For the more of our names, I William Barville Son of the County of Southampton being in perfect health and sole and many as declare the following writings to be my last will and Testament. I do desire that my just debts to be paid & funeral Expenses &c¹⁰ I desire that my wife have all my personal Estate during her natural life only one third her share to be shared by her sons, one third to Catharine Kitchen one third to Lucy Jane one third to Elizabeth Kitchen one third to Mary Anne &c¹⁰ I desire that Catharine should have a small part of my land as follows. Beginning at a corner Tree of John Barthe and William Barville's land thence along the said Barthe's line to a corner of marked trees to the post branch thence along the said branch to the beginning of John's life and after her death to belong to the same branch of land again &c¹⁰ I desire that after my wife's death that my land and personal Estate if any should be due me equally divided between Catharine Kitchen, Thomas Barville, William Barville, Catharine Kitchen, Edwin Barville, John Barville, Catharine Kitchen, Benjamin Barville, Lucy Jane, Elizabeth Kitchen and Mary Anne. Lastly I desire that Edwin Barville & Catharine should be my Executors to my last will and Testament. I advise and settle my Estate as above written. I do desire that all my just debts should be paid and in order thereto we direct our executors that all the Bacon and Corn which can be spared from the necessary consumption and supports of the Family, should be carried to market and sold by any Executors as soon as they may think the price will justify it, or the necessity of the case requires it and that the money thus raised with what may be collected at the same time the ensuing season appropriate to that use in the first place. I do after my debts and necessary funeral Expenses are paid my will and desire is that my whole estate should be kept and continue together for the benefit and support of wife Elizabeth Cobb and our eight children, Basil, Harrison, John, James, Mary, Polly, Mary and Sam and I desire that my last will and during the term of six years and that all the family should during that term remain together and be under the care of my Executors named, that my Executors should proceed to collect what money is due to me from year to year until the above term of six years shall have expired
