such worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in
this life I give & Devise and Dispose of the same in the following Manner &
form,

Item I give & Bequeath unto my loving brother John Scott the following
Negroes viz Jenney & Jeam & the half my Cattel hogs Sheep & horses
to him & his Heirs forever

Item I give & Bequeath unto my loving Brother John Mundell the fol-
lowing Negroes viz Carlile Patt & Peter & likewise the half of my
Cattle hogs Sheep horses Household goods & money to him & his
Heirs for ever only the said Mundell shall pay all my Debts out
of his part & I leave in John Mundell's possession the following
Negroes which belongs to John Scott & two Tracts of Land one on the
flatt Swamp and one on Copes Swamp & pay the Quitrents untill
John Scott Comes home to possess it and I do hereby appoint John
Mundell my sole & sole Executor of this my last will & Testament
