Will

In the Name of God Amen I Emma Everitt of the County of Southampton last of my mind being sick and weak in body but of sound mind and discharging memory and calling to mind the counting of human life and being desirous of disposing of all such worldly Estate as it has pleased God to give me with that blessing

- 1<sup>st</sup> I give unto my wife Elizabeth Everitt three negroes namely Bond Zephania and Phillis for and during the Term of their natural life
  - 2<sup>nd</sup> I give to Leibel Everitt all the tract of Land on which I have been and his heirs forever
  - 3<sup>rd</sup> It is my desire that Leibel should take possession of the negroes given to my wife and to take good care of her so long as she shall live
  - 4<sup>th</sup> I give unto my son Thomas Everitt all the tract of Land which formerly belonged to Thomas Everitt dec<sup>d</sup> now called the Petty tract to him and his heirs forever
  - 5<sup>th</sup> I give unto my son John Everitt half the number of Acres of Land on which the man has made the improvements this I give unto him as an extra legacy and one negro girl named Talce which is given in towards making them Equal with the rest of the legacies to him and his heirs forever
  - 6<sup>th</sup> I give to my son John Everitt the remaining half of the tract of Land on which John Lewis worked to him and his heirs forever
  - 7<sup>th</sup> I give to my son Samuel Everitt one negro girl named Lucinda to him and his heirs forever
  - 8<sup>th</sup> I give to my daughter Madon Abble one negro girl named Margaret to her and his heirs forever
  - 9<sup>th</sup> I give unto my son Samuel Everitt one negro woman named Peggy and her child named Emily to him and his heirs forever
  - 10<sup>th</sup> I give to my daughter Harriette Everitt one negro girl named M. Longley to her and his heirs forever and a comfortable room with her heirs with Leibel during the Term of her single life
  - 11<sup>th</sup> I give unto my daughter Dinny one negro girl named Catharine to her and her heirs forever
  - 12<sup>th</sup> All the rest of my Estate of what nature soever it maybe whether in before partitioned or yet to be made of I desire maybe divided among my several children herein before named so as far as they are Equal share of all my Estate - none of them given to any one of my children more than an Equal proportionate part of all my Estate as his or her or personal he or they shall be found to be due to make them all Equal which I give to them and their heirs forever
  - 13<sup>th</sup> and Lastly I do hereby constitute my sons Thomas Everitt and Leibel Everitt Executors of this my last Will and Testament and it is my desire that my children above mentioned should see to my Estate and themselves in peace hereby revoking all other former Wills or Testaments be it by me made or made by me
