Thomas arrives to the age of twenty one years it is my will that all my lands
be equally divided between myself and if my wife be then living I give to her
for the term of her natural life such portion of said land as she may select not
exceeding one third in value and no deduction is intended to be made in favor
of either of my sons in regard to this land in consequence of my wife's retaining
her interest for the same This is a matter I wish to have in her consideration
separately When my land is divided among all my sons it is my desire that
all the rest of my Estate should be equally divided between all my children
with the exception of my daughter Martha P.C. to whom in this division I
give eight hundred dollars more than to either of my sons It is however
my intention that my wife should have for life half of her natural life
a childless part of said personal Estate eighthly If one of sons should die before
he is twenty one years of age it is my will that my lands should be equally
divided between the survivors & tenthly When I have mentioned my sons of
course include my son John Taylor Tenthly In witness and affirming
my veracity and my friends George B. Cary and Lewis French Request
Executors to this my last will and Testament In testimony whereof I have
hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 19th day of May 1827

letters of administration on the said Thomas Fitzburgh's Estate with
his will annexed in due form.

my will I ordain this to be my last will and Testament revoking all other wills or conveyances
made before this I lend to my wife Polly Clements because of the plantation
whereon I now live during her widowhood with the stock of every kind therein
also all the household and kitchen furniture with the plantation utensils Sale
Laws to the use of my wife Polly Clements and the following respects to Mr. David
Jordan Lyman Charles Bol and Jack It is my will that my
daughter Sally Clements live with my wife and be supported out of the
Estate so long as from any charge of Board or clothing at the death of my
wife I lend the plantation with all the furniture and Stock as above mentioned
to my daughter Sally Clements also the following respects to Mrs. Lydia
Lyman and Charlotte with her increase and other in fee simple to the lawful
heirs of her body should she die without such heirs I give the plant-
ation with all the furniture and stock as aforesaid to my grand son
Richard Clements and his four negroes with their increase And
so to my son Washington Clements the use of the plantation & right of
George Whitehead also the use of the plantation I bought called Lanes
with the use of all the stock of every kind Household and kitchen
furniture and plantation utensils & tools and furniture of all kinds
