possible.

do constitute this writing to be my last Will and Testament in manner and form following
1st I give to my son George W. Williams all the land and plantation between Ironton
and Black and furniture there called one desk one cupboard the looking glass that stands
in the hall on chest one dozen chairs six silver tea spoons two pats and half
pats one pair three pairs dog iron two combs and comb one box and key one
Bay mare one horse cart and wheel one plough frame and two ploughs
the Cart, grain tier and one bush has two scolding boxes stone lime oven
of iron which may be removed by reference to my book and what he finds on the
fork brads which may also be known by reference to my book which I have
already had the care and control of and in consideration of the infirmity
of his mind I wish all the money and necessary things to be legated to him
in the care and management of my son Peter W. Williams who I hereby
appoint as his Trustee it is my will and desire that before Mr. George shall
not dispose of any part of this property without the consent of the above
named Trustee and I call upon him for such trustee shall be bound to
forks out of the old house and laundry

2nd I give to my son Christopher on behalf of my employments and by chance and accident
which interest in a mercantile business and for hundred dollars money in
addition to what I have already given him during my life and death for what
3rd I give to my Grand daughter Deborah Ann Williams the sum of £100
sterling which goes to the hands of Virginia as they may fall to her when she
arrives to the age of eighteen years old she to be left as a legacy
for her to be come her own property to her her husband and offspring from her
Should she not live to that age I give £100 to her husband in my will and desire
that it may be equally divided between my son William Williams and my son
