To Robert's Will : For the sum of Two Thousand Dollars being such a sum of money
that I have sufficient money to make out my last Will and Testament satisfactory
1st My desire and wish is that my Executor hereafter nominate my death date to
much of my Estate as her may chuse proper and make such sale for sale as he may
choose best to pay my debts item 2^o My wish is that after my Executor see
enough out of my Estate to pay my just debts that the balance of my property shall
be kept together by my beloved wife Roberta Parker and my two and only sons
John Parker and Charles Parker until my son John Parker
should arrive at the age of twenty one at which time my wish is
that my Executor should make a division between my wife Roberta Parker and my
four children or her four names. Item 3^o I declare that my wife take all that she
one third of my Estate and that she stay at my house. Item 4^o My will moreover is
that the balance of my property should be equally distributed among my four children
John Timothy Joseph and Francis Parker. Should either of my
children die before they arrive at the age of twenty one my wife shall partake of my
property they die. Should he or she gain no income then the other living Item 5^o
My wish is that before the Division of my Estate that my Executor retain one
of my Estates that my friend Francis Clements for me give a like affliction
I have toward him. I will have one fourth of my Estate. After so passing
my friend Joseph Parker my Executor to have my last Will and Testament set
up witness my hand and seal this 27th day of March one thousand eight hundred
