Margt Braddy's
Will

In the Name of God Amen I Margaret Braddy of Southampton County in Virginia being Sick in Body but of perfect Sense and Memory do Constitute and Ordain this my last Will & Testament in manner and form following Revoking and making void all other Wills heretofore made by me and as I leave all such Temporal Estate it hath pleased Almighty God to bestow upon me I give and Dispose as followeth

Item I give to my son Arthur Braddy five Shillings Current Money.

Item I give to my daughter Martha Philips one shilling Current Money.

Item I give to my daughter Elizabeth Hays five Shillings and one pair of Stillards.

Item I give to my daughter Mary Braddy two Cows and a Steifer one feather Bed and the Furniture belonging to it and two Iron Pots and all the Pewter I have and one Frying Pan and one small Brass Skettle & two Chests -

I also give to my daughter Mary Braddy the Use of my Plantation whereon I now live and the Land belonging to it during her Natural life and after her decease

to my son Henry Braddy and his Heirs forever and fifty Acres adjoining to it in Carolina to Henry Braddy

I also give the Remainder of my Estate to my son Henry Braddy and do appoint him whole & Sole Executor of this my last Will & Testament Witness my Hand
