her heirs forever the balance of my Estate / what kind or not soon after paying
all my just debts and giving William Peters one hundred Dollars to the
living Children of Benjamin Thompson living Children at my death to them
and their heirs forever Lastly I nominate William Peters Executor of this my
last Will and Testament as witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
this Twenty third day of July Eighteen hundred and thirty three
