To Ann Joyner one negro woman named Sarah one Bed and Furniture one pewter Dish and two plates one large Scatter Trunk and four head of Cattle.

To Mary Joyner one negro Girl named Gofilla the Bed & Furniture that she one one large Chest one Dish and two plates and four head of Cattle.

To Elizabeth Ann & Mary one Iron Pot as a peace.

To Margra and Mary all the best of my Cattle not before given.

At a Court held for the County of Southampton the 12 day of August 1762.

Item I give to my Son Arthur Joyner seven head of Hogs and a new feather Bed and a Cow and calf.

Item I give to my Daughter Martha Joyner one New Cuzz.
