I John Nicholas of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia being
 in possession of a legal title do make and ordain the following writing to be my
 last Will and Testament I give my Sister Anne Brown my fold man herge and
 one thousand dollars to her and her heirs forever I give my niece Mary Nichols
 my ^{half} interest in the land and her share and dollars to her and her heirs forever I give my
 niece Helen Briggs a negro girl named In Lucia and her share and dollars to her and her
 heirs forever I give my Nephew John E. Nicholas my land and place of my na-
 tive being and being in the County of Suffolk called and known by the name of Bell the
 containing acres more or less my negro man Oxford Doring and Isaac and a woman
 named Rachel together with every article of value found and belonging to the land or on it
 I give also my riding horse called Charles with my single rig and harness to him
 and his heirs forever I give my Nephew William M. Nicholas the hundred and
 when I now live contained in the following boundaries To wit Beginning in Bar-
 road and running the new road due south to a pine as it stands to the line of the
 to a red Oak in Eliza M. Evers line thence along the line to the top of the hill
 thence along said path to the main run of the Mill Pond thence up said path
 to a small bridge on a new causeway near the gate thence due north to the corner of
 Bell and does said road to the Beginning Containing
 more or less together with the following slaves and property To wit one negro
 man named Jack one named Isaac one woman my man & many boy Isaac to
 Bob and little Peter my household and kitchen furniture of every description
 and my money & bills & Barrels & Tons &c. belonging to the dwelling to him &
 his heirs forever I give my Nephew George and Robert Nichols the tract of
 Land lying on the East side of the new road containing seven hundred and eighty
 five acres to be equally divided between them to them and their heirs forever
 I give to Edwin Brattle a piece of land lying on the north side of Parsons Road containing
 forty five acres more or less to him and his heirs forever I give to my Nephew
 William Briggs my negro man Don his wife Margaret and child to him and his
 heirs forever The balance of my Land together with my Mill I give to be equally
 divided between my Nephew Charles & William Briggs & John Robert Briggs
 to them and their heirs forever My Will and desire is that my negro man Peter
 his wife Pote and all her children together with my crop of every kind stock of
 Every kind not given away be sold and the proceeds to the payment of debts I desire
 should that prove insufficient my Executors and administrators be authorized to sell
 such negroes to effect that purpose as they may think proper
