Orated that Master Commissioners both examine State and settle an account of Joseph
Dewey's administration on the estate of Samuel Dewey dec'd also his account with
the Appraiser of said estate and report thereof to the Court

Commissioners Office June 30th 1827

Joseph Dewey that day rendered before the Commissioners his account & statement
of the estate of said dec'd as to the order of Court copied above from the following
account is made up. Whereas Walter the Guardian of the Orphans were present
also James Dewey widow of the estate the said Guardian contended before the
Commissioners that there was a debt of considerable amount there between dec'd & orphans
which he from information had received & believed in at one the instance of his death from his
father Samuel Dewey and called upon the assets to say why he had not ob-
tained the same who remarked that he had also heard of some such demand but
that he found no bond or account ^{whatsoever} among the papers of this said estate
showing such demand that he did not wish to stand by called upon Samuel
Dewey to say whether he did not owe money to said estate who denied that
he owed any thing and no witness having been offered to the contrary he was
