my Estate of real and personal & do appoint my friends to be my Executors
Executors of this my last will and Testament & to be by contract and estate
this is the my last will and Testament and revoking all other I have made or
made before whereof I have hereunto set my hand and fixed my seal this 20th day of October

Southampton County Court February 17th 1828 This last will and Testament of John
Barrett dec^d was proved by the oath of Benjamin Revell one of the subscribing witnesses thereto
and William Mapentony another of the subscribing witnesses thereto being and Robert Gordon
being sworn to prove the same that he is well acquainted with the hand writing of the said
William Mapentony and fully believes that the same is the hand writing of the said
deceased will and Testament to be in the hand writing of the said William Mapentony
where the said will is now to be received. And on the motion of Henry Thomas the Exor
therein named who made oath and together with James Pochelle and George Bentley
his secretaries entered into and acts a bond for the penalty of five hundred dollars to
attain at the same date certificate of grants the said Henry Thomas for obtaining
a probat of said will in due form

I John Pochelle of the County of Southampton do hereby constitute and make this my
last will and Testament in the manner and form following (To wit) 1st I will and
devise that after my decease that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid. 2nd I give
unto my son William L. Pochelle the tract of land whereon I now live that is the
land which I purchased of James Pochelle to him and his heirs forever. 3rd I give
and bequeath unto my son Nathaniel Pochelle the land which I purchased of
John of Parrham of Maryland & his heirs forever. 4th I give unto my son Robert Pochelle the sum of three hundred dollars to him and
his heirs forever. 5th I give unto my daughter Mary H. Land one moiety of my
Estate to her and her heirs forever. 6th The balance of my supposed I give unto my
children Robert Williams Land Nathaniel Pochelle and Mary H. Land (former's) & her
that is one fourth to each to them and their heirs forever and it is my further will and
devise that the following moiety or annuity Estate of London be allotted to my son
Wm Pochelle in part of his proportion of the said annuity. 7th It is my will and
devise that the moiety herebefore bequeathed to my son Nathaniel Pochelle and daughter
Mary H. Land shall come into the said annuity as is expressed in the above articles and should
they or either of them refuse to give them up it is my further will that the party so
refusing shall receive his part of the moiety or annuity in the 6th article. 8th The balance
of my Estate after paying my just debts and the legacy left my son Robert I give
unto my children Robert Wm L. Nathaniel Pochelle & Mary H. Land that is one fourth
to each to them and their heirs forever. 9th and lastly I do hereby constitute and
appoint my sons Robert & Wm L. Pochelle my executors to do my last will and Testa
ment revoking all other wills heretofore by me made In Witness whereof I have
hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 8th day of July one thousand
eight hundred and twenty three
