I do give and bequeath to my beloved Sister Nancy Williams the sum of twenty dollars in Cash to her and her heirs forever. I do give and bequeath to my beloved Sister Mary Doyal the sum of Three hundred Dollars in Cash to her and her heirs forever. I do give and bequeath to my niece Sarah Williams the sum of Three hundred Dollars in Cash to her and her heirs forever. I do give and bequeath to my nephew James Williams the sum of Three hundred Dollars in Cash to him and his heirs forever. I do give and bequeath to my nephew William Lawrence the sum of One hundred Dollars in Cash and my brace of Pistols to him and his heirs forever. I do give and bequeath to my nephew William Doyal the sum of twenty Five Dollars in Cash to her and her heirs forever. I do give and bequeath to my beloved niece William Lawrence the sum of Three hundred dollars in Cash to her and her heirs forever. I do also appoint and name my wife William Lawrence. Executors to the above named Sarah and James Williams. I do appoint and name my beloved niece William Lawrence to be the Executor of my last Will and Testament declaring that to be my last Will and Testament.
