I Martin David being of sound mind and memory do make and do deem this my last will & Testament. I give & bequeath my son Thomas D. David during his natural life three negroes namely he and two of his one that and one that and after his death to be and to be given the children of my daughter Susan Coker to them and their heirs forever
Item I bequeath my land and estate as that my land or estate with every other property for the same to be sold and after paying my just debts the balance if any to be divided in the following manner to wit one third to Susan Coker and her heirs forever one third to Thomas D. David but should he die without lawful heir then this part to go to Susan Coker and her heirs forever one third to my son Robert David but should he die without lawful heir then this part to go to my daughter Susan Coker to her and her heirs forever also I give to my son Robert David one negro woman named Phillis and three children namely Eliza Nancy and Elizabeth with all their increase for ever also one black one white one and one white child but should he die without lawful heir then I give the said negro & property to my daughter Susan Coker and her heirs forever

Item I bequeath my wife and desires is that at the death of my mother in law namely Sarah all the Estate coming to me in respect to be sold & the land and negroes and from the proceeds thereof I give to my grand daughter Lucy Coker one hundred and fifty dollars also to my grand son John Coker I give one hundred dollars also to the children of my daughter of my daughter Sally White namely Thomas and John I give one hundred dollars to my grand daughter and to the balance of any to be divided in the following manner to wit one third to Susan Coker to her and her heirs one third to Thomas David but if he die without lawful heir I give this one third to Susan Coker to her and her heirs forever one third to my son Robert David but should he die without lawful heir then I give this one third to Susan Coker to her and her heirs forever Item I hereby appoint my son Robert David the executor of my last will and Testament less her gallanties William which I have made at my hand this 24 day of March the last and eight hundred and twenty nine

A Court held for the Comy. of Southampton the 20 day of July 1829 the last will and Testament of Martin David deceased was read by the oath of the witnesses and ordered to be recorded and on the motion of Eliza Coker the said Thomas and John Coker and together with Wm. Pinney and William Briggs and others entered into and acknowledged a bond in the sum of £100
