In the name of God Amen I Benjamin Blunt of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia being of sound mind and memory do make this my last will and Testament in manner and to wit as follows, I desire that all my just debts be paid. Item 1st I give and bequeath unto my son Benjamin Blunt my Gold watch to him and his heirs forever. Item 2^d I give and bequeath unto my son George Blunt all my silver spoons three large China bowls, choice of my land, my Pewee horn, and my sundries to him and his heirs forever. Item 3^d I give and bequeath unto my daughter Margaret Blunt my chest of drawers, to her and her heirs forever. Item 4th I give and bequeath unto my daughter Frances Blunt my jewelry and two pieces of gold. So with my five dollar piece and one fifteen shilling piece to her and her heirs forever. I desire that my flat swamp plantation and my tract of Land which I purchased of David Henderson be sold by my Executors on a credit of one, two, and three years. I desire that all my personal Estate not here before disposed of may be sold (with the exception of my negroes) into the money arising therefrom, also the money arising from the slaves directed to be sold after my debts are paid may be appropriated to the supporting and educating my favorite son (to wit) George Benjamin Margaret and Frances, I desire that the Land whereon I now live may be rented out, and all my negroes may be sold out until my Son George Blunt arrives to the age of twenty one year and the money
