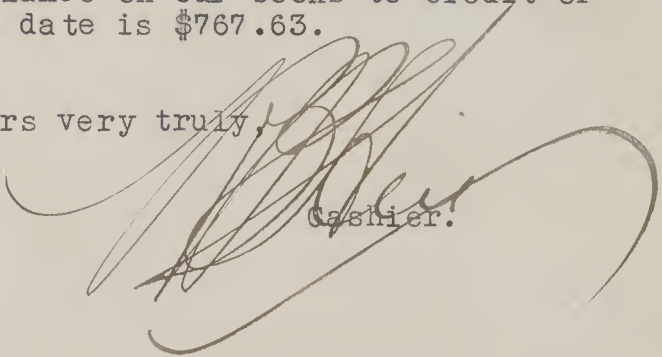

 Lawshe, on the West by the lands of William R. Brothers, (the new

TO THE HONORABLE JUDGE JAMES L. McLEMORE:

Your petitioner, Annie L. Turner, Special Commissioner, shows unto your Honor as follows:

1st - That there is now on deposit in the Farmers Bank of Nansemond, a balance of 45618²⁶ to the credit of Annie L. Turner, Special Commissioner in this cause, which said amount is under the control of this Court for the benefit of five infant children, Roscious L. Turner, Joel Edward Turner, Lester B. Turner, Christine Turner and Lowell Turner; that the interest paid by the Bank on this deposit is only 4% per annum, and that it would be to the interest of the said infant children to loan out the said money on real estate security.

2nd - That your petitioner, Annie L. Turner, Special Commissioner, personally owes about \$2200.00 to W. M.
