

Charles Bryant  
1839

In the name of God, Amen. I Charles Bryant of the County of Southampton and state of Virginia being of perfect sense, body and memory and calling to mind the uncertainty of this mortal life do make and ordain this my last will and testament in the following manner. First I give to all my lawful heirs to be had and my Estate the remains remain of my dear wife Elizabeth at her death bed. Her estate to my best wife Temperance Bryant and the third of my land wherein I now live during her natural life or widowhood. Likewise to my two sons James P. Bryant and John H. Bryant and their Equally divided between them and I give now all my lands and plantations to my two sons James P. Bryant and John H. Bryant I also give my beloved wife Temperance Bryant five negroes named George, Anna, Amilia, Anna and Washington his natural life or widowhood and one slave to be equally divided between my children Samuel P. Bryant and John P. Bryant Polly Bryant and Maria Bryant to be equally divided between them. I give my beloved wife one horse one cow & calf one son & pig one brother his first choice during his natural life or widowhood. Likewise to be equally divided between James P. Bryant John H. Bryant and Polly Bryant and Maria Bryant I give my two sons James P. Bryant and John H. Bryant all my rest to be equally divided between them. I also desire for my son William to have two hundred dollars out of my Estate to school him. I also give my two sons James P. Bryant and John H. Bryant five negroes namely Oberry and Jerry to be divided between them and I give my two daughters one negro a pure Fisrt I give Polly Bryant and Maria Bryant. Likewise the balance of my Estate real and personal I give to be equally divided among her sons & her daughter James P. Bryant and John H. Bryant. Maria Bryant and Polly Bryant the whole to be equally divided between them. And I do hereby appoint my son James P. Bryant Esq<sup>r</sup> my Executor to this my last will by testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 2<sup>d</sup> day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty three. At a Court held for the County of Southampton the 17<sup>th</sup> May 1839 This last will and Testament of Charles Bryant was proved by the oaths of James C. Taylor and Priscilla Pickens the witnesses thereto and sworn to be true. And on the motion of James P. Bryant the Executor herein named who moreover did set and together with William Bryant Esq<sup>r</sup> and John H. Bryant his securities entreated and acknowledged a bond in the sum of £1000 then and Dollars conditioned as the law directs sufficient to grantee the said James P. Bryant for obtaining a probate of the said will in due form.

Will

In the name of God, Amen. I Carter Cummell being weak in body bound in my bonds and disposing and knowing what men are to aid to make and ordain such to my last will and Testament. First. I command my land in the name of an all wise & omnipotent Creator and my love to be equally interred as to my next of kin Estate. As well and bequeath it in the manner following, to wit, I Con. 1<sup>st</sup> From the outermost service which my woman Prunella has residence in it is my will and desire that she and her three children shall free from 2<sup>nd</sup>. As well and bequeath to the said Prunella Fifty acres of land the same containing at the corner corner of my yard next to the walls running directly to a branch there with the branch a sufficient distance that the third side shall be parallel to the first line fence. It is my desire a good frame house eighteen by sixteen feet to be built upon said land having two gables a brick chimney of brick eight light windows on each side and Prunella shall designate. I also desire that she have a garden cleared and fence around
