I John Blount of the County of Southampton being of sound mind and full memory do hereby
make and constitute as my last Will and Testament in manner and form following -
I give devise and my sister, Ridley Blount the tract of Land devised to me in the last will and testa-
ment of my father Benjamin Blount supposed to contain two hundred and twenty five acres to her
and her heirs forever. I also give to my said sister Mary R. Blount five thousand dollars to be
paid to her in cash by my Executor immediately after his qualification
I give to my sister Elizabeth Ridley Five hundred dollars for her own exclusive use and
enjoyment and to be disposed of by her alone.

As my particular friend and relation James D. Maffenberg I give thirty hundred with a request
that the same maybe laid out in the purchase of a watch and worn for my sake, to each of his
sons William, Edmund and Samuel I give one hundred dollars to be laid out in the most profit-
able manner

I give to my sister Mary R. Blount all of my Interest in the Estate of my Father
in law Benjamin Edwards and Richard Edwards together with all shares and interest of my
estate not herein before disposed of be the same real or personal, now or hereafter either acquired
Last day of August Eighteen hundred and twenty eight

which is due me. And I then give and bequeath to my mother Fendole Edwards and my sister
Nathaniel Jones and William I bequeath all their remainder part of my Estate for my friends or
nature who cannot be equally divided between them and their heirs forever

Lastly

I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint Joel bequeath as Executor to this my last Will
and Testament reserving all other heirs before by me made. In Witness whereof I do hereunto
set my hand and affix my seal this 12 day of November 1829
