disposing Mind & Memory thanks be to God for it do
make & Ordain this my last Will & Testament in manner
and forme as followeth Revoking all other Wills by
me Assigned heretofore.

- first I give and devise unto my son Joseph Kitching the
plantation whereof I now live with 175 Acres of Land
- secondly I give & devise unto my son Benjamin Kitching 175
Acres of Land Called Bryants Plantation.
- thirdly I give and Devise unto my son James & Matthew Kitching
all my Land lying on the North side of black Creek
at the Age of twenty years old.
- Fourthly I give and Devise unto my Daughter Matthew one Heiffer
and thirty Shillings to be made out of my Estate.
- Fifthly I give and devise unto my Daughter Lydia one Heiffer
- Sixthly I give and devise unto my Daughter Mary one young
Heiffer more then she have in Custody.
- Seventhly I give unto my Daughter Ann one Feather Bed and
one three year old Heiffer.
