In the name of God Amen, I William Whitehead of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia being weak in body but sound of mind do make this my last will and testament. I leave unto my beloved Wife Maryann Whitehead, all my lands that I now possess with the Crops thereon and all my plantation utensils of every description during her life or widowhood, besides land unto my wife Maryann all the other property that I now possess consisting of stock of all kinds, household and kitchen furniture &c. During her life or widowhood, except my slaves I wish them to be liberated at any time when my wife thinks proper, if the Law of the Land will in any of their being liberated, I wish any wife Maryann intermarries after my death, I wish all my property that is then remaining to be disposed of among my wife and then surviving Children as the Law of the Land now directs. I appoint my wife Maryann executrix of this my last Will to sell such of my personal property as she thinks proper to pay my debts, and repay Children at the death of my wife without marriage. I wish all my Property to be equally divided amongst my then surviving Children as the Law of the Land now directs. Witness my hand and seal this 29th day of August 1813

An exhibit for the County of Southampton on the day of January 1816 this will was presented in Court by Maryann Whitehead. Executrix therein named proved by the oath of James Powell one of the Witnesses therein and continue for further proof and on the motion of the said Executrix who made oath according to Law? Certificate is granted her for obtaining a probate thereof in any form or in any place and security whereupon the said Maryann Whitehead with James Atkinson and James Powell her Executors entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of nine thousand Dollars conditioned as the said certificate and at court held for the said County of Southampton on the 15th of January 1817 this will was further proved by the oath of Elizabeth Atkinson another witness thereto and ordered to be read

In the name of God Amen, I Elizabeth Dols of Southampton County State of Virginia being of perfect mind and memory do make and ordain this my last Will and testament. In the manner and form following to wit: In the first place, I give and bequeath to my daughter Rebecca Dols all my lands household and kitchen furniture except one Bed and furniture which I shall hereafter dispose of, one negro boy New two sows and pigs two Cows and calves two cows and calves all of which Property above named I give to her and her heirs forever. 2^d I give and bequeath to Herod Dols, Children to be equally divided amongst them one negro boy Dick. I give to them and their heirs forever. 3^d I give and bequeath to Robert Dols son of Patrick Dols one negro boy George Parker. I give to him and his heirs forever. 4th I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Ann Summrell one Bed and furniture one negro Woman Abby which my man Ollick should be free if he will accept of it by complying with and under on this subject is to give him his freedom and if he does not think proper to accept of it on these conditions it is my will and desire that he may make choice which of my Children he will serve. 5th After the payment of all my just debts I wish the remainder of my Estate to be equally divided between my 2 sons Patrick and Herod Dols Patrick during his life and at his death I give and bequeath the same to his Children to them and their heirs forever. 6th I constitute and appoint my son Patrick Dols my sole and sole Executor to this my last will and testament hereby revoking all other
