In the name of said Oliver S. Birrell, State of New Hampshire County and  
State of Vermont being his agent at Newington, and as per my memory, handwriting  
to mind that it is appointed for all men once to do & to make and ordain their wills first  
will and Testament and Warmer and forms following this -  
First. I give to my beloved wife Charity Williams third part of the tract of Land on  
which I live. All my right by this time of Parker, now Valentine, in Newington and  
combs therefrom bed and furniture one hundred and a half rods of all my personal  
estate after which I leave to her natural life or winter hard -  
Secondly. I leave the balance of my home tract of Land to my son Edward Hale and  
after the death of my wife I leave the party of land before named to her to have and to  
leave to the said Edward Hale excepting the half tract of Land purchased from Williams  
S. Birrell during his life and as he did not take out a lawful Part of his tract. I thus  
leave it to be equally divided among my four daughters, i.e. Lydia, Polly, Lucy, and  
Rebecca and my Grandson John Birrell if he shall leave a Son, his son if not  
to my beloved friends and daughter to them and their heirs forever. I give to my son  
Edward Hale one bed and furniture and one Chest to him and his heirs forever  
Thirdly. I give immediately after my death all my Chattels and such a tract of  
land purchased of Williams S. Birrell and the privilege and appurtenances thereto belonging  
to my daughter Lydia Hale to her and her heirs forever. Fourthly. I give to my  
daughter Rebecca Hale one tract of Land lying and being in the County of New  
Hampshire containing 15 3/4 acres and bounded as follows. Beginning at a point  
just standing in the back dam branch a corner of Lucy Birrell's shore along a line  
so marked true up a small branch at 5 1/4 N 33° E to a point 4 1/3 P N 24° E  
thence S 57° W 38 P E to a line running N 84 3/4 E to a point in the  
middle run the path thence S 86 1/2 W 15 1/2 E to a small point at the corner of the same  
place Hale and Lucy Birrell's in John D Clark's line thence along the said  
place line 4 1/2 E 60 P to a point standing on a sand branch across corner of the said  
William Hale and Polly Hale on the said place line thence down the said branch  
along a line of marked trees 4 1/2 S 60 P thence S 34 1/2 W 108 E 60 P  
thence N 57 1/2 E 60 P to a black gum tree lying in the said branch thence down the  
said branch the said corner thereof to the corner of Captain Clark's a corner of the  
said William Hale and Polly Hale the western boundary of the said Captain  
Clark's to the south of the said Beaver dam branch below the said corner of the  
said sand branch the river runs thereof to the river at the first station to the said  
Capt. Clark forever.

Fifthly. I give to my daughter Polly Hale one tract of land lying and being in the  
County of New Hampshire containing 15 3/4 acres and bounded as follows. Beginning  
at a corner of the land of the said place in the Coggeshall's swamp shore along  
the said place line of marked trees 4 1/2 S 58 1/2 E to a point across  
the said Rebecca Hale line of marked trees 4 1/2 N 28 1/2 E to a black dogwood  
in swamp to the south of the said Beaver dam branch below the said corner of the  
said Rebecca Hale line 4 1/2 S 58 1/2 E thence N 57 1/2 E to a black dogwood
