Will

I John Nicholls of the County of Southampton being of lawful mind and full memory do hereby
make and constitute at present this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following -
I give devise and bequeath unto my sister, Pelly Nicholls the tract of Land devised to me in the last will and testa-
ment of my father King James Nicholls supposed to contain two hundred and twenty five acres to her
and her heirs forever. I also give to my said sister Mary P. Nicholls five thousand dollars to be
paid to her in cash by my Executor immediately after his qualification
I give to my sister Elizabeth Pelly five hundred dollars to be paid to her in a like manner and
Entailment and to be drawn by her alone.

As my particular friend and relation James D. Maffington I give thirty pounds with a request
that the same maybe laid out in the purchase of a watch and worn for my sake, to each of his
sons William, Edmund and Samuel. I give one hundred dollars to be laid out in the most proper
manner for school work

I give to my sister Mary P. Nicholls all of my Interest in the Estate of my maternal
uncle King James Edwards and Richard Edwards together with all the debt and residue of my
Estate not herein before disposed of be the same real or personal, man or wife person whensoever
I die my wife and appoint my friend James D. Maffington Executor to this my
last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I set my hand and seal this 15th day
of August Eighteen hundred and twenty eight

the Executor therein named who made oath and together with Robert A. Key p. & Lewis C.
Fitzpatrick he deputed, entrusted and acknowledged a Bond in the penalty of Fifty
Pounds and Dollars conditioned as the law directs Certificate is granted the said James
D. Maffington for obtaining a probat of the said Will in due form
