 which I purchased of Wm. Boyner at his mother's death or marriage with him
 the plantation I purchased of John L. Tope and an equal share of the personal
 Estate of him and to his heirs forever. Lastly I gave to my son daughter Mary
 Engra 4000 Tope Louisa Tope Caroline Tope Martha Tope 1000 Tope
 and 4 Tope and Mary Tope the whole of my personal Estate by my bequest
 and an equal share of the personal Estate to be paid to them and to their heirs forever
 The land I purchased of the Tope's and the persons which the Office does make
 appear in such that to be sold in case I should obtain the suit in one of
 Appeals in Richmond and the money equally divided amongst my children
 Elizabeth and Sally I do appoint my wife Sally Tope and my children
 in etc. Jacob Tope and John Tope to hold and sell the within and to execute within my
 last Will and Testament revoking and annulling all other Wills by me
 heretofore made but do declare this to be my last will and Testament in witness
 whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 7 day of January 1829
 in the County of South Hampton

At a Court held for Southampton County the 17 day of January 1829
 The following purporting the last Will and Testament of Joseph Tope deceased
 produced in Court and then being read and being attested by the said Thomas Hutton
 and James Barnes were lawfully sworn and solemnly depose that they were acquainted
 with the Testator and writing and truly believe the said writing and the names
 therein subscribed to be wholly written by the Testator own hand and that
 the said writing is or used to be recorded as the last will and Testament of
 the said Joseph Tope deceased. And on the motion of Jacob Tope
 the Executor therein named who made oath and together with Alexander Myrick
 and Jacob Barnes his securities entered into an act or charge a bond in the penalty
 of ten thousand dollars conditioned as the said deceased's Certificate requires
 him for obtaining a probate of said Will in due form, liberty being reserved
 to the Executors therein named to join in the said bond when the Court shall so order

 and of sound memory writing to certify my last Will and Testament in
 manner and form following. Viz. I give and bequeath unto my eldest son Edward
 Turner all that land and his heirs forever. I give and bequeath unto my
 young son John Turner all the land and his heirs forever. I give and bequeath
 containing unity acres more or less all the one apple mill and trough and all my
 Cider Presses to her and her heirs forever. I give all the remaining part of
 my Estate of whatever it may consist in I leave to my loving wife Sally
 during her natural life and if she should any thing remain at her death to be equally
 divided between my five children to wit. Eleanora Mary Corbett Mary Anne
 Betty Bernard and Nathan Turner to them and their heirs forever. Lastly I do hereby
 appoint my two sons Eleanora Turner and Nathan Turner my sole and law-
 ful Executors to do my last Will and Testament and discharging all debts due by
 them to be of no Effect. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
