 aforesaid which was bought of Nottoway Indians
 to her & her Heirs forever but if my said Sister
 Sarah dies without an Heir I give the said Land
 to my Sister Mary to her & her Heirs forever

I give & Bequeath to Mary Hendred daughter of Samuel
 Hendred five hundred Current Money of Virginia
 I do constitute & Appoint my Loving Father Benjamin
 Crocker whole & Sole Exor of this my last Will & Testament
 In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand &
 Seal the Day & Year first above Written
