them to be paid by my son Bridgman Joyner when they arrive
to Lawfull age or Marriage -

And Lastly I appoint my Loving Sons Bridgman & Jacob
Joyners to be my Executors to this my Last will & Testament
Disowning & Disallowing all other Wills & Testaments by me
made allowing this only to be my Last will & Testament as
Witness my hand & Seal this 4th Day of April 1754
