In the name of God Amen: Joshua Johnson of the County of South-
 ampton and State of Virginia of sound mind and memory do make and ordain this
 to be my last Will and Testament, in manner and form following To wit, I have
 bequeathed to my daughter Sally Johnson during her life ten acres of land adjoining the
 road for her use and after her death I give the said ten acres of land to my grand-
 son Lewis Johnson to him and his heirs forever. I have to my wife
 Polly Johnson during her natural life fifteen acres of land including the
 house and after her death I give the said land to my grandson Lewis
 Johnson to him and his heirs forever. The balance of my land I give and
 bequeath unto my grandson Lewis Johnson to him and his heirs forever.
 I have all my personal Estate to be sold or on a credit of my friends
 and the money arising from the said sale after paying my just debts and
 other necessary expenses I give to my wife Polly Johnson my
 daughter Sally Johnson and my Grandson Lewis Johnson for the
 said money to be equally divided between them. Lastly I nominate
 and appoint Drury Waller Executor to this my last Will and Tes-
 tament given to my last Will or Will before by me made
 At Witness my hand and affixed my seal this nineteenth day of February
 One thousand Eight Hundred and twenty Eight
