In the name of God Amen I Mary Sarrell of the County of Southampton and state of Virginia being this twentieth day of January Eighteen hundred and twenty seven of sound mind and memory do make this to be my last Will and Testament in manner and form following to Wits Stem I give and bequeath unto my dear daughter Mary Williams all the land I am possessed of at my death, together with the following negroes named by Pat. Webb and I give to her and her heirs forever Stem I give and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth Miller old name, Twenty and twenty to her and her heirs forever Stem I give and bequeath unto my Grand son John Mabelells my negro boy young Sam to him and his heirs forever. Stem I give and bequeath unto my great grand daughter Mary Williams my negro girl Hagar to her and her heirs forever Stem The property not before named I give and bequeath after paying my just debts to my Grand daughter Mary Williams for her to keep and maintain my negro man Luke, making this my last Will revoking all other Wills before by me made acknowledging this to be my last Will and Testament as Witness my hand and seal this day and date above mentioned.

As a Court held for Southampton county the 1st day of March 1827 This last will and Testament of Mary Sarrell said as is proved by the oath of Dorothy Waller and Dorothy Waller the witnesses thereto and as duly taken recorded and the motion of Jonathan Williams who made oath thereto and together with Nathaniel Rockelle and Henry Sharpe his warrant entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of five thousand dollars conditioned according to said Certificate is granted the said Jonathan Williams for obtaining letters of administration on the said Mary Sarrells Estate with her Will aforesaid annexed in and for

Thomas Butts
Will

In the name of God Amen I Thomas Butts of the county of Southampton and state of Virginia, being at this time in perfect and sound mind and memory do make this my last will and Testament as follows. I do give unto my daughter Ann Simmons one negro girl named Maria which she has made in her possession in lieu of a Legacy of ten Pounds of which I have already paid to each of my other children to her and her heirs forever. I do give to my children namely Charles Butts Ann Simmons Edward Butts and Alfred Butts equally at my death the money money that I may have in the house, to them and their heirs forever. I do will and desire it that the negro girl namedanny may be supported out of my Estate by my Executor hereafter named (if not sold as my self) she being an issue to do in my will and desire that after my death the whole of my estate of every kind and nature whatever shall be sold at public sale or twelve months Credit on good security, and the amount of sales thereof be divided into six equal Parts one sixth part to my son Charles Butts one sixth part to my daughter Ann Simmons one sixth part to my son Edwards Butts one sixth part to my son Alfred Butts one sixth part to Peter Butts Children living at my death and the other sixth part to William Butts or his issue that may be living at my death to them and their heirs forever. I do give to my son William Butts the sum of ninety eight dollars ten & 3/4 and the amount of which he owes me at this time. Lastly I do hereby appoint my son Edwards Butts my Executor to this my last will and Testament revoking all other former wills by me made. In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 20th day of March 1826
