Hill In the Name of God Amen September the 24th 1750 Robert Crocher of the County of Southampton in Virginia Planter Do ordaine this my last Will of Testament and touching such Wordly Estate as it hath pleased God to Bless me in this Life I Dismiss Dispose of the same in the following manner and form. Imprimis I give and bequeath unto my wellbeloved Son Benjamin Crocher my Brass Kettle & my Stilliards Item I give to my son Moses Crocher my Plantation where I now live and all the land thereunto belonging forever. — Item I give to my Grandson Elisha Crocher my Grey Colt. Item I give unto my son Arthur Crocher all my Horse kind that are at Fishing Creek and all my wearing Cloaths and one Iron pot. Item I give unto my Daughter Elizabeth Jordan one Feather Bed and Furniture belonging to the Red Rugg Item I give to my Daughter Sarah Braswell one Feather Bed and all the Furniture there belonging to the Blue Rugg Item I give unto my Housekeeper Mary Hill a Feather Bed belonging to the Quilt and all the Furniture thereunto belonging and my Riding Horse bridle & Saddle and Sumer & Harnefs and Cards & Wheel of a carved Box of all that is in it and the Cotton Spun Yonespoon that is in the House and a Heifer and calf and corn for her and her Children this Year for Bread and my desire is that the said Mary Hill should be brought till she can conveniently get away. Item I give to my Daughter Mary Middleton one Cow & calf Item My Will of Desire is that after my debts & Legacies is paid what Left of my Estate to be Equally divided among all my Children & I leave my Son Benjamin Crocher my whole & Sole Executor of this my last Will of Testament As Witness my Hand & Seal
