In the Name of God eternally the 10th day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
hundred and twenty seven I Henry Weston of the Town of Southampton do make and ordain this
last 10th day of Jan: 1827

Year 1st It is my will and desire that all my first debts to be paid removable through and by my beloved wife and son.

I now leave my beloved wife all my Estate after paying my just debts until my daughter Lucy
Wetton arrives at the age of twenty one years and then it is my wish for my three daughters to
choose this or that good man of that County to divide between my three daughters name Patsey
Louisa and Lucy Wetton and leaving a sufficient sumper for my beloved wife of Peter is living at
that time I wish Lou to remain on the Plantation whilst her master lives and at his death or
marriage to my daughter Lucy my master will understand that I only mean a sufficiency
left to pay my just and honorable debts that is if I should take too much of my estate
property I wish Lou to take a girl named Louisa if that does not do take away by the name
of Louisa and best to the end of just debts

Lastly I nominate Constitue and appoint wife Dick my Executor to my last Will & Testament. Given under my hand the day and year first above written
Witness my only child son John
and hope it will be recorded

At a Court held for the County of Southampton the 21st day of June 1870
The writing purporting to be the last Will and Testament of Wm. Mellons late of Southampton in Hampshire the last
one but one being witness thereto James Mellons & Richard Clegg were sworn and examined and from the evidence
of the said Mellons and to the best of their knowledge and belief the body of the said Wm. Mellons deceased
thereby subscriber are in the proper form writing of the said Wm. Mellons and therefore do make
that the said writing be recorded as and for the last Will and Testament of Wm. Mellons deceased in the
City Clerk the two names in the said Will being dead and the said Wm. Mellons deceased and died of the
said Wm. Mellons relinquishing his right to the administration of his Estate in favour of Benjamin
Griffith. On the Motion of the said Benjamin Griffith who made and made with the said
Died and Joseph Parker has secured unto him and acknowledge a Recd in the sum of £100/-
of this date Conditioned as the said death Certificate is granted the said Benjamin Griffith for
obtaining letters of Administration on the Estate of the said Wm. Mellons & death his decease
