 wife my Will and desire is that the whole of my Estate be equally divided between
 all my Children my grand Children, James Williams, and Joseph Edwards, together
 having one share each the rest.

2nd It is my Will and desire when my daughters Mary, Anne, and Ann Maria
 shall be leave their mother that each of them receive a furnished and furnished
 a chest and a Trunk. My Will is that of these Presents be my hands and seal
 this 27th day of October 1829.

 to live on the land and as much as the land can pay with respect to my 3rd share during
 their single lives And then the whole of my land to my son Matthew Davis and his heirs
 forever. All the remainder of my Estate I leave to be equally divided between my son Matthew
 Davis, Miss Mary Davis and Sally Davis my three daughters And Sally Davis.
