




In the Name of God Amen I Henry Slope being weak of Body

 life or widowhood Item I give & bequeath unto my son Henry Slope
 the other half of my plantation whereon I now live to enjoy the same
 at the age of Twenty one years together with the part above mentioned
 to my loving wife Mary after her Deceas or Marriage then to my
 son Henry also half the Land in the Tract containing two hundred
 acres more or less to him & his heirs forever Item I give & bequeath
 unto my son Richard Slope the other half of the said Tract of Land
 above mentioned to him & his heirs forever Item I give unto my
 son Richard Slope one Still water head of Cattell which is alreddy marked
 with his own marke one bed & furniture to him & his heirs —
 Item it is my Will & Desire that all the remainder part of my Estate to be
 equally Divided Between my wife Mary & five children ~~to wit~~
 by name Richard Sarah Mary Morning & Henry to them & their
 heirs. Lastly I do Appoint my son Richard Slope & son in law Hodges
 Council my sole Executors of this my last Will & Testament
 Revoking & making Void all other Wills heretofore made by me In witness
 hereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this the 23rd

 This Will was presented in court by Richard Slope & Hodges Council the
 persons herein named proved by the Oaths of Jones Griffin & by the
 solemn affirmation of John Matthews some of the people called Quakers
 the witness whereunto ordered to be recorded And on the motion of the
 said court who made oath according certificate is granted them for
 obtaining a probat whereof in due form giving security
