Testament in manner and form following. Dated

I give and bequeath to my Eldest son George the sum of £1000  
or £1000 to him and his heirs forever. Also give him my common name  
George and by name Archibald give him furniture to him and his heirs  
Also give and bequeath to my daughter Lucy A Branch my common name from  
and the rest by the name of George and the further bed and furniture to her and her heirs  
forever.

Also I give to my daughter Rebecca Branch my regal boy by the name of Edmund  
and a girl by the name of Emily and one feather bed and furniture to her and her  
husband - by Will and desire is that my personal Estate that is not above  
mention'd be sold and my just debts be paid and the surplus of any bequeath  
to my three childrens Eliza M Branch Emily Ann M Branch  
Rebecca M Branch & I constitute my brother Robert Branch my whole trust sole  
Executor to this my last Will and Testament. In witness whereof I have  
hereunto set my hand and set my hand and put my seal this 4 day of October  
1826

day of December 1829 The last Will and Testament of George Branch is

there named who made each trust and together with George Branch and Lucy  
Hillier his son and entered into and acknowledged a Bond in the sum of One Thousand  
Pounds conditioned at the sum of £1000. Certificate is given that the said George Branch  
for obtaining a probate of the said Will was sue form.

Testament in manner and form as follows testy

First I give and bequeath to my dear wife A wife one regal boy named Henry during  
her life

Second I give to my son Williams Cobb the land from the flat branch to the line going  
up Mr Cope Mrs Pease and Mrs Talbot and the land and orchard between the  
branch Richard the line to run from a certain tree called a Satalpase tree near the house  
thereon to a certain Gunnt at the old lime kiln running down to him and his heirs forever

Third I give to my daughter Lucy Cobb fifty acres of Land next to the property's  
Mello also to her brother Richard furniture one grey Chattle bed and her heirs forever

Fourth I give to my daughter Dorothy Cobb one bed and furniture

Fifth I give to my daughter Elizabeth Cobb one feather bed and furniture also in my  
name named Polly to her and her heirs forever

Sixth I give to my son Benjamin Cobb the balance of my land at my wife's death  
whereof I leave also to her brother Richard furniture one horse one son and the rest to  
him and his heirs forever and the sixth part of the Corn.

Seventh I give to my daughter Anna Lazarus One dollar.

I have two negroes Brown and Bob and all the balance of my property except the  
jewelry to be sold to pay my just debts after the balance of the money to  
be equally divided between my three children and the same shall be distributed  
among my son Benjamin Cobb my two daughters Lucy Cobb and Elizabeth Cobb
