At a Court held for the County of Limestone the 17th day of August 1829
Mrs. James Ely, testifying respecting the last Will and Testament of Thomas
Worrell died and was presented in Court on date the 31st March 1839 and thereafter dated
the 2^d July 1839 were offered for probat. The Court after examination of said witness
noted respecting the said witness are of opinion that the Statute of Limitations
the writing bearing date the 2^d July 1839 was not of due probate time and memory.
Therefore it is Concluded that the said writing bearing date the 2^d July 1839 shall
null and void and of appearing to the satisfaction of the Court that at the time of
executing the writing bearing date the 31st March 1839 was sound and of
mind. And the said writing being proved by the seal of David W. Parker and
Richard Darden two of the witnesses thereto is ordered to be recorded and for
the true last Will and Testament of the Test. Thomas Worrell and on the 31st
of January 1829 and the Execution thereof named Leancy Worrell the Executrix
therein named a personal estate and referred to take upon herself the burden of
the execution of said Will to whom she exhibited and gave her seal Richard Darden
and Peter Edwards his son witness interdicted and acknowledged a Bond on the
penalty of ~~one thousand dollars~~ ^{one thousand dollars} as the Law directs Certificate
is granted him for retaining a probat thereof for and from

Jebulon Ely's The State of Alabama

Will Monroe County. Be it Known that I, Jebulon Ely of the State and County
aforesaid do ordain and pronounced to be my last Will and Testament, respecting of
my Estate in the following manner

Item 1st I give unto my relation and friend Jebulon Ely & his heirs my two negroes
One male & one female and my Horse saddle and bridle and all my effects which
have about me.

Item 2^d I give to my brother Hilles Ely all the money arising from the sale of my
tract of land in the State of Virginia except two hundred dollars, which my brother
aforesaid must give unto my agent James Taylor of Alabama exclusive of his
commissions for his services if my brother is not sold it is my wish that my brother
aforesaid have his choice taken to keep the land and pay the two hundred Dollars
to my aforesaid agent or have the land sold.

Item 3rd I do hereby constitute and appoint my friend and Relation Jebulon Ely attorney
my lawful Executor for my last Will and Testament. In witness whereof I have
hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 9th day of October 1828.

said the said Waller signs the same as a subscribing witness and that he witness
ed the same at the request of the said testator.
