

If however either of my children above named should come of age and choose to leave the family before the six years shall have run, in that case on such child's leaving the family I give him one hundred dollars but when this provision, that when a greatest division shall take place to sum or sums so advanced with the Interest thereon from the time such advance shall be brought into the estate, and charged to him or her who shall have so received it) in the equal distribution, &c. At the end of the six years on the close of the current year, within which that shall happen if it should happen after the first day of March I wish and desire that my estate should be divided amongst my children in the following manner in the following manner I give and bequeath the land I bought from the estate of Burgin Cobb to my son Harrison Cobb and his heirs and assigns forever and all the balance of my land I give to my three sons James and Frederick H. share and share alike to them and their heirs and assigns forever I give to my Daughter Ruth Cobb one negro girl named Charlotte with her inheritance to her and her heirs and assigns forever I give to my daughter Nancy Cobb one negro girl Caroline with her inheritance to her and her heirs and assigns forever I give to my daughter Polly Cobb one negro boy Stephen, to her and her heirs and assigns forever I give to my daughter Elizabeth ^{and} ~~Cobb~~ one negro boy Daniel, to her and her heirs and assigns forever I my negro woman Celia should have a child or children before the six years shall have run I give the first child she may have after the aforesaid six years and which may be living at that time to my son Frederick H. to him and his heirs and assigns forever If at any time within the six years, the family shall have one hundred more stock of cattle or hogs than a sufficienty my Executor may sell each of it as can be spared for the benefit of the Estate or if my negroes man Jiles should become so headstrong or unruly that the family cannot manage him as they wish my Executor is hereby directed to sell him for the best price that can be obtained and to put the money at interest for the benefit of the Estate As the close of 6 years as heretofore defined I will and direct that the whole of my personal estate should be sold to the highest bidder and credit of six months (for sums above five dollars and cash for sums of that amount and under) and the proceeds of the sale I give to my wife Elizabeth such portion as by law she would be entitled to if I had died intestate and the balance I give in equal distribution amongst all my children to wit. Boitch, Harrison, James, Nancy, Polly, Margaret & Frederick H. share and share alike taking care to bring into account any advances that may have been previously made under the second clause of this will Lastly I hereby nominate constituents and appoint my son Harrison executor of this my last and Testament hereby revoking all wills by me heretofore made and ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my true Will and Testament In Testimony whereof I the said Frederick H. Cobb have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal the 12th day of February 1897
