

following negroes wth Jacob Perry and Ann and at his death to be equally divided between his children except the land and furniture which Richard & Jennie Clements claim to have any part of the property that landed Washington Clements there is no part of it is to be sold & rented or leased or hired but remain and the plantation for the express purposes of supporting himself wife and children and at his death & give it or for same to his children I have given my daughter Polly Little Page Smith one Shalloe Bed and furniture and William Clements one horse two cows and calves one flock of geese one cart & wheels two sows and pigs four ewes six calves & some cups and one place and one coffee pot & one little Iron Pot and plantation all of which property she has wth & takes the burden of the following negroes to wit: Stephen Perry & his wife & child Peggy but must take in the possession of a master the Centroid of Charles Smith and at her death & give the same negroes with their increase to be equally divided amongst her children but should Charles Smith by any means get them either by buying or receiving from others for his children nor have them in his possession or in his control then such part of my will and the negroes with their increase return to my estate to be divided amongst my other Grandchildren I have given my Grandson some Richard & Jennie Clements my negro Boy Charles to be bound to some work & trade from the age of fifteen until he is twenty one I have sold and taken his receipt from John Spivey my Grandson Richard Williamson Smith my negro boy Bob to be bound to the Black Smith trade from the age of fifteen until he is twenty one years of age and when he is to receive him I have given to my Grandson W^m George Thomas Clements my negro Boy Jack to be bound to the Boot & Shoemaker trade from the age of fifteen until he is twenty one years old when he is to receive him my settled share to my Rose Blaspore & in my share and also money or things proper to have it at which time I give her one feather bed one & furniture one cow and calf one sow and pigs one ewe and lamb one team and one mule wheel and one pair of cards with corn and pork sufficient for one Year I have given my Grand daughter Mary Joseph Clements one negro girl named March to her and her heirs forever. I should have my debts and other I owe to my Executors but in full of my promise to sell my Carriage & Horse and what was proper can be best spared to satisfy the same and Last I suppose my friends & relations at Chambers and Fulcoms Road of Sussex County my lawful Executors to be my last will and Testament signed and sealed the 15th day of July 1826

Southampton County Court January 21st 1828 This paper writing purporting the last will and Testament of Richard P. Clements deceased proved in Court it appearing to the satisfaction of the Court that she did tell in whole or in substance the writing of the said Richard P. Clements it is therefore ordered that she do be deemed as one of the last will and Testament of the said Richard P. Clements.
