Sally Cotton's  
Will.

In the Name of God Amen the 9<sup>th</sup> day of September in the Year of our Lord 1829  
that I Sally Cotton of the County of Southampton being of a sound Mind and perfect  
memory thank be to the Almighty God calling to remembrance divers certain Estates  
of this Country before me and that all flesh must return unto him shall make  
God to call to make a Testate and Ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner  
and form following working and attesting by these presents. I do make this and  
Witness hereto by me myselfe and under writing and there unto to my  
to be taken for my last Will and Testament and no other.

First I will all of my debts and dues at home or right in consequence any summs  
of person or persons whatsoever shall have to be paid and duly contracted and paid -

Item 2<sup>nd</sup> I give unto my Son Fra. Wilson one pair of new Cloths  
Clothing one pair of sheepskin Cloths and one Apron to him and his Family for want  
Item 3<sup>rd</sup> I give unto my Daughter Sarah M'Ginnis one sheep skin Cloths  
and a cap to her and her Husband Sally I do make and appoint  
Fra. Wilson my Executor of this my last Will and Testament. Witness my Hand  
and Seal this day and year first above written

Testimony James Rockwell Esq

May Gods Grace and Mercy be with you all of you who may read this  
I will bring health and long life of happy mind and memory thank be to God for the same  
and knowing that all men must die and leave this world for my last Will and  
Testament as follows First I command my Soul to God who gave it and my body to the  
earth Item I give and bequeath to my son William Jones one Bed and Furniture with them  
and the same forever. Item I give and bequeath to my son Nathaniel Jones a pair  
of pants containing twenty four and a half feet of cloth which was a part of the tract of Land  
whereon I live which was drawn by my son in Law Anthony Woodard in sight of his  
wife a slave formerly Mrs. Jones. Item I give and bequeath to my Granddaughter Mary  
Fay Murrell daughter of Sarah Murrell one Bed and Furniture to her and her first Person  
Item It is my will and desire that my Executors hereafter named make sale of the  
following Negro Slaves first Nancy Dancy. Jimmy Jr. and Somer Jr. upon the best terms  
they can for the benefit of my Estate the proceeds of which shall I request may be equally  
divided between my two Sons William Jones and Robert Jones and my daughter Sarah  
Murrell to whom I give it to them and their heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath  
to my son Robert Jones one Gray Horse Saddle and Bridles also one Gun and his  
one Bed and Furniture also five hundred dollars to be paid him out of the sale of  
my flock should he come in no fit condition to that sum for that purpose -

Item I give and bequeath to my Grandson James Robert Jones son of Nathaniel  
Jones one Bed and Furniture. Item I send to my daughter Nancy M'Ginnis  
formerly Jones three Bins and Furniture one one desk during her life and her seat  
I give the same three beds and Furniture to all of her children alone and their alikes  
also the like desk. Item It is my wife wish and desire that the property or  
interest which my son in Law Anthony Woodard had in my Estate after his death  
and which Christian made over to me by due by the said Christian to me to my  
daughter Nancy M'Ginnis to whom I leave during her life and after her death I give  
the said property or interest to all of her children should they or any one of  
them be alive at the time of her death I mean that all be dead it is then mine
