The amount calculated on account against this interestate of \$382.33 for the purchase of negro man at the sale of Lazarus Cook's property in North Carolina on 23rd day of March 1810 also a balance due him of \$150.00 for the purchase of a negro give the 8th day of February 1818 these tenders were both objects to by Plaintiff H. Baker Esqur. Attorney for John Arguello at whose motion this account was by the Court directed to be settled for the following reasons the first being because it was out of date & therefore could not be allowed and the second that this Estate was for \$80 taken the 29th of March 1822 which he contended closed all accounts to that day, the Commissioner considered these reasons good and therefore has not credited the sum for those funds the other however contended that the bond for eighty dollars was a special bond and that Paul Mc Farland who was present could prove his debt & therefore the further examination of these tenders was postponed to a subry and day the Commissioner who failed to attend on that was afterwards informed by the court that he did attend with his witness the Commissioner then informed the court to take the affidavits of this witness and that he could use it on the investigating the act.
