This action exhibited on accounts against the estate of J^{as} B. B. for the purchase of negro men at the sale of Lazarus Cooks property, in North Carolina the 29th day of March 1810. also a balance due him of \$100. 00 for the purchase of negroes the 2^d day of February 1818. these vouchers were both objected to by Richard M^r Pallas Esquire Attorney for John Urquhart at whose motion this account was by the Court decided to be settled for the following reasons the first charge being it was out of date & therefore could not be allowed and the 2^d that this estate was for \$80. paid the 29th of March 1812 which he contradicted closed all accounts to that day the Commissioners considered these reasons good and therefore has not ordered the set for these second the action however continued that the bond for legally collecting was intended to a special binding and that Tice W. Pierce who was present could from this fact & therefore the further examination of these vouchers was postponed to a subsequent day the Commissioners who failed to attend on that was afterwards informed by the agent that he did attend with his witness the Commissioners then informed the agent to take the affidavits of this witness and that he could use it on the investigation of the suit
