

Southampton County Court, January 29th 1829 This last will and Testament of James Turner deceased was shown to by the oath of the witnesses thereof and ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of James Turner executor of the said deceased, the other executor, David and refused to take upon himself the execution of the said will. Well informed each one together with, Nathan Thomas and Jeremiah Ligon his securities, witnesses and actions being a bond in the penalty of five hundred dollars and signed at the said Court directed and signed as granted the said James Turner, for obtaining a probate of the said will in due form.

Thomas Bailey's
Will.

In the name of God Amen I Thomas Bailey of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia do hereby make my last will and Testament in manner and form following, that is to say, That I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Jackson one dollar to her and her heirs forever. I do give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Bailey one leather bed, bedstead and furniture to her and her heirs forever. I do give and bequeath to my grand daughter Nancy Bailey the sum of five dollars to her and her heirs forever. I do hereby wish and desire that the above money legacies may be given in property by appraisement. I do desire that a sufficient quantity of my property be sold by my Executor hereafter named, to pay all my just debts and funeral expenses. After the payment of my just debts and funeral expenses, I give all the remainder of my property to my two daughters Mary and Elizabeth Bailey to be equally divided between them, to them and their heirs forever. I do desire of my said daughter Mary Bailey, a daughter, Bailey, should do without an heir, survive, do a copy of her will and sign and sign the legacy to the surviving one. And lastly, I do hereby constitute and appoint my friend Thomas Morrell, Executor of this my last will and Testament and having revoked all other former wills and Testaments by me heretofore made. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my Seal this 20th day of September in the year of our Lord 1827.
