 to be equally divided among my other children. Eighty After the death of my wife
 I give my negro man Anthony to my daughter Rebecca Wale to her and her heirs
 forever. I also give to my daughter Rebecca Wale one cow and calf one feather bed
 and furniture and one chest and also one hundred and fifty dollars in cash
 to her and her heirs forever. Nextly I give to my daughter Lydia Wale my
 negro woman Fido to her and her heirs forever. Nextly After the death of my
 wife I give to my daughter Lucy a sum of £1000 to her and her heirs forever
 Likewise After the death of my wife I leave to my grand son John Wale my
 horse and carriage during his natural life and if he dies leaving no lawful heirs of his body
 I give him the sum of £1000 to be equally divided between my four daughters before mentioned
 Nextly I leave to my daughter Rebecca Wale my horse and carriage during his natural life and if he dies
 leaving no lawful heirs of his body I give him the sum of £1000 to be equally divided between my four
 daughters before mentioned. Thirtiethly I give my half of my negro man
 Sam to Rebecca Wale to her and her heirs forever. And I leave in the hands of
 Samuel Wale one hundred and fifty dollars to be applied to the benefit of Lucy
 Fitzgerald as he may think fit and as much of it. Thirtiethly I leave all the
 balance of my estate of real and personal estate to be sold immediately after my death
 and the proceeds thereof I give to be equally divided among my daughters before
 mentioned to them and their heirs forever. Nextly After the death of my wife I leave
 all the personal estate that I owned to her to be equally divided among my four daughters
 before mentioned. Nextly And Lastly I do hereby appoint James Fitzgerald
 of the County of Wick my true executor to this my last will and testament as aforesaid
 a her wife or wives and declaring this also to be my last will and testament
 In Testimony whereof I have set my hand and affixed my seal this 10th
 of August the thirtieth eight hundred and twenty eight.
