. Go on.

A. Mr. Bristow came to my house. I did not accept

the extension money and I stated to him, as I have stated to you before, that I did not accept it, and Mr. Bristow tells me he don't know anything about it, but if I want to arrange and set a day at Mr. Everett's office to meet Mr. Gay, he would meet us there and if there was any difference it would be between them and Mr. Gay.

Q. Did you come to my office.

A. Yes, we met there.

Q. Did Mr. Bristow come. A. Yes.

Q. Did Mr. Gay come. A. Yes.

Q. What was done then.

A. We came in the morning on that twelve train. Mr. Gay was out of town and did not come until the evening train about the time we were all going back. I had a letter from Mr. Bristow telling me he and Mr. Gay did not have a satisfactory agreement.

Q. Have you that letter of Mr. Bristow's.

A. I am not sure. I think it is lost, but it may be somewhere around the house.

(If you have that letter mail to Mr. Bradford Kilby, Commissioner in Chancery.)

Q. Did they ever come on the South side of the road to make any estimates.

Question objected to by Counsel for the Camp Manufacturing Company, as having been covered by the witness when previously on the stand.

Mr. S. E. Everett: If that is in the evidence, then I withdraw the question.

Mr. Bradford Kilby, Commissioner in Chancery:
That is in the evidence.

Mr. S. E. Everett: Then I withdraw the question.

A. If anyone has ever been over the timber before this question come up I don't know it, I mean the timber on my side of the road.

Q. When was the first time a representative of the Camp Manufacturing Company came on your side of the road to estimate that timber or look at it at any time.

A. I don't know as anyone has ever been over it. They sent Mr. Jones over there once and Mr. Jones was over there a long time.

Q. As far as you know that is the first time anyone came on your side of the road to estimate timber.

A. No, the first time that they went over there was when I refused to take the extension. I don't remember the date of the day Mr. Paul Jones first come, but it was as soon as Mr. Holland and myself was married and said that the timber did not belong to Mr. Camp but he wanted to buy it and he went over the woods that day.

Q. How long since you were married last.

A. We have been married eight years, the first day of 1914 I think.

And further this deponent saith not.

Mr. W. O. Bristow recalled by Counsel for Camp Manufacturing Company:

Q. You have heard the testimony Mrs. Holland has just given in this case.

A. Yes.

Q. Will you state please when you went to see Mrs. Holland and why.

A. As I recall I was sent there to tender her her part of the extension money.

Q. Why did you make that ^{tender}~~extension~~.

A. It was made on legal advice.

Q. Why did you come on legal advice.

A. Mrs. Holland had conversed with Mr. Everett and he wrote our attorney, or us, and our attorney had advised us to ^{tender}~~extend~~ the money to her.

Q. That was the reason you went.

A. Yes, on account of that I went to see her and agreed to meet her at Mr. Everett's office to talk it over.

Q. Did you tell her whatever Mr. Everett said would be all right with us.

A. No, sir, I could not have done that.

Q. Did you tell her the difference would be between Mr. Gay and the Camp Manufacturing Company.

A. I do not recall anything of the kind.

Mr. Everett, Counsel for the defendants:

Q. You did come here on that day to meet Mrs. Holland and Mr. Gay.

A. Yes.

Q. Did you write her a letter, to Mrs. Holland.

A. I do not recall that I did, if she has it, it is certainly evidence.

Q. Could you get a copy of that letter from the Camp Manufacturing Company's files.

A. I do not know, if the letter was written it should be there.

(If you can get a copy, mail to Mr. Bradford Kilby, Commissioner in Chancery.)

And further this deponent saith not.

THIS DEED, Made this 29 day of March 1902, by and between W.G.Goodman of the County of Nansemond in the State of Virginia, grantor and party of the first part and John L.Gay grantee and party of the second part,

WITNESSETH: That for and in consideration of the premises and the sum of \$450.00 cash in hand paid at and before the signing and sealing of this deed, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, and in further consideration of the sum of \$450.00 to be paid to said grantor by the grantee, when the timber hereinafter to be described is begun to be cut, and the remainder of to be paid when the timber is one-half cut, the said party of the first part does hereby grant, bargain and sell unto the said party of the second part, with general warranty the following property, situated in the County of Nansemond to-wit: All of the standing timber down to 11 inches inches on the stump inches from the ground at the time of cutting, on that certain tract of land known as the Goodman place, bounded by the lands of T.J.Langston, Ben Morgan, Williams Lawrence and containing 860 acres, more or less.

It is covenanted and agreed between the party that the said grantee, his heirs and assigns shall have a right-of-way through and across the said tract of land above described, and any other lands owned by said parties of the first part, for the purpose of cutting and removing the timber cut from said land by said party of the second part on his agents or assigns, or for the purpose of cutting or removing timber from any other tract of land purchased or controlled by the said party of the second part.

And said party of the first part hereby grants to said party of the second part, and any person or body corporate his lawful successors or assigns the right-of-way through said tract of land and all lands owned by said party of the first part for a permanent railway to be owned and operated by any person or body corporate to whom said party of the second part shall assign the right hereby specially granted. And also the right to cut such small trees for ties or other construction along the right-of-way as may be required.

And said parties of the first part hereby covenant with said party of the second part and his assigns to pay all levies, taxes, assessments and dues upon the land and timber herein described during the continuance of this contract.

THIS DEED, Made this 26th day of July, in the year one thousand nine hundred and four between John L.Gay and Georgie O.Gay, his wife, of the first part, and the Camp Manufacturing Company, a Corporation, of Franklin, Va., of the second part-

WITNESSETH: That in consideration of the sum of Twelve Hundred (\$1200.00) Dollars the said parties of the first part do grant unto the said party of the second part with GENERAL WARRANTY, all of the standing timber down to eleven inches on the stump on that certain tract of land known as the Goodman Place, in Nansemond County, Va., bounded and described as follows: By the lands of T.J.Langston, Ben Morgan, William Lawrence and others, and containing eight hundred and sixty acres, more or less (and the same is sold in gross and not by the acre), it being the same timber bought of William G.Goodman by John L.Gay by deed dated Mch. 29th, 1902, and recorded in D.B. No.53, page 228 in Nansemond County Clerk's Office.

And the grantors herein covenant with the grantee that it shall have the same rights of way over said land as are secured to the grantor by covenants contained in the deed above mentioned from William G.Goodman, respecting the same. Reference is hereby made to said deed for a fuller description of said covenants relating to said rights-of-way.

And the parties of the first part hereby grant, accord and assure unto the said party of the second part and its assigns the full term of five (5) years within which to cut and remove the timber hereby conveyed, said term to commence from the time said party of the second part begins to manufacture said timber into wood or lumber.

Whereas none of the above mentioned purchase price of Twelve Hundred Dollars has been paid to the grantor, the said John L.Gay, there is expressly reserved on the face of the conveyance a vendors lien for the whole of the said purchase price above set forth, upon the property herein conveyed.

It being the purpose of this deed to convey the standing timber above described to the grantee herein, and to adopt certain covenants respecting rights-of -way contained in the deed to said Gay, allowing certain time within which to cut said timber, all of which are secured to said Gay by the deed from said Goodman, and no more.

And a Vendor's lien is reserved on said property to secure the payment of the said purchase price.

The said grantors covenant that they have the right to convey the said timber to the grantee; that they have done no act to encumber the said timber, that the grantee shall have quiet possession of the said timber free from all encumbrances, save the lien reserved herein, and that, the said parties of the first part, will execute such further assurances of the said timber as may be requisite.

Mr. John L. Gay, being duly sworn, deposes as follows:

Q. Give your name, age, residence and occupation.

A. John L. Gay, age 61. I live in Norfolk you might say, Norfolk and Ocean View, my office is 73 Granby Street.

Q. Mr. Gay, you have lived in Suffolk.

A. Yes.

Q. Were you ever in the lumber business in Suffolk.

A. 43 years.

Q. Did you buy a tract of lumber from William G. Goodman, known as Tobe Goodman, on March 29th, 1902.

A. Yes, but I don't remember the date any more than the record of the paper.

NOTE. Deed, dated the 29th day of March, 1902, and recorded the 31st day of March, 1902, in Deed Book 53, Page 228, between William G. Goodman and John L. Gay, is introduced as evidence in this case, marked "Exhibit A".

Q. Mr. Gay, you afterwards sold this to the Camp Manufacturing Company, did you not?

A. Yes, sir.

NOTE. Deed from John L. Gay to the Camp Manufacturing Company, dated the 26th day of July, 1904,

and recorded in Deed Book 54, Page 577, on the 8th day of September, 1905, is herewith introduced as evidence in this case and marked "Exhibit B".

Q. Mr Gay, will you state whether you sold the same property as you bought.

Question objected to by Mr. Savage, Counsel for the Complainant, on the ground that the deeds are the best evidence of what was bought and sold, and the terms of the deeds cannot be controverted or ascertained by parole evidence.

Q. I asked you did you sell the same property that you bought from William Goodman.

A. Yes, from what my deed said, the same that I bought.

Q. Will you describe the land that the timber was on that your deed covered.

Question objected to on the ground that the deed speaks for itself.

A. Yes, sir, I went up to see Mr. Goodman about it and we went over the piece of timber that I bought from him, and the timber that I did buy was on the North side of the County Road leading from Somerton to Factory Hill. We went over this piece of timber on two different occasions, but I did not buy the piece of timber on the South side of the said road as that was not mentioned in the purchase.

Q. Will you start now, Mr. Gay, where you started on that day and state what land you went around.

Question objected to on the ground that the deed speaks for itself and cannot be varied or contradicted by parole evidence, and on the further ground that information sought to be elicited from the memory of this witness is immaterial and irrelevant.

S. E. Everett, Counsel for the Isaac Goodman heirs, states that it is absolutely necessary to go over the boundaries in order to know what is included in the deed. You cannot look at the record or the deed and tell if this was the tract of land that was sold to the Camp Manufacturing Company as bounded by Lawrence and others.

A. When we started to look at the timber, we went by the road going to Factory Hill. We traveled until we got to a ravine and run of the branch. It looked like the run of a mill down there, and Mr. Tobe Goodman told me that was the line on the West. We then turned to our right and following that run, or branch, around going North until we struck Somerton creek, and then we followed the line East as far as it ran that way, in that direction, then we struck another line on the East running South between the same road that we traveled that we first struck, that is, the road leading from Somerton to Factory Hill. Then we went through this piece of timber backwards and forwards from the back of the field to the back line of said piece of timber, in order to get an idea of what there was on the place.

Q. In addition to the money, \$450.00 mentioned in the deed, that you paid for the tract of timber was there any other consideration.

Question objected to by Mr. Savage, Counsel for the Complainant, because the Deed speaks for itself and cannot be contradicted or varied by parole evidence and because the evidence from the memory of this witness, sought to be elicited, is irrelevant and not material and not pertinent to the question at controversy, or the deeds to be considered in this litigation. To save repetition, it is agreed between counsel that the objection stated now shall apply to all questions heretofore and hereafter asked in connection with this general suggestion, without the necessity of the objection being stated each time.

A. I was to get 10,000 feet of lumber. He was to pay the hauling to the mill and take it away after it was manufactured.

Q. What was this to be cut for.

A. He wanted it cut to build a house, so he told me, for his son, Isaac Goodman, as well as I remember the name.

Q. Where was this house to be built.

A. Mr. Tobe Goodman told me that it was to be built on the South side of the County Road.

Motion made to strike out the answer, by the Counsel for the Complainant, Mr. Savage, because in addition to the objection before made, it is purely heresay.

Mr. Everett, Counsel for the Goodman Heirs:

It is a statement by the Grantor to the witness at the time that the deed was executed to Mr. Gay, for the timber.

Mr. Savage, Counsel for the Camp Manufacturing Company:

It is clearly heresay.

Mr. Kilby, Commissioner in Chancery: My ruling would be against that.

Q. Mr. Gay, I hand you a contract, dated the 29th day of March, 1902, between yourself and William G. Goodman, executed by yourself and William G. Goodman, which I am introducing as evidence and mark "Exhibit C". Is this your contract with

Mr. William, or Tobe Goodman.

Objection by Mr. Savage, Counsel for the Complainant, on the ground that the paper has no connection and is irrelevant and immaterial.

A. Yes.

Q. It states in here, just as you have stated, that you were to saw 10,000 feet of timber for the said Goodman, and he was to deliver the logs without any expense to you at your mill.

A. Yes, sir.

Q. Where was this 10,000 feet of timber.

A. On the piece of land on the South side of the said County Road.

Q. Was that lumber gotten from that land and sawed according to contract.

A. I could not tell you where the lumber come from but I sawed the lumber, or payed to have it sawed.

Q. Who cut this lumber for you.

A. Mr. Baker Holland.

Q. Do you know whether it was gotten from the tract that you had or not.

A. I don't know.

Q. Was it cut before you sold this lumber to the Camp Manufacturing Company.

A. Yes, sir.

Q. When you sold this lumber to the Camp Manufacturing Company, did you go over it with their representative.

A. Yes, sir.

Q. If it had been cut from that tract would you not have discovered it at that time.

A. I would.

Q. When you took the representative of the Camp Manufacturing Company did you show him anything on the South side of the road.

A. No, I showed him the timber on the North side, my side.

Q. Do you know the names of the parties adjoining the land.

A. I don't, except what Mr. Goodman told me.

Q. What was that.

Question objected to by Mr. Savage, Counsel for the Complainants, as being purely heresay.

S. E. Everett, Counsel for the Defendants, replied:

It is necessary to ask these questions to identify the property sold in the deed.

Mr. Kilby, Commissioner in Chancery:

That is purely heresay evidence.

Mr. Everett: Go on and answer.

A. He told me that when you got to this branch going West from his house on the County Road, that this land was bounded by Mr. Lawrence.

Q. Do you remember his first name.

A. No, sir, I do not.

Q. Who was next.

A. I don't remember.

Q. On the East.

A. A man by the name of Langston.

Q. Mr. Gay, as I understand it from you, that you never bought any timber from Mr. William G. Goodman on the South side of the road, and you never undertook to describe anything on the South side of the road in your deed.

A. Yes, sir.

And further this deponent saith not.

- Q. Mr. Gay, when you testified in this case before, you stated that you went over the Goodman timber with a representative of the Camp Manufacturing Company. Will you please state who that representative was?
- A. It was Mr. Kellam. I do not remember whether I made this statement before when examined because I just could not collect my ideas or thoughts together to determine what man it was. It has come to me that it was one Mr. Kellam. That is he told me that was his name.
- Q. Did you ever have any conversation on the subject of the sale of this timber with Mr. Jones who works for Camp Manufacturing Company?
- A. I do not remember ever having any.
- Q. So far as you can recall did you ever have any conversation with any other representative of Camp Manufacturing Company than the man Mr. Kellam whom you just mentioned?
- A. Not to my recollection.
- Q. Who was Mr. Kellam? What did he do?
- A. He represented to me as being a lumber estimator for the Camp Manufacturing Company.
- Q. He estimated this particular piece of lumber?
- A. Yes sir. He went over this timber with me.
- Q. Did you make any trade with Mr. Kellam for the timber?
- A. No sir.
- Q. You afterwards made a trade with somebody else, after he had examined the timber?
- A. I afterwards made a trade with Camp Manufacturing Company, which the deed will speak for itself. My experience for years is that the man who goes out and estimates timber for a company never gives any information or his ideas to the man who wants to sell.
- Q. Do you remember who drew the deed from you to Camp Manufacturing Company?
- A. Mr. E. E. Holland, as well as I remember.
- Q. Do you remember whether Mr. Holland got his information from which he drew this deed from the Clerk's office, or whether you took him your original deed?
- A. I do not remember.
- Q. Do you know whether this Mr. Kellam to whom you refer, is now living or dead?
- A. Well, I think that Mr. Kellam is dead, but I do not know that.

John L. Gay, recalled:

Q. When you sold to the Camp Manufacruing Company, please state whether you made known to them, or to their representative, what you were selling, and did you show the line of the tract of lumber that you sold them.

A. I did. When a lumberman goes to examine a tract of lumber the first thing he wants to know is the lines, that is, the boundaries and then he uses his own judgment in making the estimate. In this case, after I told him that I owned a tract of lumber between the the road and the creek, I went over it with him, Camp's representative, just about like I have described that Mr. Goodman and myself went over it, that is, we atarted on the line with the run of the branch, or the run of the mill pond and turned to our right and followed the run around, going North until we struck Somerton Creek and then we followed the run East as far as the line that way, along the creek, then we came to another line on the East, known as the Langston Line and followed that line South to the main road that we first struck, that is the road leading from Somerton to Factory Hill. This was showing him the lines and then we went over this piece of timber backwards and forwards from the back of the field to the back line of said timber. Yes, sir, I bought on the North side of that road and did not buy any more and did not know anything about any other and that is exactly what I showed the Camp Manufacturing Company's representative and that is what I sold to them, nothing more nor less.

And further this deponent saith not.

Mrs. J. H. Holland, being duly sworn, deposes as follows:

Q. Give your name, age, residence and occupation.

A. Mrs. J. H. Holland, 49, Nansemond County, housekeeper.

Q. Mrs. Holland, who was your first husband.

A. Mr. William G. Goodman's son, Mr. Isaac Goodman.

Q. Where do you live, Mrs. Holland,

A. I live on the same tract of land on the South side of the road.

Q. How long have you been living there.

A. Since 1907.

Q. Were you living there when Mr. William G. Goodman sold the lumber to John L. Gay.

A. No.

Q. Where were you living then.

A. On the North side of the road.

Q. When did you make the change.

A. When was this lumber sold, I disremember.

Mr. S. E. Everett: 1902.

A. (cont.) Then that would make it about 1907.

Q. Why did you wait until 1907 to move.

Question objected to because it is immaterial and irrelevant, by Mr. Savage, Counsel for the Complainants.

A. Well, his mother wanted his father for to build of a house where we were living for him and Mr. Goodman said he did not have anyone to build it and rather than for him to move he would give him the South side of the road, and

give him the South side of the road, and give him so much money to equip the building and Mr. Gay was going to have this mill up there and cut the lumber on our side, and-

Motion made by Mr. Savage, Counsel for the Complainant, to strike out the answer because in addition to objection made to the question it is heresay.

Q. Did you say Mr. Gay cut some lumber, where was the lumber cut from.

Question objected to because it is immaterial and irrelevant, and not pertinent to the issue in this case, and it is agreed by counsel that this objection shall apply to any question along this line, without being repeated each time.

A. On the South side of the road.

Q. Do you know how much he cut.

A. 10,000 feet.

Q. What was done with this 10,000 feet.

A. He built the house I live in with it, and it was hauled to the mill by Mr. Clay Elam.

Q. These are matters of your own knowledge that you say.

A. Yes, sir, I know this.

Q. Did you ever see Mr. Gay, or any of the Camp Manufacturing Company's representatives down there looking over and examining said tract of land on the North side of the road.

A. Yes, sir, I think I know about each time they went in there.

Q. Did you ever see them go over the road to the other side where you live.

A. No, sir, not until after Mr. Goodman's death.

Q. About what year.

A. He died in 1910. During the Xmas holiday, I don't know exactly what day Camp sent his men there to go over the woods.

Q. Now, what did they do when they came there.

A. They met my little boy at his grandfather's gate, and asked him if he knew where the lands were, and taken him over the woods, or a part of the woods, until he got tired. That was the first and only time I ever knew them to go on that side of the road.

Q. Then about Xmas, 1910, they did go over on the South side of the road to look at the timber over there.

A. Yes, sir.

Cross examination by Mr. Savage, Counsel for the Camp Manufacturing Company.

Q. Mrs. Holland, Your former husband, William Isaac Goodman, died on, or about February 1st, 1908.

A. Yes.

Q. He left surviving him, children by you, six in number.

A. Yes, sir.

Q. Their names and ages were as follows, were they not: Charles Surry Goodman, born July 26, 1893, Sarah Goodman Parker, Born September 9, 1894, Frank Goodman, born August 12, 1897, Agnes Goodman Ashton, born October 1, 1898, Howard Gregory Goodman, born March 12, 1904, and William Isaac Goodman, born March 22, 1908.

A. He was born after his father's death.

Q. That is a correct statement of the children left by William Isaac Goodman, and their respective ages, is it not.

A. Yes, sir.

Q. Mrs. Mary E. Eure is a sister of your former husband.

A. Yes.

Q. She has four children.

A. Yes, sir.

Q. And their respective names and ages are as follows:

Sallie E. Sawyer, born September 26, 1895,

Essie E. Sawyer, born August 21, 1897,

Genevieve Sawyer, born July 22, 1900,

Carlyle Eure, born June 22, 1906.

A. The names are correct, I don't know about the ages.

Q. The ages indicated are approximately correct.

A. I suppose so.

Q. James T. Goodman is also dead, is he not.

A. Yes, sir.

Q. He is survived by his wife, Alice G. Pierce, whose husband is now W. J. Pierce.

A. Yes.

Q. James T. Goodman left surviving him also four children, and their names and ages are as follows:

John Thomas Goodman, born April 26, 1902,

Lizzie Emma Goodman, born January 14, 1905,

William Harry Goodman, born March 8, 1907, and

Sallie Rebecca Goodman, born January 22, 1910.

A. Yes, sir.

Q. Sallie E. Allsbrook is also another heir of William G. Goodman.

A. Yes, sir.

Q. Mrs. Goodman, after the death of your husband, William Isaac Goodman, you qualified as Guardian of your children.

A. No, sir.

Q. Did anybody qualify as their guardian.

A. No, sir.

Q. After the death of Mr. William G. Goodman did the Camp Manufacturing Company ever pay you any money on account of any timber.

A. They sent some interest money.

Q. Which you accepted as guardian for your children.

A. No, sir, I did not, I meant I was not the children's guardian. Mr. Camp sent this interest for \$10.20. I returned it two or three times, until the last time and I thought it might be that I was entitled to it, but I wrote to him concerning this and told him I was not entitled to it, but he said I was and kept on saying so and I took it, but the others he sent are all like he sent them to me, because I thought I ought not to use them.

Q. You mean you used one of these checks.

A. Yes, a check for \$10.20.

Voucher dated April 5th, 1913, made payable to Mrs. William Isaac Goodman, Guardian, and said to be "for extention from May 5, 1910, to May 5, 1914, for four years as per deed from William G.

Goodman to the Camp Manufacturing Company, dated May 5th, 1909." in the sum of \$10.20, which voucher is signed in acknowledgment of the amount by Mrs. William Isaac Goodman, and shows on its face to have been paid through the bank on which it was drawn, is offered in evidence and filed as "Exhibit 1."

Q. You mean the subsequent checks he sent you you did not use.

A. Yes, sir.

Q. Where are these checks now. Would you be kind enough to bring these checks down to Mr. Everett, your counsel, so that he may file them.

A. I have them right here and will hand them to you to be filed in the case. They are right here in my hand-bag.

Q. We offer the vouchers handed to us by witness as evidence, and which are filed as "Exhibit 2". Mrs. Holland, you say that in 1902 you lived on the William G. Goodman place.

A. Yes, sir.

Q. On the part of the place, I understood you to say, which lies North of the Somerton Road, and in 1907 you moved over across the Somerton Road to another part of the William G. Goodman farm.

A. Yes, sir.

Q. The place to which you moved was also a part of the William G. Goodman farm.

A. Yes, sir.

Q. Do you know about how many acres of this farm lie to the South of the Somerton Road.

A. 850, more or less.

Q. I think you misunderstood my question. There is 860 acres, more or less, of the home farm. What I mean is, how many acres lie South of the road.

A. There is 850 the will says.

Q. You still do not understand my question. How many acres are there on that part of the land where you now live, as I understand.

A. Well, about 150.

Q. Whose lands adjoin the land on which you now live,

A. Mr. Frank Rountree, and the Jenkins land, and William Lawrence.

Q. Does the land of any other persons except the ones that you have named, adjoin the 150 acres of land on which you now live.

A. It is bounded on the West by William E. Lawrence, and there is a Jenkins tract, I am not sure, across the mill run, and Mr. Frank Duke's which is now owned by Mr. Frank Rountree. They is all on my side.

Q. Mr. William G. Goodman lived on the North side of the Somerton Road, did he not.

A. Yes.

Q. The whole 850 acres of land was known as the Goodman place was it not.

A. Yes, sir.

Q. Did James T. Goodman get in the will of William G. Goodman the land across the road from where you now live.

A. One-half of the acres, where the land was, he got that.

Q. On the North side of the Road, how much.

A. He got his part, I don't know how much it was.

Q. The part which was devised to James T. Goodman, and the part which was devised to your former husband, William Isaac Goodman, together constituted what was known as the house farm of William G. Goodman.

A. The part that James heired was the house part.

Q. In other words he divided what was commonly known as the house farm between James T. Goodman and William Isaac Goodman.

A. I don't know whether you would call it the house farm or not. There are only two parts of this that I know anything about, that is the home tract and the part known as the Tom Langston tract, owned now by J. C. Eure.

Q. So that William G. Goodman's farm of around 860 acres was made up of two tracts of land, one known as the Langston Tract containing about 283 acres, and the other known as the home tract containing the rest of the acres, is that right.

A. I suppose so.

Q. And the piece on which you now live on the South side of the Somerton road is a part of the larger, or home tract.

A. Yes, sir.

Q. Mrs. Holland, at the time which you mentioned, about Xmas 1910, I think you said that representatives of the Camp Manufacturing Company came down to go over this timber and went over the timber on the land where you now live on the

South side of the road. After that were you not furnished with a proportionate division of the amount of the annual payment, including all the different

A. If I am not mistaken his men was down during Xmas holidays, 1910, and sometime in the summer, it might have been September, these men come up there to estimate the timber and after they went back, I received this statement from them.

Q. You have handed me a statement of the proportionate division made out, will you submit that in evidence and file, marked "Exhibit 3".

A. I will.

Q. Mrs. Holland, it was your understanding, was it not, that the division of the amount payable was bases on the estimated amount of timber on each tract.

A. I don't know anything about the understanding, I only know they sent me that statement.

Q. That statement was satisfactory to the other owners.

A. I don't know anything about them, it was not satisfactory to me.

Q. The reason, as I understand it, is that your present contention is that the timber on the land that you now live on was not sold.

A. If it was sold nobody knew anything about it.

Q. Do you know if Mr. Eure was down there when the timber was estimated.

A. I don't know.

Q. This proportionate division was made after Mr. Eure was there, and he took the matter up

with the others.

A. I suppose so.

Mr. Everett:

Q. Did Mr. Tobe Goodman sell any timber off the tract that you now live on before Mr. Gay sold the timber to the Camp Manufacturing Company.

Question objected to by Mr. Savage, Counsel for the Complainants as being rather immaterial.

A. If I am not mistaken, he sold the oak timber to Mr. Baker Holland, and also the cypress timber, or the best of the timber.

Q. And that was before the Camp Manufacturing Company bought the timber from Mr. Goodman.

A. If I am not mistaken.

Q. Did he sell any other timber that you know. Was there any pine timber sold off there.

Question objected to by Mr. Savage, Counsel for the Complainants, on the grounds that it is immaterial and irrelevant and that contract for the sale so made is the best evidence.

A. Well, Mr. Bun Parker cut a bill of lumber.

Q. As far as you know there was no written contract for this sale.

A. No, sir.

Q. Then, as I understand it, the oak and cypress was sold to Mr. J. B. Holland before Mr. Gay sold any timber to the Camp Manufacturing Company.

A. If I make no mistake.

Q. And the pine timber was sold to Mr. Parker after the Camp Manufacturing Company had bought from Mr. Gay.

A. Yes, sir.

And further this deponent saith not.

Mr. J. B. Holland, being duly sworn, deposes as follows:

Q. Give your name, age, residence and occupation.

A. J. Baker Holland, 56, Suffolk, merchant.

Q. Mr. Holland, did you formerly live in Nansemond County before you moved to Suffolk.

A. No, sir, I was raised in Nansemond County, went to Gates County and lived 17 years, it was from there I moved to Suffolk.

Q. Please state if Mr. Gay ever employed you to saw any lumber for Mr. William G. Goodman.

Question objected to by Mr. Savage, Counsel for the Complainants, for reasons stated above to previous objections, and it is understood that the same objections apply to all questions of this character.

A. Yes, sir, we cut him 10,000 feet of lumber.

Q. Where did you get this lumber.

A. On the South side of the road on the Goodman tract, where William Isaac Goodman lived and died.

Q. Where did you deliver this lumber.

A. He hauled it to the mill and sawed it. Mr. Isaac Goodman carried it back home.

Q. Do you know of your own knowledge that it came off the ^{South}side of the road, the said Isaac Goodman land, that he lived on.

A. Yes, sir, we hauled the timber and hauled it off there.

Q. Did you ever cut any more lumber on the South side of the road.

A. I cut the oak and cypress.

Q. Do you know whether that was before or after Mr. Gay sold to the Camp Manufacturing Company.

A. After.

Q. Do you know if there was any other lumber cut off the tract.

A. Nothing as I know of.

Q. You don't remember anything about Mr. Bun Parker cutting some.

Question objected to by Mr. Savage, Counsel for the Complainants.

A. He may have cut some.

Q. How do you know it.

A. I really don't know.

Q. Did you buy any oak lumber from Mr. Goodman on the other side of the road.

A. Bought it, hauled it myself and sawed it.

Q. Was that before or after Mr. Gay sold to the Camp Manufacturing Company.

A. After Mr. Gay sold to them.

Q. Do you know anything about whether Mr. William Goodman included the tract of land where Isaac Goodman lived or the timber on the tract of land where Isaac Goodman lived in the sale to Mr. John L. Gay, or not.

A. I don't know anything only hearsay.

I heard it was the other side of the road.

Q. Did you ever have any conversation with William G. Goodman about that.

Question objected to by Mr. Savage, Counsel for the Complainants, as purely hearsay.

A. Well, of course I did. I had a talk with him on the buggy and carried him to see Mr. Camp.

Q. Well, what did he say.

A. I don't know what happened down there after he had seen Mr. Camp I thought from the conversa-

tion that they renewed the contract and got the oak timber so I could buy it and I did buy it.

Q. Did you hear Mr. Goodman say which side of the road was sold, or whether both sides of the road were sold.

A. I never heard one side or another, but if you want to know which side was sold, the North side was sold.

Q. I understand you to say that he said he would sell you that on the South side.

A. He had already sold me that before I went with him to see the Camps.

Q. Mr. Goodman told you, as I understand it, that he did not sell the timber on the South side of the road to Mr. Gay, or anybody else.

Mr. Savage: Counsel further objects to such flagrant leading questions and putting words into the witness's mouth.

Mr. S. E. Everett: There has been so much confusion by interruption from the Counsel for the Camp Manufacturing Company that Counsel simply repeated so we could clearly understand what Mr. J. B. Holland said and not doing it as a leading question.

A. Yes.

Q. Will you please state the names of the parties whose lands adjoin the Isaac Goodman tract of land on the South side of the road.

A. Jenkins and Duke, Rountree now owns that. I don't know the owner of the Jenkins land, and William Lawrence is on the West end.

Q. Are you familiar with this tract.

A. This tract on the South side, yes, sir, I reckon there is not twenty feet that I have not been over on both sides.

Q. I understand that you were there for some reason. recently.

A. No, sir, I just went over it when I went to buy it. I was there when they surveyed it week before last, last Tuesday one week. This was the land between the Duke and the Goodman land but did not go around the Goodman land.

Q. Does the William Lawrence land extend on both sides of this Somerton Road.

A. Yes, sir.

Q. On which side of the road is the largest part of the William Lawrence tract.

A. On the North side as you call it.

Q. About how far would you think that the South side touches the William Lawrence tract of land.

A. I suppose 150 or 200 yards it runs down there.

Cross Examination by Mr. Savage, Counsel for
the Camp Manufacturing Company.

Mr. Savage: Without waiving the objections made as to the testimony of this witness, counsel for the complainants asks these questions:

Q. Mr. Holland, you are the husband of Mrs. Holland, the widow of William Isaac Goodman, who testified in this case, are you not.

A. No, sir, I am no relation whatever.

Q. When was it you cut the 10,000 feet of pine.

A. I don't know how long it has been, but it was a short time after they bought it, after Gay and Carpenter bought it.

Q. Do you think it was subsequent or prior to the year 1904.

A. What.

Q. Do you think it was subsequent or prior to the year 1904.

A. I can't tell you exactly when it was.

Q. I understood you to state that you bought the oak and cypress timber on the land on the South side of the Somerton road.

A. Yes.

Q. When was that bought.

A. It was long about the time somewhere when I took Mr. Goodman down to Camps.

Q. And that was about the year 1909.

A. I never took no notice of any dates. I just know I bought that timber.

Q. You took him down to Camps in order for him to arrange so he could sell you the ^{oak}timber and you say they did arrange and when you came back he sold you the oak timber.

A. Yes.

Q. How much cypress did you get off of this land.

A. I don't know how much cypress I got. I cut the cypress and oak and got some tie timber too.

Mr. Everett: Counsel wishes to see if his understanding is clear.

Q. I understand that before you took Mr. Goodman and went to see the Camp Manufacturing Company, that you bought oak and cypress on the South side of the road, from Mr. W. G. Goodman.

A. Yes, sir, tie timber.

Q. I don't remember whether you say you had cut any at that time.

A. I had cut some, I don't remember how much, on that side of the road.

Q. You mean which side of the road now.

A. The South side.

Mr. Savage:

Q. What size was this timber.

A. From 14 to 16 inches. I cut about all of this that was there to cut.

Q. On the South side you cut the small stuff.

A. I cut all of the small stuff that we could get, only the big cypress I did not cut.

And further this deponent saith not.

Gentlemen:

Referring to yours of a few days ago with reference to title of William G. Goodman to lands in this County, beg to report as follows:

It seems, from the records, that William G. Goodman owns the two following tracts or pieces of land, which Mr. Gay tells me constitute the lands covered by his deed:

1st. The Odom tract of land, bounded by the lands of H. J. March, William G. Goodman and the Somerton Creek and containing 283 acres by survey.

2nd. A tract of land in Hansemond County, Virginia, containing 583 acres, more or less, adjoining the lands of P. H. Lee, D. L. Sumner and others, and the Somerton Creek.

Both of these pieces of land seem to have been originally a part of the old Exum Jenkins tract of land. The 583 acre tract of land seems from the records, to have been owned by Lucretia J. Goodman, but I find on record a deed to her for only one half thereof. Lucretia J. Goodman, it appears, died without a will, and I am informed that Sarah E. Goodman was her daughter, and, as such, became entitled to the property. Sarah E. Goodman, by will on record, in Will Book No. 4 page 647, in Hansemond County Court Clerk's Office, devised to William G. Goodman all the real estate inherited from her father Isaac Langston and Lucretia J. Goodman. It is believed that the 583 acre tract of land above described is the land referred to. The will fails to give any description of the property.

The 583 acre tract of land was conveyed to William G. Goodman by E. A. Langston and husband. Mrs. Langston obtained title by deed from John A. March.

I find no judgments or deeds of trust on the property, and, if my information as to facts shown by records is true, it would appear that the title is clear.

The destruction of the Clerk's Office by fire, I have no doubt, renders it impossible to make a more thorough search, as some of the deeds were probably destroyed at that time.

I would suggest that your Mr. P. D. Camp, who is probably familiar with the boundaries, might examine the above descriptions for the purpose of ascertaining whether or not they cover the land intended. Mr. Gay has brought me the enclosed deed which I beg to hand you herewith for examination and return, in accordance with your agreement with him, if satisfactory.

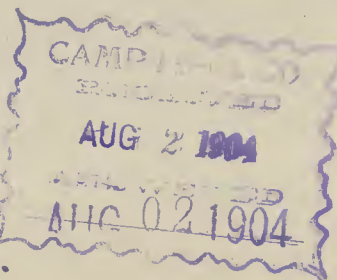

I have yours of August 2nd and note contents. I think it would be well for Mr. Goodman, if he has any old deeds in his possession, to have them re-recorded. Mr. Goodman may have been in adverse possession of this property for a sufficient length of time to give him a good title, and it is entirely possible for him to have a good title to this property even though the records do not disclose it. The records show, as my former letter states, his title to a part of the property. As to the other part, in order to reach a conclusion, I was forced to rely, in connection with the records, upon information as to his possession of the property for a very long time and it being charged to him on the land books for a number of years.

It might be well for you to make some inquiry of parties living in Mr. Goodman's neighborhood with reference to his title to this property; as to how long he has been in possession of same; and as to whether or not his title has ever been disputed. Of course, there is always some risk in taking a deed from a party when the records do not show that he has a good title, but, if my information in this case is true, I do not believe you are running much risk in this particular matter.

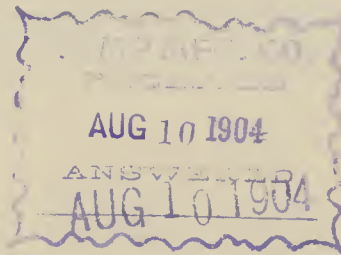

Dear sir:

We have yours of the 2nd, and note that Mrs. J. H. Holland, who was formerly Mrs. Wm. I. Goodman, has been to see you with reference to the timber on the land which she now occupies, which was formerly the property of her first husband, which is located near Somerton, Va., and we note that she claims that we never bought this timber. Mrs. Holland wrote us sometime ago that she owned some timber adjoining the Goodman tract and wanted to sell it to us. We sent our Mr. Jones over there to look at it, and he came back with the statement that the timber she wanted to sell was a part of the William G Goodman tract, which we already owned and we so notified Mrs. Holland. In order that your mind may be clear on this question, we are going to give you a little history of the transaction:

By deed dated March 29th 1902 W. G. Goodman conveyed to John L. Gay the timber on what is known as the "Goodman" place in Nansemond County, Virginia, adjoining the land of T. J. Langsotn, Ben Morgan, W. N. Lawrence, and others, containing 860 acres, more or less, recorded in DB #53 page 228.

By deed dated July 26th, 1904 J. L. Gay and wife conveyed this same tract of timber to this company. Deed recorded in DB #58 page 577.

By deed dated May 5th 1909 Wm. G. Goodman made to Camp Manufacturing Company a new deed setting forth what timber we should cut from his lands, and what other rights and privileges, licenses and easements we should have in connection therewith and time to cut, etc. Deed recorded in DB #68 page 8.

Sometime prior to May 5th 1910 the said Wm. G. Goodman died and left a will dividing the above property between certain of his children, which will we think you will find recorded in the Clerk's Office of Nansemond Co. Virginia.

Under the terms of the deed above referred to dated May 5th 1909, we were to pay \$60.00 per year extension privileges on the said tract of timber. After we were notified that Mr. Goodman was dead we sent our Mr. Jones over there to examine the timber on these different shares of land and apportion ~~according~~ the said \$60.00 among the heirs entitled to receive it, and according to his apportion the amount due W. I. Goodman's estate was \$2.55, the smallest portion of timber on any of these shares, being on the share of Wm. I. Goodman, and Mrs. Goodman has accepted the interest for each year up to the present time and we notice in your letter that you refer to a check which we sent her recently

which was in payment of the interest from Mar. 5th 1914 to March 5th 1915 in accordance with the terms of the deed.

Now if Wm. I. Goodman owned any land outside of that which was willed to him by his father, Wm. G. Goodman above referred to, then of course, we do not own the timber on it, but we claim all the timber on the 860 acre tract of land that was conveyed to us by deed of May. 5th 1909, and it don't seem to us that it is necessary to make us a party to any suit that you might bring in order to establish our rights to this timber because they are clearly defined in the deed of May, 5th 1909 above referred to.

Records in the Clerk's office of Nansemond County, show that in 1868 Lucretia Goodman owned 298 acres, and W. G. Goodman owned 283 acres in Cypress District, Nansemond County, Va.

In 1874 it appears that the 298 acres of land owned by Lucretia Goodman were transferred to W. G. Goodman, followed on the Land Book "by heirship from Lucretia Goodman."

In 1878 the two above mentioned tracts of land, one of 298 acres and the other of 283 acres, were combined in one assessment as one tract of 581 acres adjoining Langston and Duke.

By deed dated the 20 day of Jan 1887, and recorded in said Clerk's office in D. B. 17, p. 659, Thomas H. Langston *int Mary Langston* conveyed to W. G. Goodman another tract of land in the same District containing by actual survey 283 acres, making a total of 864 acres of land owned by W. G. Goodman in Cypress District, Nansemond County, Va.

From the time that W. G. Goodman acquired the above mentioned tract of 283 acres from Langston up until the date of his death he was assessed with land in Cypress District in two tracts, one tract of 581 acres and the other of 283 acres.

HEIRS OF WILLIAM G. GOODMAN

The annexed plat represents a track of land surveyed for the Camp Mfg. Co. situated in Nansemond Co. Va. on the road leading from Marches Mill to Somerton and known as the Goodman track and bounded as follows: Beginning at or near the big bridge at letter A on plat. Thence leave the road down the run of the swamp with the Lawrence line its various courses to Somerton Creek at B on plat. Thence up the creek its various courses to C on plat. Thence up the run of swamp its various courses to D on plat. Thence with John Hunter Langston up the run of branch or swamp to a big gum.
