John Dawson of Southampton County in Virginia being
Will Sick and weak of Body but in perfect mind and memory
and Calling to mind the uncertainty of this Life and that
it is appointed for all Men to Dy do make and Ordain this
my Last Will and Testament in form and Manner
following, to wit,

- Item I Give devise and bequeath to my Grandson John Dawson
the sum of twenty shillings Cash to him & his Heirs forever
- Item I Give devise and bequeath to my Son in Law Abraham
Johnson two shillings and six pence Cash to him and his
Heirs forever
- Item I Give devise and Bequeath to my Daughter Ann Joyner's
Children the sum of twenty shillings Cash to be Equally
Divided between and to their Heirs forever
- Item I Give Devise and Bequeath to my Daughter Mary Merrill
the sum of twenty shillings Cash to her and her Heirs forever
- Item I Give devise and Bequeath to my Dear and Loving Wife
Mary Dawson the Use and Profit of my Loving plantation
whereon I now Live During her Natural Life with free
Privilege of all Timber &c That shall be Necessary
