Will being sick and weak of body but of sound and Perfect memory do make
and appoint this to be my last will & Testament
Imps. I Bequeath my Soul to Almighty God that gave it hoping to Receive a
Joyfull Resurrection of the same and my Body to be buried at the Discretion
of my Executors hereafter Mentioned as to my worldly goods it hath
Pleased God to bestow on me I Dispose of them as followeth
Item. I give to my Friend Simon Turner of Southampton County a certain
Parcel of Land lying in Brunswick County and being part of a Survey of
Land lately surveyed Between the said Simon Turner and myself
Beginning at a red oak Standing in Sullavents line on the west side of
the White oak Gutt then Running Down the Various Courses of the said
gutt to Donaldsons line then along Donaldsons Line to Meherrin River
then up the Various Courses of the said River to the said Turners old line
Including all the Land in the said Survey that is on the East side of the said
gutt To him and his Heirs forever
