Joseph Downing that day appeared before the Commissioner his account & debts  
of the estate of <sup>to</sup> allowed to me the sum of £6000 arising above from the following

also James Downing master of the estate who the said Guardian continued before the  
Commissioner that there was a debt of considerable amount three hundred dollars or more  
which he from information had reason to believe was due the instance of his son's brother  
father Samuel Downing and called upon the account to say why he had not ob-  
liged the same who remarked that he had also heard of some such demand but  
that he found no bond or account <sup>written</sup> concerning the purpose of his son's inheritance  
showing such demand that he did not wish to stand called upon Samuel  
Downing to say whether he did not owe money to said estate who denied that  
he ever owing any thing and no witness having been offered to the contrary he was  
not allowed the above sum was by the direction of the Guardian <sup>and</sup> paid to
