I Sally Bryant of the County of Southampton in the State of Virginia do hereby make this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following to wit to wit

1st I give my Executor here after named as soon as convenient after my decease to sell all my Estate except Articles of Property hereafter named and specified and out of the monies raised therefrom pay and discharge all my just debts if any also expensed of in turn out together with the cost of the first execution of this my will. 2nd After the payment of Debts and expensed as aforesaid I give to my daughter Sally Clark one dollar to her my said daughter and her heirs forever. 3rd I do bequeath to my daughter Sally Clark one dollar one dollar to her my said daughter and her heirs forever.

4th I give to my daughter Lucy Brown one of my best and breeding doe one doe and lamb two female geese and one male also three chickens three guinea chickens one Turkey hen one French hen of pork and one negro woman slave named Flora to her my said daughter then her heirs forever. 5th I give to my daughter Louisa Bryant one cow having no horns and calf one large black pig one chest of figures one mirror and also one fifth of the profits money raised by sale as above permitted and pay after the payment of my debts expensed and the two first legacies of one dollar each to her my said daughter and her heirs forever.

6th I give to my daughter Matilda Bryant one large red cow and calf also one fifth of the residue of sales after the appropriation being first made in manner last before said to her my said daughter and her heirs forever. 7th I give to my son William Bryant one fifth of the residue of sales after the appropriation being made as aforesaid to him my son and his heirs forever.

8th I give to my son James Bryant one fifth of the residue of sales after the appropriation is made as aforesaid to him my said son and his heirs forever.

9th I give to my son Benjamin Bryant one gray colt and one fifth of the residue of sales after the appropriation is made as aforesaid to my said son and his heirs forever.

Lastly I having fully disposed of my Estate in the foregoing manner I do hereby nominate and appoint my worthy friend John Thomas the Executor of this my last Will and Testament in which witness I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 15th day of Octob 1827.
